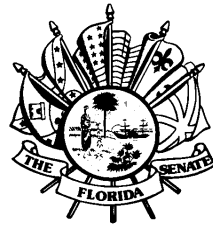

BILLS ON THIRD READING

RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Energy Conservation; Requires a court to conduct a hearing and issue a final judgment on a petition for a taking within specified times after a utility's request for such hearing. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan. Requires that the traffic-circulation element incorporate transportation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Creates the "Florida Energy Conservation and Sustainable Buildings Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008, further amended on April 17, 2008

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

CS/HB 687 (3R) by the Government Efficiency & Accountability Council, Representative Proctor and others—

Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises; Creates Florida Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Opportunity Act; provides legislative intent & definitions; provides selection preference in state contracting for certified service-disabled veteran business enterprises; provides certification procedure; provides DVA & DMS duties; provides data reporting by Small Business Development Center, etc. Effective Date: 11/11/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 108 (SUB) (Fasano) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/HB 1027 (3R) by the Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council, Representative Kreegel and others—

Funding for State Veterans' Homes; Expands types of veterans special license plates from which revenues generated from sale of such plates may be used; dedicates portion of such revenues solely to construct, operate, & maintain domiciliary & nursing homes for veterans; requires registration applications & renewal forms for motor vehicles to include language permitting voluntary contribution of \$1 to state homes for veterans. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for SB 1606 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/HB 863 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Reagan and others—

Pub. Rec./Direct-Support Organization/DVA; Provides exemption from public records requirements for information concerning certain donors & prospective donors to direct-support organization of DVA; provides exemption from public meeting requirements for portions of meetings of DSO at which identity of donors & prospective donors is discussed; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for CS/SB 1464 (SUB) (Dean) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/SB 624 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Senator Dockery and others—

Human Smuggling; Provides that a person commits a third-degree felony if he or she transports an individual 18 years of age or older into this state and knows, or should know, that the individual is an illegal alien. Provides that it is a second-degree felony if such illegal alien is injured or dies. Provides that a person commits a second-degree felony if he or she transports a minor into this state and knows or should know, that the minor is an illegal alien, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/HB 151 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Reed and others—

Radio Equipment Using Law Enforcement Frequencies; Provides exceptions to prohibition on use of such equipment for specified personnel using personal transportation to & from work & for certain government employees. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 522 (SUB) (Hill) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

HB 61 (3R) by Representative Scionti and others—

Offenses Against Officers; Provides that person is not justified in using force to resist arrest by law enforcement officer, or to resist law enforcement officer engaged in executing legal duty, if officer acts in good faith & is known or appears to be law enforcement officer. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 654 (SUB) (Crist) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/HB 435 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Hukill and others—

Trust Administration; Provides exceptions to duties & liabilities of cotrustees for excluded cotrustees under specified circumstances; relieves excluded cotrustees from specified liabilities & obligations under specified circumstances; provides for liabilities & obligations of included cotrustees; provides exception for trustee payments of costs & attorney's fees from trust assets except pursuant to court order under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 2164 (SUB) (Jones) and read the second time on April 23, 2008

CS/SB 1474 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Dissolution of Marriage; Provides for interim partial distributions during dissolution actions. Provides for effect on final distributions. Conforms provisions to the abolition of special equity. Provides a presumption concerning certain personal property acquired during the marriage. Specifies the burden of proof necessary to overcome the gift presumption. Abolishes special equity. Provides for claims formerly identified as special equity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

CS/SB 740 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Dean—

Retired Justices and Judges; Provides that a former justice or judge may be qualified to serve as a retired justice or judge under certain conditions. Provides circumstances under which such justice or judge is excluded from serving as a retired justice or judge, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

CS/CS/SB 766 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Operations, Judiciary, Senator Rich and others—

Pub. Rec./Judicial and Administrative Officials; Creates exemptions from public records requirements for the home addresses and telephone numbers of general magistrates, special magistrates, judges of compensation claims, administrative law judges of the Division of Administrative Hearings, and child support enforcement hearing officers, and the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of said judicial and administrative officials, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

**CS/CS/SB 866 (3R) by the Committees on
Judiciary, Ethics and Elections and Senator
Constantine—**

Elections; Revises provisions relating to the investigative duties of the Secretary of State. Reduces the time by which supervisors of elections must electronically transmit certain voter history information to the department. Revises methods by which a person's right to vote may be challenged. Clarifies that political subdivisions may impose electronic filing requirements on certain candidates, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1442 (3R) by the Committees on
Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations,
Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Dockery and
others—**

Exploited Children; Permits use of a pseudonym to designate the victim of a crime involving a victim of production, possession, or promotion of child pornography. Revises provisions relating to the sale or transfer of minors into sex trafficking or prostitution. Requires law enforcement officers to provide certain information to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

**SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND
CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING**

**HB 7007 (3R) by the Healthcare Council,
Representative R. Garcia and others—**

Safe Haven Protection/Surrendered Newborn Infants; Provides presumption of consent to termination of parental rights in cases of surrendered infants; removes requirement that child-placing agency conduct search to identify parent of surrendered infant; provides exception; increases age at which infant is considered newborn for purposes of treatment after surrender; provides for anonymity of infant's parents. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

the second time on April 23, 2008*

**HB 7077 (3R) by the Healthcare Council,
Representative Galvano and others—**

Child Protection; Authorizes DCFS to adopt rules providing for locating & recovering missing children who are involved with DCFS; requires criminal history check of persons being considered for placement of child to include search of DCFS's automated abuse information system; provides for additional methods of reporting suspected child abuse, abandonment, & neglect; provides additional conditions for injunction to protect child from domestic violence, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008*

**HB 7073 (3R) by the Healthcare Council and
Representative Galvano—**

Child Support Enforcement; Requires cooperation between DOR & other agencies regarding automated disclosure of certain information relating to current registrants, licensees, & certificateholders who are not in compliance with child support orders & authorizes sanctions for violators; removes screening requirements for applicants for new or renewal registrations, licenses, or certificates, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/HB 663 (3R) by the Healthcare Council,
Representative Cannon and others—**

Termination of Parental Rights; Revises various provisions of Florida Adoption Act; requires petition for adoption to be accompanied by statement signed by prospective adoptive parents acknowledging receipt of all information required to be disclosed; provides for service of process by publication for termination of parental rights under Florida Adoption Act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

read the second time on April 23, 2008*

**CS/SB 1042 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary,
the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder
Affairs (Storms) and others—**

OGSR/Putative Father Registry/Department of Health; Revises and readopts an exemption from the public records requirements for information contained in the Florida Putative Father Registry, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

**SB 1046 (3R) by the Committee on Children,
Families, and Elder Affairs (Storms) and others—**

OGSR/Foster Parents/DCFS; Revises and readopts an exemption from the public records requirements for information held by the Department of Children and Family Services regarding foster parent applicants, licensed foster parents, their spouses, minor children, and other household members, and persons providing character or neighbor references regarding foster parent applicants or foster parents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

SB 186 (3R) by Senator Alexander and others—

University of South Florida Polytechnic; Establishes the University of South Florida Polytechnic campus to be operated as a separate organizational and budget entity of the University of South Florida (USF) and to operate under separate accreditation when in the best interest of the campus. Provides for a Campus Board. Provides for administration by a Campus Executive Officer who shall be appointed by, report directly to, and serve at the pleasure of the President of USF, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND
CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING**

**CS/CS/HB 343 (3R) by the Policy & Budget
Council, the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council,
Representative Carroll and others—**

Financial Services; Defines debt cancellation product; authorizes specified entities to offer debt cancellation products but prohibits requiring such products as condition for financial transactions; includes debt cancellation products under casualty insurance; authorizes specified entities to offer debt cancellation products; specifies such products as not constituting insurance; revises limitations on amount of authorized insurance for debtors, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 818 (SUB) (Bennett) and
read the second time on April 23, 2008*

**CS/HB 535 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council,
Representative Cretul and others—**

Health Insurance; Revises definition of "bone marrow transplant"; requires identification card containing specified information be given insureds under health benefit plans & group health insurance policies & persons having health care services through health maintenance contracts; provides for exception to specified identification card requirements for cards issued before specified date. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

*Substituted for CS/SB 1968 (SUB) (Posey) and read
the second time on April 23, 2008*

**CS/CS/SB 2174 (3R) by the Committees on
General Government Appropriations, Banking
and Insurance and Senator Posey—**

Motor Vehicle Insurance/PIP; Revises the schedule of maximum charges on which an insurer may base a limited reimbursement for certain medical services, supplies, and care for injured persons covered by personal injury protection. Specifies a minimum amount for the applicable fee schedule or payment limitation under Medicare for such reimbursements, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

**CS/CS/SB 2264 (3R) by the Committees on
Commerce, Banking and Insurance and Senator
Lawson—**

Motor Vehicle Warranty Associations; Exempts motor vehicle manufacturers applying for licensure as service agreement companies from certain licensing requirements and limitations on claims liabilities. Prohibits warranty service associations that do not collect the names and addresses of warranty holders from denying a warranty holder's claim on the basis that the association cannot confirm that the warranty holder in fact purchased the warranty, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

**CS/SB 2462 (3R) by the Committee on Banking
and Insurance and Senator Gaetz—**

Group Self-insurance Funds; Authorizes the board of trustees of certain self-insurers to declare any moneys in excess of the amount necessary to fund all obligations of the self-insurer as refundable to the members or policyholders of the self-insurer. Provides for the submission of certain information to the Office of Insurance Regulation if a self-insurer does not make or declare a dividend or member distribution payable during a given fund year, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/CS/SB 428 (3R) by the Committees on
Transportation and Economic Development
Appropriations, Commerce and Senator
Bennett—**

Workforce Innovation; Authorizes the designation of a regional workforce board as a one-stop operator and direct provider of certain services by agreement of the chief elected official and the Governor. Requires that Workforce Florida, Inc., establish procedures for a regional workforce board to request permission to operate and the criteria for granting such permission. Provides for the permission to operate not exceed a certain period, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 23, 2008

**CS/CS/CS/SB 2016 (3R) by the Committees on
General Government Appropriations, Community
Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator
Aronberg—**

Public Lodging and Food Service Establishments; Eliminates the requirement for the Division of Hotels and Restaurants to assist the State Fire Marshal in updating the Florida Fire Prevention Code. Eliminates the requirement for the division to enforce the code in conducting its inspections. Decreases the amount of time in which a food service manager is required to obtain certification after employment. Provides for wastewater disposal procedures for public food service establishments, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

CS/HB 995 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Robaina and others—

Community Associations; Revises membership of Regulatory Council of Community Association Managers; provides responsibilities of council; provides requirements for community association management firms; requires DBPR to investigate certain complaints and allegations; provides duties of officers, directors, and agents of a condominium association and liability for monetary damages under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2084 (SUB)** (Villalobos) and read the second time on April 23, 2008*

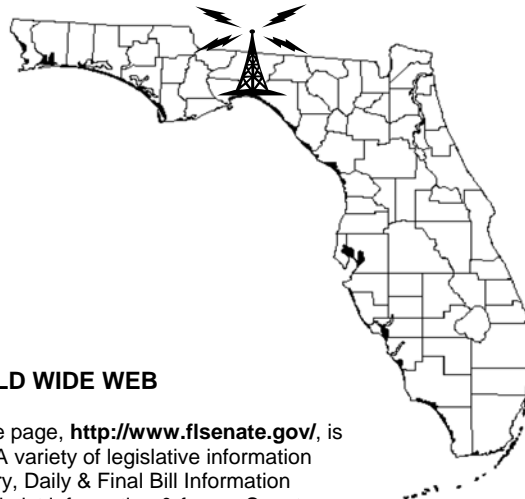

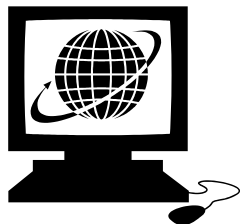
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
