CS/SB's 2730, SB 1596 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senators Joyner and Constantine—

Residential Tenancies; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2730 & S1596) allows landlord to terminate rental agreement & recover liquidated damages or charge tenant early termination fee for breach of agreement, or both, under certain circumstances; requires tenant to indicate acceptance of early termination fee or liquidated-damages provision in rental agreement in order for provision to take effect; provides limit on combined total of damages & fee, etc. Amends 83.43,.595. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 20, 2007

CS/SB 1900 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Specialty License Plates; discontinues annual use fee for Girl Scout license plate; increases annual use fee for Sea Turtle & Fla. Sheriffs Youth Ranches license plate; establishes annual use fees for Fla. NASCAR, Corrections Foundation, Protect Fla. Springs, & Trees Are Cool license plates; authorizes use of specified percentage of proceeds from sale of Fla. Educational license plate for marketing & promotion expenses, etc. Amends Ch. 320. Effective Date: 10/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 20, 2007

CS/CS/CS/SB 1980 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation (Saunders)—

Wildlife Management & Saltwater Fisheries; increases annual use fee for Sea Turtle specialty license plate; deletes suspension of stone crab endorsements for first violations; prohibits unauthorized possession of blue crab trap gear or removal of said trap contents & provides penalties therefor; clarifies provisions regulating spiny lobsters; requires FWC to adopt & publish rule establishing due process procedures, etc. Amends Chs. 320, 370, 372, 861, 20; reenacts 380.511(1)(c). Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/CS/SB 1982 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation (Saunders)—

Recreational Licenses & Permits/FWC; authorizes FWC, tax collectors, & certain subagents to request & collect donations when selling recreational license or permit; revises exemption under which resident need not possess license in order to fish in salt water from land or from structure fixed to land; requires commission to provide to Governor & Legislature report on activities funded from sale of snook permits; corrects reference to spiny lobster, etc. Amends Ch. 372. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/SB 732 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Dawson and others—

Lachele Nance Child Abduction Act; requires DJJ to establish immigration status screening program. Creates 985.6011. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/SB's 574, CS/SB 1228 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Gaetz), Senators Bennett, Gaetz and others—

School Districts; (THIS BILL COMBINES S574 & CS/S1228) provides criteria for designating academically high-performing school districts; provides exceptions for such districts to be exempt from certain statutes & rules; provides for notice concerning property & casualty insurance costs; provides criteria for using district school tax funds; authorizes use of funds for specified purposes, etc. Creates 1003.621; amends 200.065, 1011.71. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 26, 2007

CS/HB 7147 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Pickens and others—

Postsecondary Education Enhancements; requires OPPAGA to conduct study of certain enrollment forecasting models; requires DOE to conduct review of certain courses in statewide course numbering system & update system as appropriate; revises provisions re number of & qualifications for community college fee exemptions; provides residency requirement for funding baccalaureate degree programs at said colleges, etc. Amends 1007.33, 1009.25, 1011.83, 1009.23. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1570 (SUB)** (Lynn), read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 112 (3R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Hill—

ECT/Psychosurgical Procedures/Data; requires DOH to compile data on frequency & usage of electroconvulsive therapy & psychosurgery procedures on children; provides criteria for data; requires department to report data to Legislature. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 390 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations and Senator Wilson—

Child Welfare Professionals Day; relates to child welfare professionals; designates second Monday in May as "Child Welfare Professionals Recognition Day". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 430 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Saunders and others—

Mental Health Facilities; requires mental health & treatment facilities designated by DCFS to report certain financial &health service data to dept.; provides definition; provides reporting deadlines; provides report by dept. Amends 394.461. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 1007 (3R) by the Healthcare Council and Representative Baxley—

Physician Assistants/Prescriptions; requires that prescription be filled in pharmacy unless it is drug dispensed by physician assistant; provides that authority to dispense may be delegated only by supervisory physicians registered as dispensing practitioners. Amends 458.347, 459.022. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **CS/SB 692 (SUB)** (Saunders) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1190 (3R) by the Committee on Higher Education and Senator Lynn—

Education Articulation; declares additional legislative intent re postsecondary articulation; prescribes duties of Board of Governors re development of articulation policies & guidelines; provides for Articulation Coordinating Committee to report to Education Commissioner; provides for committee's selection, membership, & duties. Amends 1007.01. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 229 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Mahon and others—

Direct-support Org. for Guardian Ad Litem Program; creates said organization for Guardian Ad Litem program; provides for organization & operation of organization for Statewide Guardian Ad Litem Office; provides for contract; provides for board of directors; provides for use of property, facilities, & personal services of said office by said organization; provides restrictions; provides for deposit of moneys; provides for annual audit; provides limits on said organization. Creates 39.8298. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

HB 515 (3R) by Representative Evers and others—

UWF/M.S. Degree/Nursing/Social Work; authorizes master of science degree programs in nursing & social work at University of West Florida. Creates 1004.386. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **SB 1648 (SUB)** (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1770 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Lynn—

Technology to Supplement Visitation; defines term "electronic communication"; authorizes court to order electronic communication between parent & child; specifies factors court must consider before ordering electronic communication; creates rebuttable presumption in favor of telephone communication; requires each parent to furnish other parent with information necessary to facilitate electronic communication; provides applicability, etc. Amends 61.046; creates 61.13002. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1896 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Lynn—

Custody/Time-sharing with Children; authorizes court to issue appropriate order for parenting plan; authorizes parent who is not receiving child support to apply to court for support of child; authorizes court to make orders re time-sharing &parenting of children; provides for relocation of child & for relocation agreement between parents; repeals provision re court orders for rotating custody between parents if it is in best interests of child, etc. Amends Chs. 61, 741, 742. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/CS/SB 2130 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Constantine and others—

Exceptional Students/OPPAGA Study; requires study by OPPAGA of provision of educational services to certain exceptional students referred to or placed in private residential care facilities; defines terms; requires report with recommendations. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

HB 851 (3R) by Representative Proctor and others—

Historic Preservation; provides goals for contracting with University of Fla. for management of certain state-owned properties; requires agreement of all parties to contracts for management of such properties & said university; authorizes contracting without competitive bidding under certain circumstances; provides eligibility to match state funds in University Major Gifts Program, etc. Creates 267.1735,.1736; repeals 267.171. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

HB 853 (3R) by Representative Proctor and others—

Pub. Rec./Historic St. Augustine; provides exemption from public records requirements for certain donor & prospective donor information involving state-owned properties in historic district in City of St. Augustine; provides for future legislative review & repeal under OGSR Act; provides statement of public necessity. Amends 267.1736. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2406 (SUB)** (King) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 2512 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Wise and others—

English for Speakers of Other Languages/Educators; specifies inservice requirements for educators who provide English for Speakers of Other Languages instruction. Creates 1012.587. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 1916 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Fasano—

Assisted Living Facilities/Adult Day Care Centers; requires DOEA to adopt to develop staff training curriculum; requires trainers to be registered with department; requires trainers to document experience & credentials; requires adoption of rules; provides for operation of adult day care centers in temporary locations in event of disaster or emergency; provides notification requirements when adult day care centers relocate. Amends 429.52.,907. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

HB 7181 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Galvano and others—

Immigrant Victims/Human Trafficking; provides definition; provides for establishment of state-funded benefit program subject to availability of funds; provides for eligibility for benefits; provides for termination of benefits; provides for creation of public awareness campaign. Creates 414.156. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2032 (SUB)** (Margolis), read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 2114 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Judiciary, Senator Rich and others—

Independent Living Transition Services; limits liability of caseworker who signs application for driver's license for minor who is in foster care; revises eligibility criteria for independent living transition services & for Road-to-Independence Program; increases age limit for eligibility for certain persons to qualify for medical assistance payments; provides for removal of disabilities of certain minors for purposes of securing depository financial services, etc. Amends Chs. 322, 409, 743. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 2022 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Regulation, Senator Bennett and others—

Pharmacist Kevin Coit Memorial Act; authorizes pharmacists to administer influenza virus immunizations to adults; requires that pharmacists authorized to administer influenza virus immunizations provide evidence of current certification by Centers for Disease Control of U.S. Department of Health to supervising physician; creates Task Force for Study of Biotech Competitiveness; provides for expiration of task force, etc. Amends 465.003; creates 465.189. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

Identical to **CS/HB 543 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation and Judiciary

CS/SB 110 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Hill and others—

Health Ins./Prostate Cancer Coverage; creates "Senator Les Miller Act"; requires that health insurance policies, group health insurance policies, & health maintenance contracts provide coverage for annual screening for prostate cancer for men of specified age or older; provides that coverage for prostate cancer screening does not limit diagnostic benefits otherwise allowed under policy; provides finding that act fulfills important state interest, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

HB 63 (3R) by Representative Porth and others—

Pub. Rec./Domestic Violence Victim; provides exemption from public records requirements for certain records & time sheets submitted to an agency, as defined in specified provisions, by an employee who is victim of domestic violence; provides for future legislative review & repeal under OGSR Act; provides statement of public necessity. Amends 741.313. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 186 (SUB)** (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 55 (3R) by the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Porth and others—

Domestic Violence/Employee Leave; defines terms "domestic violence," "employee," "employer," "family or household member," & "victim"; requires that certain employers permit employee to take leave from work to undertake activities resulting from act of said violence; requires private employer to keep information re employee's leave confidential & governmental agency to keep such information confidential & exempt to extent authorized by statute, etc. Creates 741.313. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 188 (SUB)** (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 989 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Snyder and others—

Crime Victims; provides that alleged victims of sexual offenses shall not be required to submit to polygraph or other truth-telling examination as condition of proceeding with investigation of such offense; provides that refusal of alleged victim to submit to such examination does not preclude investigation, charging, or prosecution of alleged offense; provides for presence of victim advocates during forensic medical examinations, etc. Amends Ch. 960. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 642 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 770 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Operations, Health Regulation, Senator Atwater and others—

Physician Workforce Assessment & Development; creates Physician Workforce Assessment & Development Office within Health Access & Tobacco Div. of DOH; requires each allopathic & osteopathic physician in state to complete survey re physician's practice as condition of license renewal; specifies information to be furnished to DOH in physician survey; creates Physician Workforce Advisory Council within DOH to assist department re physician workforce issues, etc. Creates 381.4018. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1034 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Atwater—

Pub. Rec./Physician Workforce Surveys; exempts from public-records requirements personal identifying information contained in workforce surveys completed by physicians as condition of license renewal & provided to DOH; authorizes certain entities access to said information; provides guidelines for use of such information; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption under OGSR Act; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 259 (3R) by the Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council, Representative Attkisson and others—

Mobile Home Relocation Corporation; provides notice requirements for certain mobile home lot tenants regarding entitlement to compensation from Fla. Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund; provides for late fees if mobile home park owner does not make payments to Fla. Mobile Home Relocation Corporation within required time period; authorizes corporation to file & maintain certain actions to collect payments in Leon County, etc. Amends 723.061,.06116,.0612. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1036 (SUB)** (Jones) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1394 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Children & Families; authorizes DCFS to begin process of reorganization; requires dept. to integrate substance abuse & mental health programs into its structure & priorities; authorizes dept. to use name Department of Children & Families; clarifies provisions that prohibit falsifying, altering, or in any manner destroying records if such act may be detrimental to health, safety, or welfare of individual in care & custody of state agency, etc. Amends 839.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 1424 (3R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Carlton—

State Financial Matters; revises limitation on percentage of fund that may be invested in specified investments; prohibits initiating or commencing new fixed capital outlay project through amendment to original approved operating budget for operational & fixed capital outlay expenditures; reassigns Taxation & Budget Reform Commission for administrative purposes from Board of Regents to Office of Legislative Services, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 2008 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Jones—

Offshore Sand Source Inventory; provides for development & maintenance of inventory of identified offshore sand sources by DEP as part of its comprehensive long-term beach management plan; provides for boards of county commissioners of coastal counties adjacent to sand sources proposed for use outside of region or subregion to be notified & given adequate opportunity to comment during project's planning &permitting stages, etc. Creates 161.144; amends 161.021,.141. Effective Date: 10/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 27, 2007

HB 7111 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative H. Gibson and others—

Guardianship/Criminal History Record Checks; revises provisions re criminal history record checks for professional & nonprofessional guardians; grants rulemaking authority to Statewide Public Guardianship Office; revises terminology; deletes obsolete language; revises language concerning investigations of credit histories of professional guardians & certain of their employees. Amends 744.3135. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2040 (SUB)** (Storms) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/HB 721 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Proctor and others—

Sales Tax/Postsecondary Bookstore; exempts payments to postsecondary educational institutions made for certain bookstore operations; provides definition; provides construction; provides for retroactive application. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2102 (SUB)** (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 2118 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Debts & Debtors; provides that personal property of specified value is exempt from legal process if debtor does not receive homestead exemption; permits foreclosure notices to be published in certain newspapers that publish at least 5 days a week except during legal holidays; defines term "claims bar date"; authorizes consensual lienholder only to enforce security interest against assets of estate, etc. Amends Ch. 727, 222.25, 702.035. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/SB 2134 (3R) by the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Community Affairs, Senator Constantine and others—

Tax Increment Financing/Conservation Lands; authorizes two or more counties, or combination of at least one county & municipality, to establish tax increment area for conservation lands by interlocal agreement; requires establishment of separate reserve account for each tax increment area; provides that WMD may be party to said agreement; requires certain approvals from DEP & DCA; provides that revenue bonds may be paid only from revenues deposited into separate reserve account, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2007.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/CS/CS/SB 2234 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Regulated Industries, Senator Wise and others—

Regulation of Building Inspection Professionals; creates parts XV & XVI, of Miscellaneous Professions & Occupations law, re regulation of home inspectors, mold remediators & mold assessors; authorizes DBPR to establish fees; provides for certification of partnerships & corps. offering home inspection services; requires home inspectors to maintain specified insurance policy; requires certificate of authorization for certain persons & entities practicing home inspections, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007

CS/SB 2482 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Haridopolos—

Tax Administration; includes tax warrant as subordinate lienholder for purposes of disbursement of surplus funds after judicial sale; requires dealers to document exempt sales for resale; provides for adjustments in communications services tax distributions to correct for misallocations between jurisdictions; authorizes DOR to issue temp. fuel licenses during declared state of emergency or disaster, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2007


