SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING

SB 38 (SO) by Senator Deutch—

Relief/J. Miller/Memorial Reg. Hosp./Broward Co.; Provides relief for Janaria Miller, a minor child, for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of employees of Memorial Healthcare System of Broward, Inc., d/b/a Memorial Regional Hospital. Provides for placing funds in a special needs trust created for the exclusive use and benefit of Janaria Miller. Provides for reversion of funds to the hospital upon her death, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 40 (SO) by Senator Wilson—

Relief/Gough/Miami-Dade Co. School Board; Provides relief for Maria Gough and Jorge Gough, parents and natural guardians of Jaime Gough, a minor, and of Jorge Gough, as personal representative of the estate of Jaime Gough, for the wrongful death of their son which was due in part to negligence of the school board, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 54 (SO) by Senator Joyner—

Relief/Daniel Decembre/Orange County School Board; Provides relief for Daniel Decembre, a minor, by and through his parents and natural guardians, Desnar and Mignone Decembre, for injuries and damages he sustained as a result of negligence by agents and employees of the school board, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended unfavorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12

SB 60 (SO) by Senator Ring—

Relief/Adrian Fuentes/South Broward Hospital Dist.; Provides relief for Adrian Fuentes, a minor, by and through his parents and natural guardians, Luz Fuentes and Jose Fuentes for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of the South Broward Hospital District, d/b/a Memorial Hospital Primary Care Center. Provides for payment to a special needs trust established for the care and benefit of Adrian Fuentes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation

CS/SB 68 (SO) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Dean—

Relief/Tyler Giblin/Munroe Regional Health System; Provides relief for Tyler Giblin, a minor, by and through Gina and Mark Giblin, parents of Tyler Giblin, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Munroe Regional Health System, Inc. Provides for the use of funds. Provides limitation on the payment of fees and costs. Provides for payment of unreimbursed medical costs to the Agency for Health Care Administration, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation

CS/CS/SB 610 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Constantine—

Physical Education/Grades 6-8; Requires physical education for students in grade 6 through grade 8. Provides for waivers under certain circumstances. Requires school districts to notify parents of the waiver options, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 1716 (SO) by the Committees on Higher Education Appropriations, Higher Education and Senator Oelrich—

Postsecondary Education; Redesignates the names of certain community colleges as colleges. Creates the Florida College System comprised of the public postsecondary educational institutions that grant 2-year and 4-year academic degrees. Creates the Florida College System Task Force for the purpose of developing recommendations for the migration of community colleges to baccalaureate degree granting colleges. Creates the State College Pilot Project, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1080 (SO) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Higher Education, Senator Peaden and others—

Byrd Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute; Establishes the center within the University of South Florida. Provides for the administration of the center. Creates a research advisory board and provides for a manner of appointment. Eliminates the board of directors and the council of scientific advisors. Revises the grant award process for the center. Provides a limitation on expenditures. Authorizes an account for center purposes. Extends the sunset provisions, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 370 (SO) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Wise and others—

Personal Care Attendant Program; Requires the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to enter into an agreement by a certain date with the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living to administer a program to provide personal care attendants to persons who have severe and chronic disabilities. Names the program the "James Patrick Memorial Work Incentive Personal Attendant Services Program." Revises eligibility requirements for participation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 1374 (SO) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Health Regulation, the Committee on Health Regulation (Atwater) and others—

Home Health Care; Authorizes a home infusion therapy provider to be licensed as a nurse registry. Requires an applicant for a home health agency license to submit to the AHCA a business plan and evidence of contingency funding, and disclose other controlling ownership interests in health care entities. Requires an applicant for a new home health agency license to submit a surety bond of a specified amount to the AHCA, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

SB 186 (2R) by Senator Alexander and others—

University of South Florida Lakeland; Establishes the University of South Florida Lakeland campus to be operated as a separate organizational and budget entity of the University of South Florida (USF) and to operate under separate accreditation when in the best interest of the campus. Provides for a Campus Board. Provides for administration by a Campus Executive Officer who shall be appointed by, report directly to, and serve at the pleasure of the President of USF, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

SB 642 (2R) by Senator Siplin and others—

School/Multiple Birth Siblings/Classroom Placement; Defines "multiple birth siblings" as twins, triplets, quadruplets, or other siblings resulting from a multiple birth. Gives parents the right to request the same or separate classrooms in the same grade level for said siblings. Specifies that the provisions of this bill do not apply to the rights or obligations of exceptional or disabled students or the removal of students pursuant to discipline policies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/SB 2692 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Storms and others—

The Teaching of Chemical and Biological Evolution; Cites act as the "Evolution Academic Freedom Act." Provides public school teachers with a right to present scientific information relevant to the full range of views on biological and chemical evolution. Prohibits a teacher from being discriminated against for presenting such information. Prohibits students from being penalized for subscribing to a particular position on evolution, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 590 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—

Pari-mutuel Wagering; Requires the Division of Pari-mutuel Wagering to adopt rules governing the humane treatment of racing animals at pari-mutuel facilities. Deletes provisions requiring a biweekly period for the payment of jai alai taxes and greyhound dogracing taxes. Requires that the division adopt rules for the supervision and regulation of the welfare of racing animals, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

FISCAL POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [FPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1752 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations and Senator Wise—

Virtual Instruction Programs; Authorizes a school district to offer courses by virtual instruction to students meeting certain conditions and to implement the instruction programs by approved district-operated programs or programs provided by contracted providers if approved by the Department of Education. Provides that full-time equivalent students participating in a school district's virtual instruction program be funded through the Fla. Education Finance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1618 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice—

OGSR/Victims of Child Abuse or Sex Crimes; Expands the exemption for certain victim information by making it confidential and exempt from public record requirements. Expands the exemption to include sexual offenses prohibited under provisions for prostitution and provisions for obscenity. Creates exceptions to the public record exemption. Provides for future legislative review of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Governmental Operations reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 2164 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Jones—

Trust Administration; Provides exceptions to duties and liabilities of cotrustees for excluded cotrustees under certain circumstances. Relieves excluded cotrustees from specified liabilities and obligations under certain circumstances. Provides an exception for trustee payments of costs and attorney's fees from trust assets except pursuant to court order under certain circumstances. Requires trustees to provide certain notice to beneficiaries, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 334 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Saunders—

Pharmacists; Revises provisions governing licensure by endorsement of pharmacists, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 1370 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, the Committee on Health Regulation and others—

Florida Patient Safety Corporation; Authorizes a representative appointed by the Florida Council of Medical School Deans to serve on the board of directors of the corporation. Authorizes the corporation to create and dissolve advisory committees upon a majority vote of the board of directors. Requires the AHCA to make available adverse incident reports to designated agents of the corporation. Requires the corporation to encourage the use of evidence-based medicine, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Governmental Operations reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 1478 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Margolis—

Psychology Licensure; Requires the Board of Psychology within the Department of Health to close an application of an applicant who fails to pass the licensure examination or submit evidence of completion of postdoctoral training within a specified period. Requires that the board provide for exceptions. Authorizes persons who have completed postdoctoral residency training to continue the practice of psychology under supervision, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 630 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

Vehicle Registration/Family First Contribution; Requires that application and renewal forms for motor vehicle registration and driver's license or duplicate driver's license applications include language permitting a voluntary contribution of \$1 to Family First, a nonprofit organization, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1474 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Dissolution of Marriage; Provides for interim partial distributions during dissolution actions. Provides for effect on final distributions. Provides factors to be considered. Provides a presumption concerning certain personal property acquired during the marriage. Specifies the burden of proof necessary to overcome the fit presumption. Abolishes special equity. Provides for claims formerly identified as special equity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 2350 (2R) by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations, Senator Atwater and others—

Textbook Affordability; Prohibits employees of a community college or state university from demanding or receiving any payment or anything of value in exchange for requiring a student to purchase a specific text book for coursework and instruction. Authorizes receipt of certain instructional materials, compensation, and training. Requires adoption of specified policies and practices to minimize the cost of textbooks, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 2438 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Posey—

Spaceflight/Informed Consent; Creates part III of Chapter 331, F.S., titled "Spaceflight." Provides immunity from liability for injury to or death of certain participants in spaceflight activities if specified informed consent requirements are complied with. Requires each participant to sign a warning statement and provides minimum requirements for such statement, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

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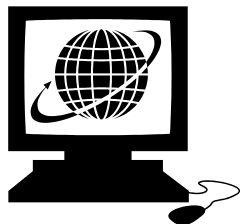
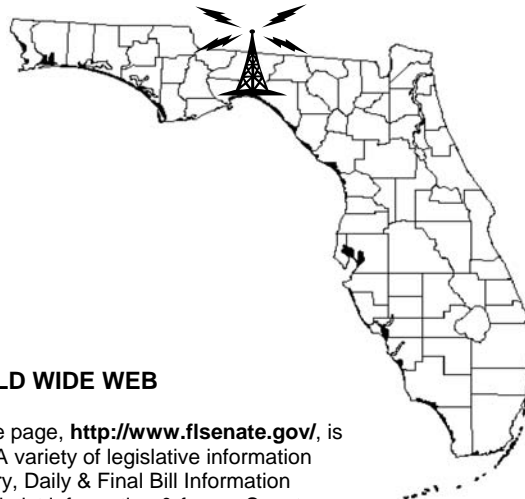
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
