BILLS ON THIRD READING

RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 542 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Land Acquisition and Management; Authorizes the distribution of bonds for the acquisition of conservation lands. Directs the Legislature to complete an analysis on potential revenue sources by date certain. Requires the Department of Environmental Protection to modernize its information systems. Requires that land management plans provide short-term and long-term management goals. Provides for funds to be deposited in the Florida Forever Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB's 556, SB 748 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Commerce, Senators Constantine, Crist and others—

Secondary Metals Recycling; (THIS BILL COMBINES S556 & S748) Revises recordkeeping requirements for purchase transactions. Provides for additional seller information to be obtained. Requires an image of the regulated metals being sold. Provides for enhanced penalties for third or subsequent violations of a specified provision. Prohibits secondary metals recyclers from entering into cash transactions in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Energy Conservation; Requires a court to conduct a hearing and issue a final judgment on a petition for a taking within specified times after a utility's request for such hearing. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan. Requires that the traffic-circulation element incorporate transportation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Creates the "Florida Energy Conservation and Sustainable Buildings Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

**ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1992 (3R) by the Committees on
Transportation and Economic Development
Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Transportation
and Senator Baker—**

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Authorizes the driving of a hybrid, low-emission, or energy-efficient vehicle in a high-occupancy-vehicle lane regardless of occupancy. Requires the placement of signs in certain school zones stating that speeding fines are doubled within the zone. Prohibits driving in any race, drag race, exhibition of speed, or exhibition of acceleration. Revises the conditions under which the court may require the use of an ignition interlock device, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008, further amended on April 17, 2008

**LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND
CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING**

**CS/SB 92 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary,
Senator Villalobos and others—**

Persons Injured by Crime/Medical Treatment; Creates the "Pastora Pacheco Aid to Victims Act". Provides that depriving medical treatment to a victim of a crime with intent to avoid, delay, hinder, or obstruct any investigation of criminal activity contributing to the injury is a criminal offense. Provides that felony penalties apply if a victim's medical condition worsens or deprivation of medical care contributes or results in the death of the victim, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

**CS/SB 278 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal
Justice, Senator Rich and others—**

Lifeguards/Assault or Battery; Defines "lifeguard" as a lifeguard employed along the coastal or intracoastal beaches and shores of the state, or other bodies of water of the state, or at swimming pools to help prevent injury or drowning of persons. Provides enhanced penalties for an assault or battery on a lifeguard while he or she is engaged in the lawful performance of his or her duties. Amends the offense severity ranking chart to include firefighter, intake officer, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

**CS/CS/HB 43 (3R) by the Policy & Budget
Council, the Safety & Security Council,
Representative Snyder and others—**

Criminal Activity; Requires certain felons whose offenses related to criminal gangs to register; penalizes certain persons possessing firearms; revises provisions relating to enjoining of public nuisances to include certain nuisances related to criminal gangs & criminal gang activities; redefines "criminal street gangs" as "criminal gangs"; prohibits possession of bulletproof vests by certain persons, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 76 (SUB) (Atwater), read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

**CS/HB 537 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council,
Representative Dorworth and others—**

Offense of Voyeurism; Increases penalties for specified video voyeurism offenses committed by certain persons who are responsible for welfare of child younger than 16 years of age or are employed at school or voluntary prekindergarten education program or by persons 24 years of age or older against child younger than 16 years of age, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 328 (SUB) (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 17, 2008

**CS/HB 321 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council,
Representative Snyder and others—**

Murder of Law Enforcement Officers; Provides minimum mandatory sentence for certain offenses. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 1064 (SUB) (Dockery) and read the second time on April 17, 2008

**CS/CS/CS/SB 756 (3R) by the Committees on
Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations,
Criminal Justice, Judiciary, Senator Joyner and
others—**

Wrongful Incarceration Compensation; Creates the "Victims of Wrongful Incarceration Compensation Act." Provides a limited method by which a person may seek the status of a wrongfully incarcerated person who is eligible and entitled to compensation under the act. Requires a sworn petition by the claimant. Requires the petitioner to show verifiable and substantial evidence of actual innocence. Directs the CFO to purchase an annuity on behalf of the claimant, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

CS/HB 1363 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Brandenburg and others—

Controlled Substances; Includes Salvia divinorum & Salvinorin A on list of controlled substances in Schedule I; provides exceptions. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/SB 1462 (3R) by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Senator Dean and others—

Veterans' Affairs/Direct-support Organization; Creates the "Sergeant First Class Paul R. Smith Memorial Act." Authorizes the Department of Veterans' Affairs (FDVA) to establish a direct-support organization to assist the department. Requires the organization to operate under contract with the FDVA. Provides for the FDVA to replace the Florida Commission on Veterans' Affairs in cooperating with the Department of Management Services to establish the Florida Medal of Honor Wall, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

*Identical to **CS/HB 861 (HC)** in the Committees on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Governmental Operations, and Health and Human Services Appropriations*

CS/SB 1618 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Criminal Justice (Dockery)—

OGSR/Victims of Child Abuse or Sex Crimes; Expands the exemption for certain victim information by making it confidential and exempt from public record requirements. Expands the exemption to include sexual offenses prohibited under provisions for prostitution and provisions for obscenity. Creates exceptions to the public record exemption. Provides for future legislative review of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/SB 2522 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

Family Readiness Program; Expands the purpose, eligibility, and annual report provisions of the Family Readiness Program within the Department of Military Affairs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 334 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Saunders—

Pharmacists; Revises provisions governing licensure by endorsement of pharmacists, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/SB 502 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Constantine and others—

Missing Persons/Investigation; Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt written policies and procedures to be used when investigating missing children and missing adult reports. Requires the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction to accept and file the report. Provides a timeframe for transmitting the report to state and national databases. Requires that a law enforcement agency obtain a DNA sample after a child or adult has been missing for more than 90 days, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/CS/SB 574 (3R) by the Committees on Higher Education, Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Senator Baker and others—

School Access/Jr. or Sr. Officers' Training Corps; Prohibits a school district from banning a Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit on public school campuses. Prohibits a community college or state university from banning a Senior Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit on school campuses. Requires a school district, a community college, or state university to grant military recruiters certain access to students, school facilities and grounds, and certain student information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

*Identical to **CS/HB 251 (HC)** in the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12, Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Higher Education, and Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations*

SB 642 (3R) by Senator Siplin and others—

School/Multiple Birth Siblings/Classroom Placement; Defines "multiple birth siblings" as twins, triplets, quadruplets, or other siblings resulting from a multiple birth. Gives parents the right to request the same or separate classrooms in the same grade level for said siblings. Specifies that the provisions of this bill do not apply to the rights or obligations of exceptional or disabled students or the removal of students pursuant to discipline policies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/SB 856 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Fasano and others—

Disability History and Awareness; Requires district school boards to designate "Disability History and Awareness Weeks" during the first 2 weeks in October each year. Provides for students in all K-12 public schools to be provided disability history and awareness instruction. Provides the content and goals of such instruction. Encourages state postsecondary institutions to conduct and promote activities related to disability history and awareness, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

CS/SB 1318 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Gaetz—

Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems; Provides that a member of local government who is knowledgeable about domestic wastewater treatment be added to the research review and advisory committee and the technical review and advisory panel established by the Department of Health for purposes of onsite sewage treatment and disposal system regulation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1360 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Peadar—

Pharmacy Technicians; Revises licensure requirements. Requires the Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules. Provides for the registration of pharmacy technicians. Requires that a registered pharmacy technician be under the direct supervision of a licensed pharmacist. Requires the board to set fees for the registration of pharmacy technicians. Requires completion of a pharmacy technician training program in order to register as a pharmacy technician by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 1374 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Health Regulation, the Committee on Health Regulation (Atwater) and others—

Home Health Care; Authorizes a home infusion therapy provider to be licensed as a nurse registry. Requires an applicant for a home health agency license to submit to the AHCA a business plan and evidence of contingency funding, and disclose other controlling ownership interests in health care entities. Requires an applicant for a new home health agency license to submit a surety bond of a specified amount to the AHCA, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

Compare to **CS/HB 7083 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation, Banking and Insurance, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 1414 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Supplemental Educational Services Providers; Requires the Department of Education to annually evaluate and grade supplemental educational services providers. Specifies evaluation criteria. Provides reporting requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/HB 803 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Brise and others—

Licensure of Psychologists; Requires Board of Psychology to close application files of applicants failing to pass certain examinations or of applicants failing to submit evidence of completion of postdoctoral supervised experience within specified time; provides that individual who completes required postdoctoral training residency may continue to practice under supervision under certain specified conditions. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

Substituted for CS/SB 1478 (SUB) (Margolis), read the second time and amended on April 17, 2008

HB 603 (3R) by Representative Flores and others—

Textbook Affordability; Prohibits certain actions of community college or state university employees that relate to student purchase of required textbooks; authorizes receipt of certain instructional materials, compensation, & training; requires student notification of required textbooks; requires adoption of specified policies & practices to minimize cost of textbooks. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 2350 (SUB) (Atwater) and read the second time on April 17, 2008

HB 7041 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Bean and others—

Florida Self-Directed Care Program; Provides for expansion of program to all districts of DCFS; requires department to implement payment mechanism for mental health treatment & support services; provides for duties of fiscal intermediary in lieu of managing entity; permits fiscal intermediary to receive funds on behalf of participants; requires evaluation of program by OPPAGA by certain date; revises evaluation criteria; deletes expiration date of program. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 2390 (SUB) (Webster) and read the second time on April 17, 2008

CS/SB 2692 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Storms and others—

The Teaching of Chemical and Biological Evolution; Cites act as the "Evolution Academic Freedom Act." Provides public school teachers with a right to present scientific information relevant to the full range of views on biological and chemical evolution. Prohibits a teacher from being discriminated against for presenting such information. Prohibits students from being penalized for subscribing to a particular position on evolution, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

**CS/CS/SB 108 (SO) by the Committees on
Governmental Operations, Military Affairs and
Domestic Security, Senator Fasano and others—**

Service-disabled Veteran Business Enterprises; Creates the Florida Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Opportunity Act. Provides a selection preference regarding state contracts in favor of certified service-disabled veteran business enterprises. Requires that a certification procedure be established by the Department of Management Services and the Department of Veterans' Affairs and reviewed biennially and updated as necessary, etc. Effective Date: 11/11/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/HB 687 (HC)** in the Committees on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Governmental Operations, and General Government Appropriations*

SB 1606 (SO) by Senator Baker and others—

Veterans Special License Plates; Expands the types of veterans special license plates from which revenues generated from the sale of such plates may be used solely to construct, operate, and maintain domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans. Provides for the program to provide loan guarantees or credit enhancements to units of local government or to private entities for use in constructing or modernizing facilities and infrastructure necessary to attract or expand certain industries as part of an economic-development project, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

CS/SB 2716 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Aronberg—

Residential Tenancies; Allows a landlord to terminate a rental agreement and recover liquidated damages or charge the tenant an early termination fee for breach of the agreement, or both, under certain circumstances. Requires the tenant to indicate acceptance of an early termination fee or liquidated-damages provision in the rental agreement in order for the provision to take effect, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Provides that full-time equivalent students participating in a school district's virtual instruction program be funded through the Fla. Education Finance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 1762 (2R) by the Committees on Higher Education, Higher Education Appropriations and Senator Lynn—

Postsecondary Distance Learning; Establishes the Florida Distance Learning Task Force. Establishes the Florida Higher Education Distance Learning Catalog. Exempts a distance learning course from laboratory fees. Authorizes a community college to assess a student enrolled in a course listed in the catalog a per-credit-hour user fee. Authorizes a state university to assess a per-credit-hour distance learning course fee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

Water Management Districts; Reenacts specified provisions relating to the creation of the WMDs, pursuant to the provisions of the Florida Government Accountability Act. Eliminates the Oklawaha River Basin Advisory Council. Provides that a WMD's millage rate is subject to annual authorization by the Legislature. Developments of Regional Impact; Exempts proposed developments involving medical technology, biotechnology, or life sciences which meet certain criteria from review as a development of regional impact, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

CS/CS/SB 2246 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Agriculture, Senator Baker and others—

Land Development Regulations; Provides for the use of certain lands surrounding an agricultural enclave. Creates a rebuttable presumption for the imposition of certain development conditions relating to such enclaves. Provides concurrency standards for such enclaves in relation to previously approved development contiguous to the enclave. Revises provisions relating to optional sector plans. Revises the definition of "agricultural enclave," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Business Entities; Exempts a domestic corporation from the requirement to file articles of merger under certain circumstances. Revises the requirements for general partners with respect to exercising certain management rights. Provides that the expulsion of a limited partner requires the consent of all of the other limited partners. Revises terms related to qualifications to render professional services, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

CS/SB 940 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Employee Leasing Companies; Cites this act as the "Accurate Employment Statistics Enhancement Act." Redefines the term "employee leasing company." Requires quarterly reports that include client and establishment specific information. Authorizes the Agency for Workforce Innovation to adopt rules. Provides enforcement authority, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Governmental Operations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 996 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Higher Education, Regulated Industries and Senator Wise—

Cosmetology; Redefines "cosmetology" to include specified services and exclude artificial nails and use of certain skin treatments. Authorizes licensure for cosmetologists, hair stylists, estheticians, and nail technicians. Specifies that only the Board of Cosmetology may review, evaluate, and approve required course and text. Requires the board to adopt rules relating to protection of health of clients, nail technicians, and estheticians, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Alcoholic Beverages/Persons Under 21 Years; Increases the penalty imposed for a second or subsequent offense of selling, giving, or serving alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 years of age within one year after the first offense from a misdemeanor of the second degree to a misdemeanor of the first degree. Provides a defense to such a charge, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Requires the Division of Emergency Management and the Department of Law Enforcement to abide by the terms of such plan, arrangement, or agreement and provide assistance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Operations and reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities, and the Committee on Commerce reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 2660 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations and Senator Lawson—

Cultural and Historical Programs; Provides for more than one citizen support organization. Adds historical and museum programs to those programs that can be assisted by the citizen support organizations of the Division of Cultural Affairs of the Department of State. Provides state policy re historic properties. Authorizes the division to acquire, maintain, preserve, interpret, exhibit, and make available for study certain objects having historical or archaeological value, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Provides requirements for renewing an inactive certificate. Requires the department to establish a procedure for the initial certification of certain 911 emergency dispatchers. Requires that fees be deposited in a trust fund and used for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Compact/Educational Opportunity/Military Children; Directs the Governor to execute the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children on behalf of this state with any other state or states legally adopting the compact. Creates the Interstate Commission on Educational Opportunity for Military Children. Provides the method for the compact to become effective and binding on the member states. Creates the State Advisory Council for the compact, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

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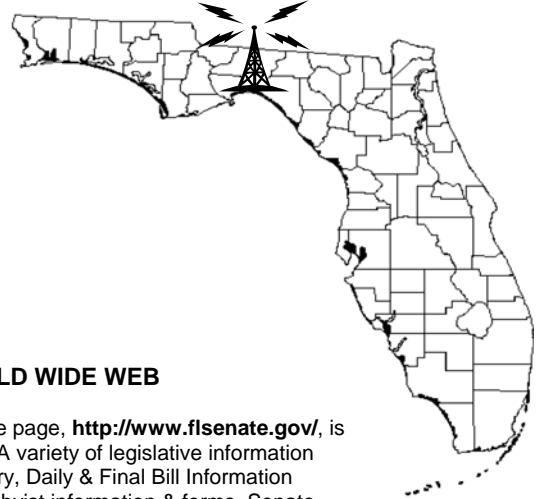
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
