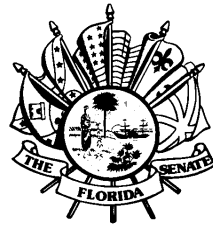

SM 2452 (2R) by Senator Posey—

National Catastrophe Insurance Program; Urges the Congress of the United States to support a National Catastrophe Insurance Program, etc.

CS/SB's 2860, SB 1196 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senators Atwater, Geller and others—

Insurance; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2860 & S1196) Revises legislative findings with respect to the Insurance Capital Build-Up Incentive Program and the appropriation of state funds for surplus notes issued by residential property insurers. Subjects the business of insurance to the Florida Antitrust Act. Prohibits an insurer from failing to promptly provide to the insured estimates of damage and a good faith explanation of the insurer's evaluation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

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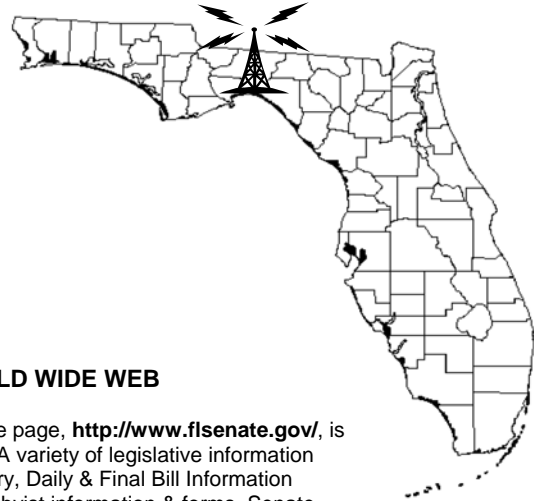
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
