CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Energy Conservation; Requires a court to conduct a hearing and issue a final judgment on a petition for a taking within specified times after a utility's request for such hearing. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan. Requires that the traffic-circulation element incorporate transportation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Creates the "Florida Energy Conservation and Sustainable Buildings Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008, further amended on April 17, 2008

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/CS/SB 2016 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Aronberg—

Public Lodging and Food Service Establishments; Eliminates the requirement for the Division of Hotels and Restaurants to assist the State Fire Marshal in updating the Florida Fire Prevention Code. Eliminates the requirement for the division to enforce the code in conducting its inspections. Decreases the amount of time in which a food service manager is required to obtain certification after employment. Provides for wastewater disposal procedures for public food service establishments, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2008

CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 560 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Regulated Industries, Community Affairs and Senator Constantine—

Building Code Standards; Revises provisions authorizing the use of solar collectors and other energy devices. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan to include energy-efficient land use patterns and greenhouse gas reduction strategies. Requires the installation of carbon monoxide detectors in certain new hospitals, hospice and nursing home facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/HB 3 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Bendross-Mindingall and others—

Children's Zones; Provides for counties & municipalities to designate certain areas as children's zones; provides process for nominating children's zones; provides for children's zone planning teams & corporations & strategic community plans; establishes Magic City Children's Zone, Jacksonville Children's Zone, & Orlando Children's Zone pilot projects; requires DCFS to contract with certain private not-for-profit corporations. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 500 (SUB)** (Bullard), read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 1300 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Saunders—

Seagrass Scarring/Illegally Taken Wildlife; Provides that it is a civil infraction to operate a vessel outside a marked channel in a manner that causes seagrass scarring. Amends a specified provision relating to the disposition of illegally taken wildlife and provides for the disposition of such wildlife. Creates a specified provision relating to photographs of illegally taken wildlife. Provides for the admission of photographs as evidentiary materials, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

SB 1986 (3R) by Senator Ring-

Homeowners' Associations/Lien Claims; Provides that when authorized by the governing documents, a homeowners' association has a lien on each parcel to secure the payment of assessments and other amounts. Provides that the act does not bestow upon any lien, mortgage, or certified judgment of record on July 1, 2008, a priority that the lien, mortgage, or judgment did not have before that date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 758 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Bennett and others—

Inland Navigation Districts; Authorizes inland navigation districts to aid and cooperate with certain nonmember counties, certain seaports, and navigation districts in planning and carrying out certain projects concerning waterways. Requires that the FWC assume certain responsibilities for posting and maintaining regulatory markers concerning manatee protection speed zones. Authorizes the DEP to develop and maintain a list concerning use of flocculants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/HB 337 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Ford and others—

Management of Historic Pensacola Properties; Provides for UWF to directly contract with Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund for management of certain state-owned properties in Pensacola; requires agreement of all parties to existing contracts & execution of contract with such Board of Trustees; rescinds existing management contracts relating to such properties; rescinds contract between UWF & DOS, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1014 (SUB)** (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/HB 853 (3R) by the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Troutman and others—

Cemetery Lands; Revises provisions relating to sale or disposition of cemetery lands to provide restrictions with respect to takings by eminent domain & imposition of certain conditions for obtaining specified regulatory approval. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1308 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 24, 2008

SB 1486 (3R) by Senator Saunders—

State Tortoise; Designates the Gopher Tortoise (Gopherus polyphemus) as the official state tortoise, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 2052 (3R) by the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities and Senator Baker—

Water and Wastewater Utilities; Revises provisions for Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) staff assistance in changing rates and charges for water and wastewater utilities. Provides for periodic adjustment of the gross annual revenue level established by the PSC for such purposes. Requires the PSC to periodically submit a report to the Legislature and specifies the report requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/SB 994 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Fasano and others—

Employee Leave/Victims of Sexual Violence; Provides up to 3 working days of leave in any 12-month period to employees who are victims of sexual violence or who have a family or household member who is a victim of sexual violence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

HB 989 (3R) by Representative Bogdanoff and others—

Physician Assistants; Revises requirements for formulary established by Council on Physician Assistants in order to allow physician assistants to prescribe antipsychotics & parenteral preparations. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **SB 1106 (SUB)** (Saunders) and read the second time on April 24, 2008

HB 7085 (3R) by the Healthcare Council and Representative Galvano—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse; Authorizes AHCA, in consultation with DCFS, to establish licensure category for facilities providing integrated adult mental health crisis stabilization unit & addictions receiving facility services; provides duties of facilities & standards, procedures, & eligibility requirements for services; creates "Community Mental Health and Substance Abuse Treatment and Crime Reduction Act", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 1150 (SUB)** (Storms), read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

SB 1456 (3R) by Senator Wilson-

Inmates/Medical Assistance Eligibility/Medicaid; Provides that in the event a person who is an inmate in the state's correctional system, in a county detention facility, or in a municipal detention facility was in receipt of medical assistance prior to being admitted, such person shall remain eligible for medical assistance while an inmate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1488 (3R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Health Regulation and Senator Dean—

Health Care Consumer's Right to Information Act; Requires a health care provider or a health care facility to provide an uninsured person with a reasonable estimate of charges for planned nonemergency medical services before such services are provided. Requires that the provider or facility provide the uninsured person with information regarding such provider's or facility's discount or charity policies, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1582 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Joyner—

Guardians Ad Litem; Authorizes a person affiliated with a not-for-profit legal aid organization to serve as a guardian ad litem under certain circumstances. Requires that such person undergo a security background investigation. Requires not-for-profit legal aid organizations to provide training developed by The Florida Bar before a person is certified as a guardian ad litem. Provides for interim training developed by a curriculum committee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/HB 625 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Glorioso and others—

Independent Living Transition Services; Provides for family foster homes, residential child-caring agencies, or other authorized caregivers to be included in development of plans for activities for certain children; requires specified information to be included in report to Legislature by Independent Living Services Advisory Council; provides for removal of disabilities of certain minors for purposes of securing utility services. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2192 (SUB)** (Storms) and read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2598 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Atwater—

Impaired Medical Practitioners/Treatment Programs; Revises requirements for consultants retained by the Department of Health (DOH). Provides that a consultant may contract for services to be provided to students enrolled in schools for licensure as allopathic and osteopathic physicians or physician assistants, nurses, or pharmacists who are alleged to be impaired, if requested by the school. Indemnifies certain schools from liability in civil actions under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 988 (3R) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Wise and others—

Transitional Services/Young Adults/Disabilities; Creates the Health Care Transition Services Task Force for Youth and Young Adults with Disabilities within the Department of Health to assess the need for health care transition services for youth with disabilities, develop strategies to ensure a successful transition from the pediatric to the adult health care system, and identify existing and potential funding sources, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

HB 85 (3R) by Representative Kravitz and others—

Lewd or Lascivious Molestation; Requires life sentences for second or subsequent offenses of lewd or lascivious molestation against victim less than 12 years of age. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **SB 496 (SUB)** (Dockery) and read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 1614 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Criminal Justice and the Committee on Criminal Justice (Dockery)—

Department of Corrections; Deletes certain provisions limiting circumstances under which an offender may be placed in community control. Specifies that the DOC meets its statutory obligation to assist released offenders with completing the application for the restoration of civil rights by sending an electronic list to the Parole Commission each month of those inmates and offenders who were released from incarceration or terminated from supervision during the preceding month, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

SB 1700 (3R) by Senator Bennett-

Seminole Tribe of Florida/Mutual Aid Agreements; Authorizes the Seminole Tribe of Florida to enter into any existing mutual aid plan, arrangement, or agreement. Requires the Division of Emergency Management and the Department of Law Enforcement to abide by the terms of such plan, arrangement, or agreement and provide assistance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1732 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Joyner and others—

Florida Statewide Task Force on Human Trafficking; Creates within the Executive Office of the Governor the Florida Statewide Task Force on Human Trafficking. Provides for members of the task force to serve without compensation or reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses. Requires that the task force prepare a final report by a specified date. Provides duties of the Florida State University Center for the Advancement of Human Rights. Abolishes the task force on a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2676 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Crist—

Citizens' Right-to-Know Act/Pretrial Release; Requires each pretrial release program to prepare a register displaying information relevant to the defendants released through such a program. Requires that a copy of the register be located at the office of the clerk of the circuit court in the county where the program is located and readily accessible to the public. Provides requirements for the form of bail or bond required for release from detention, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 342 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Lynn—

Law Enforcement Officers/Candidates/Public Office;

Authorizes a law enforcement officer to qualify as a candidate for public office without resigning his or her law enforcement position. Provides an exception. Provides for reinstatement to the law enforcement officer. Authorizes a candidate to pay a pro rata portion of the qualifying fee under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR FRIDAY, APRIL 25, 2008

CS/HB 257 (SO) by the Healthcare Council, Representatives Traviesa, Mayfield and others—

Abortion; Requires third trimester abortions be performed in hospital; provides for disciplinary actions; requires ultrasound that is reviewed with patient; specifies who must perform required duties; requires written certification when patient declines review; provides exemptions; revises printed materials requirements; revises parental notice provisions; requires appointment of guardian ad litem for minor petitioning for waiver, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (386098) by Senator Webster on April 24, 2008

SB 2400 (SO) by Senator Webster and others-

Abortion; Requires that an ultrasound be performed on any woman obtaining an abortion and that the woman be allowed to view the live ultrasound images. Provides that live ultrasound images must be reviewed and explained to the woman prior to her giving informed consent to having an abortion procedure performed. Provides an exemption from the requirement to view the ultrasound for women who are victims of rape, incest, domestic violence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and with pending amendments: #1 (445744) by Senators Bennett, Rich, King, Dockery, Deutch, Margolis, and Joyner; #2 (767380) by Senator Webster; #3 (343562) by Senators Bennett, Rich, Deutch, Margolis Dockery, Joyner, and King; #4 (856752) by Senator Webster; and #4a (621152) by Senator Webster on April 24, 2008

CS/CS/SB 222 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation, Senator Wise and others—

License Plates/County/State Motto/Sunshine State; Requires counties to issue license plates that have the name of the county in which the plate is sold and the state motto or the words "Sunshine State" printed on the plate, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

SB 230 (SO) by Senator Baker-

State Symbol/Florida Cracker Horse (Marshtackie);

Designates the Florida Cracker Horse (Marshtackie) as the official state horse. Provides for repeal on July 1, 2018, unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature before that date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture and withdrawn from the Committee on Governmental Operations

SB 432 (SO) by Senator Bennett and others—

Artificial Reefs/Placement of Vessels; Authorizes the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) to plan, establish, and administer the Florida Ships-2-Reefs Program, a statewide matching grant program, for the securing and placing of United States Maritime Administration and United States Navy decommissioned vessels in state or federal waters seaward of the state to serve as artificial reefs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

School Breakfast Programs; Requires school breakfast programs in middle and high schools. Specifies requirements for setting prices of breakfast meals. Requires district school boards to consider policies for the provision of universal-free school breakfast meals in certain schools. Requires the information to be communicated to students and parents. Clarifies the allocation of funds for school breakfast programs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and withdrawn from the Committee on Health Policy and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 1670 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Commerce, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Gaetz and others—

Early Learning; Cites this act as the "Success in Early Learning Act." Authorizes the use of telecommunication methods in conducting early learning coalition board meetings. Provides additional criminal offenses for screening child care personnel. Requires the DOE to assist school districts, charter schools, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, and certain private schools and providers in developing policies and procedures, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2532 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Lynn—

Child Custody and Support; Provides a directive to the Division of Statutory Revision to retitle "Dissolution of Marriage; Support; Custody" as "Dissolution of Marriage; Support; Time-sharing." Revises provisions relating to a presumption of good faith for psychologists making specified determinations. Provides for orders of temporary support for children whose time-sharing is temporarily modified due to a parent's military service, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably, with seven amendments and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 2574 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Fasano—

Pub. Rec./Victim of Sexual Violence; Expands an exemption from public records requirements for certain records and time sheets submitted to an agency to include those submitted by an employee who is a victim of sexual violence. Extends future legislative review and repeal. Revises a statement of public necessity to conform, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Operations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 2700 (2R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations, Higher Education and Senator Wise—

Students With Disabilities; Amends provisions relating to charter schools, the John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, definitions, and special high school graduation requirements. Revises the terminology used to identify students with certain disabilities. Authorizes the State Board of Education to adopt rules relating to the eligibility of certain children with disabilities for admission to special programs &related services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 2762 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Operations, Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Dockery and others—

Confidential Records of Children/Access; Requires that the case file of a child under the supervision or in the custody of the Department of Children and Family Services be maintained in a complete and accurate manner. Specifies who has access to the case file and the records in the file. Requires that the department release information in a manner and setting that is appropriate to the child's age and maturity and the nature of the information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

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
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
