BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Energy Conservation; Requires a court to conduct a hearing and issue a final judgment on a petition for a taking within specified times after a utility's request for such hearing. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan. Requires that the traffic-circulation element incorporate transportation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Creates the "Florida Energy Conservation and Sustainable Buildings Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008, further amended on April 17, 2008

CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 560 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Regulated Industries, Community Affairs and Senator Constantine—

Building Code Standards; Revises provisions authorizing the use of solar collectors and other energy devices. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan to include energy-efficient land use patterns and greenhouse gas reduction strategies. Requires the installation of carbon monoxide detectors in certain new hospitals, hospice and nursing home facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 1300 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Saunders—

Seagrass Scarring/Illegally Taken Wildlife; Provides that it is a civil infraction to operate a vessel outside a marked channel in a manner that causes seagrass scarring. Amends a specified provision relating to the disposition of illegally taken wildlife and provides for the disposition of such wildlife. Creates a specified provision relating to photographs of illegally taken wildlife. Provides for the admission of photographs as evidentiary materials, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

Compare to **CS/HB 7059 (HC)** in the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Judiciary, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 318 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Constantine—

Exceptional Students with Disabilities; Requires the Department of Children and Family Services, the Agency for Health Care Administration, and residential facilities licensed by the Agency for Persons with Disabilities to notify a school district under certain circumstances. Requires the review of a student's individual educational plan. Requires the DOE, in consultation with specified agencies, to develop procedures for the placement of students in residential care facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 739 (3R) by the Healthcare Council, Representative Ambler and others—

Guardian Advocates/Developmentally Disabled; Requires court to conduct determination of incapacity of persons with developmental disabilities & appointment of guardian advocates in separate proceedings; revises conditions relating to venue for appointment of guardian advocates; provides that guardian advocate need not be represented by attorney unless required by court or guardian advocate is delegated certain rights regarding property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 688 (SUB)** (Crist) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 137 (3R) by the Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council and Representative Lopez-Cantera—

Operating a Motor Vehicle; Creates additional offenses regarding motor vehicle operation; requires operator of motorcycle or moped to maintain both wheels on ground at all times; requires that license tag of motorcycle or moped be affixed horizontally; provides additional penalties for certain offenses; provides for specified fine & revocation of person's privilege to operate motor vehicle. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 802 (SUB)** (Garcia) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 996 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Higher Education, Regulated Industries and Senator Wise—

Cosmetology; Redefines "cosmetology" to include specified services and exclude artificial nails and use of certain skin treatments. Authorizes licensure for cosmetologists, hair stylists, estheticians, and nail technicians. Specifies that only the Board of Cosmetology may review, evaluate, and approve required course and text. Requires the board to adopt rules relating to protection of health of clients, nail technicians, and estheticians, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 743 (3R) by the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Lopez-Cantera and others—

Mortgage Fraud; Requires law enforcement agencies to notify property appraisers of incidents of mortgage fraud; authorizes property appraisers to adjust property assessments; requires property appraisers to reassess specified properties; provides increased penalty for specified types of mortgage fraud. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1116 (SUB)** (Margolis) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 799 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Adams and others—

Theft of Copper or Other Nonferrous Metals; Prohibits knowingly & intentionally taking copper or other nonferrous metal from utility or communications services provider causing damage to facilities of utility or communications services provider or interrupting or interfering with utility or communications services. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1384 (SUB)** (Dean) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 623 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Kendrick and others—

School Food Service Programs; Requires school breakfast programs in middle & high schools; specifies requirements for setting prices of breakfast meals; requires district school boards to consider policies for provision of universal-free school breakfast meals in certain schools; clarifies allocation of funds for school breakfast programs; directs OPPAGA to submit report on school district food service programs. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1458 (SUB)** (Wise), read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

CS/SB 1492 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Margolis—

Discretionary Surtax on Documents; Extends a future repeal date of provisions authorizes counties to levy a discretionary surtax on documents. Limits the percentage of surtax revenues that may be used for administrative costs. Expands requirements for counties levying the discretionary surtax to include a housing plan, an affordable housing element, and annual reporting requirements. Revises criteria determining liability for payment of the tax, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 1459 (HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs, Finance and Tax, and General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 1604 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Designations; Designates various roads, highways, boulevards, and parkways. Designates a building, a bridge, and a state forest. Authorizes certain alterations of Old Cutler Road in the Village of Palmetto Bay, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 1427 (3R) by the Environment & Natural Resources Council and Representative Mayfield—

Beach Management; Provides requirements for quality & quantity of dredged sand placed on certain beaches; requires estimation of requisite quantity of beach-quality sand by DEP; applies requirements for dredging; provides requirements for certain inlet management projects & activities; requires DEP to establish funding priorities for certain inlet management projects & activities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1672 (SUB)** (Jones) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/SB 1954 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Rich—

Developmental Disabilities; Revises the term "developmental disabilities institution" to be known as a "developmental disabilities center." Revises provisions regarding background screening of direct service providers. Provides additional grounds for denying, suspending, or revoking a license, or imposing a fine against a provider serving clients of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 28, 2008

Compare to **HB 7075 (HC)** in the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

HB 961 (3R) by Representative Machek-

Cleanup of Sites Contaminated by Petroleum; Increases public funding for restoration of certain sites contaminated by petroleum; provides criteria for site eligibility for funding; prohibits reimbursements for expenses incurred outside petroleum cleanup preapproved site rehabilitation program administered by DEP; provides requirements concerning preapproved site rehabilitation agreements that govern submittal of invoices to department & payment of subcontractors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **SB 1982 (SUB)** (Baker) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 219 (3R) by the Environment & Natural Resources Council, Representative Domino and others—

Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Act; Designates act "Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Act"; creates direct-support organization for DACS; provides for organization & operation of direct-support organization; provides for purposes; provides membership of board of directors; provides for honorary board members. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1994 (SUB)** (Atwater) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 527 (3R) by the Environment & Natural Resources Council and Representative Williams—

Environmental Site Redevelopment; Defines term "acquired"; provides for financial assistance in certain additional circumstances involving transfer of contaminated property; expands eligibility for site rehabilitation tax credits; provides for application to brownfield site redevelopment solid waste removal costs; provides for application to construction & operation of new health care facilities or health care providers in brownfield sites, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2018 (SUB)** (Posey) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2040 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Judiciary and Senator Geller—

Excise Tax On Documents; Revises criteria determining liability for payment of the tax. Provides requirements and methods for making an election regarding payment of tax under specified circumstances. Provides requirements. Provides for application of the act. etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2080 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Finance and Tax and Senator Haridopolos—

Value Adjustment Boards; Requires that the Department of Revenue develop a uniform policies and procedures manual for use in proceedings before value adjustment boards. Revises the membership of value adjustment boards. Deletes provisions authorizing county attorneys to act as counsel for such boards. Requires that the department provide training for special magistrates and that the department charge tuition for such training, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2532 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Lynn—

Child Custody and Support; Provides a directive to the Division of Statutory Revision to retitle "Dissolution of Marriage; Support; Custody" as "Dissolution of Marriage; Support; Time-sharing." Revises provisions relating to a presumption of good faith for psychologists making specified determinations. Provides for orders of temporary support for children whose time-sharing is temporarily modified due to a parent's military service, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 1203 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Proctor and others—

Educational Opportunity for Military Children; Directs Governor to execute Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; provides requirements relating to student records & enrollment, placement & attendance, & eligibility for graduation; creates interstate commission & specifies powers & duties; requires Secretary of State to furnish enrolled act to member states; authorizes designation of Compact Commissioner & Military Family Education Liaison, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2546 (SUB)** (Storms) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 1141 (3R) by the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Jenne and others—

Pub. Rec./Sexual Violence Victim; Expands exemption from public records requirements for specified records &time sheets submitted to agency relating to domestic violence to include records documenting sexual violence; extends future legislative review & repeal; revises statement of public necessity to conform. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2574 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

CS/HB 1193 (3R) by the Healthcare Council and Representative Rivera—

Maternal and Child Health Programs; Requires DOH, in administering WIC, to compare costs of food items redeemed by certain vendors for purposes of meeting certain federal requirements; prohibits department from discontinuing certain generic products under certain circumstances; restricts funding of program to federal funds; provides for submission of budget amendments by department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 2652 (SUB)** (Garcia) and read the second time on April 28, 2008

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR TUESDAY, APRIL 29, 2008

SB 2400 (SO) by Senator Webster and others-

Abortion; Requires that an ultrasound be performed on any woman obtaining an abortion and that the woman be allowed to view the live ultrasound images. Provides that live ultrasound images must be reviewed and explained to the woman prior to her giving informed consent to having an abortion procedure performed. Provides an exemption from the requirement to view the ultrasound for women who are victims of rape, incest, domestic violence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and with pending amendments: #1 (445744) by Senators Bennett, Rich, King, Dockery, Deutch, Margolis, and Joyner; #2 (767380) by Senator Webster; #3 (343562) by Senators Bennett, Rich, Deutch, Margolis Dockery, Joyner, and King; #4 (856752) by Senator Webster; and #4a (621152) by Senator Webster on April 24, 2008

CS/HB 257 (SO) by the Healthcare Council, Representatives Traviesa, Mayfield and others—

Abortion; Requires third trimester abortions be performed in hospital; provides for disciplinary actions; requires ultrasound that is reviewed with patient; specifies who must perform required duties; requires written certification when patient declines review; provides exemptions; revises printed materials requirements; revises parental notice provisions; requires appointment of guardian ad litem for minor petitioning for waiver, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (386098) by Senator Webster on April 24, 2008

SB 42 (SO) by Senator Hill-

Relief/Rhonda A. Hughes/Escambia County; Provides relief for Rhonda A. Hughes for injuries and damages she sustained as a result of the negligence of an Escambia County emergency medical technician, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended unfavorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 46 (SO) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Lawson—

Relief/Marissa Amora/DCFS; Provides relief for Marissa Amora, a minor, for injuries she sustained as a result of the negligence of employees of the Department of Children and Family Services. Requires a specified legislative budget request. Provides a limitation on attorney's fees, lobbying fees, costs, and other similar expenses relating to the claim, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation

Identical to **CS/CS/HB 443 (HC)** in the Committee on Health Regulation

CS/SB 64 (SO) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Relief/Brian Daiagi/SFWMD; Provides relief for Brian Daiagi for injuries and damages he suffered due to the negligence of the South Florida Water Management District, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation

SB 226 (SO) by Senator Rich and others-

Social Worker Identification; Defines "social worker" to mean any person who has a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree in social work. Prohibits a social worker from conducting clinical social work unless licensed or certified by the Department of Health. Provides requirements, penalties, and exemptions for using the title "social worker." Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and withdrawn from the Committee on Higher Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

Similar to **HB 35 (HC)** in the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

CS/SB 268 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates authority for members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires persons who address a legislative committee to take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance form in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation prior to addressing the committee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 474 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation, Community Affairs and Senator Garcia—

Growth Management; Deletes an exemption from the limitation on the frequency of amendments of comprehensive plans. Requires counties to certify that they have prepared a list of county-owned property appropriate for affordable housing before obtaining certain funding. Extends the date for local governments to adopt plan amendments to implement a financially feasible capital improvements element, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

CS/CS/SB 482 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Garcia and others—

Affordable Housing; Revises purposes for which State Apartment Incentive Loans may be used. Requires that certain funds related to the Community Workforce Housing Innovation Pilot Program be made available for workforce housing for teachers and instructional personnel. Revises provisions related to the administration of certain funds and requirements for distribution of funds in the Local Government Housing Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 644 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Justice and others—

My Safe Florida Home Program/Wind Certification; Requires that wind certification entities meet certain minimum criteria to qualify for selection by the Department of Financial Services. Deletes a provision requiring hurricane mitigation inspectors participating in the program to meet the requirements for a criminal record check by a specified date. Requires insurers to accept as valid certain uniform inspection forms, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 886 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce, Senator Justice and others—

Toxic Substances in Children's Products; Prohibits aperson from using or applying a toxic substance in or on any toy or child care article in this state. Prohibits a person from manufacturing, selling, offering for sale, or distributing a toy or child care article that contains a toxic substance. Provides that a knowing and intentional violation of the act is a felony of the third degree, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 928 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Operations, Commerce and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Economic Development; Requires that the report of the Small Business Regulatory Advisory Council be included in recommendations of the Joint Legislative Sunset Committee. Designates the Florida Small Business Development Center Network as the principal business assistance organization for small businesses in the state. Cites this act as the "Small Business Regulatory Advisory Act." Creates the Small Business Regulatory Advisory Council, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations

Similar to **HB 7109 (HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Governmental Operations

SB 1188 (SO) by Senator Dean and others-

Dating Violence; Cites this act as the "Barwick-Ruschak Act." Revises provisions relating to dating violence incidents to provide requirements for investigations, notice to victims, and reporting similar to those for incidents of domestic violence and to apply certain immunity provisions thereto. Provides that a willful violation of the conditions of pretrial release when the original arrest was for an act of dating violence is a first degree misdemeanor, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

Similar to **HB 313 (HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

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
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
