BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 1544 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Energy Conservation; Requires a court to conduct a hearing and issue a final judgment on a petition for a taking within specified times after a utility's request for such hearing. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan. Requires that the traffic-circulation element incorporate transportation strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Creates the "Florida Energy Conservation and Sustainable Buildings Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2008, further amended on April 17, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 560 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Regulated Industries, Community Affairs and Senator Constantine—

Building Code Standards; Revises provisions authorizing the use of solar collectors and other energy devices. Revises requirements for the future land use element of a local comprehensive plan to include energy-efficient land use patterns and greenhouse gas reduction strategies. Requires the installation of carbon monoxide detectors in certain new hospitals, hospice and nursing home facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2008

CS/SB 1300 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Saunders—

Seagrass Scarring/Illegally Taken Wildlife; Provides that it is a civil infraction to operate a vessel outside a marked channel in a manner that causes seagrass scarring. Amends a specified provision relating to the disposition of illegally taken wildlife and provides for the disposition of such wildlife. Creates a specified provision relating to photographs of illegally taken wildlife. Provides for the admission of photographs as evidentiary materials, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

Compare to **CS/HB 7059 (HC)** in the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Judiciary, and General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 1604 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Designations; Designates various roads, highways, boulevards, and parkways. Designates a building, a bridge, and a state forest. Authorizes certain alterations of Old Cutler Road in the Village of Palmetto Bay, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2008

CS/CS/SB 2080 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Finance and Tax and Senator Haridopolos—

Value Adjustment Boards; Requires that the Department of Revenue develop a uniform policies and procedures manual for use in proceedings before value adjustment boards. Revises the membership of value adjustment boards. Deletes provisions authorizing county attorneys to act as counsel for such boards. Requires that the department provide training for special magistrates and that the department charge tuition for such training, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 28, 2008

SB 2400 (3R) by Senator Webster and others-

Abortion; Requires that an ultrasound be performed on any woman obtaining an abortion and that the woman be allowed to view the live ultrasound images. Provides that live ultrasound images must be reviewed and explained to the woman prior to her giving informed consent to having an abortion procedure performed. Provides an exemption from the requirement to view the ultrasound for women who are victims of rape, incest, domestic violence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 24, 2008

HB 35 (3R) by Representative Richardson and others—

Social Worker Identification; Provides requirements for using title "social worker"; provides penalty; provides exemptions; requires DOH to adopt certain implementing & enforcing rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **SB 226 (SUB)** (Rich) and read the second time on April 29, 2008

CS/SB 268 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Villalobos and others—

Truth in Government Act/Legislature; Eliminates authority for members of a legislative committee to administer certain oaths and affirmations to witnesses. Requires persons who address a legislative committee to take an oath or affirmation of truthfulness. Authorizes the use of a signed appearance card in lieu of an oral oath or affirmation. Provides for penalties for making a false statement after signing the card, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/SB 482 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Garcia and others—

Affordable Housing; Provides for the assessment of property receiving the low-income housing tax credit. Specifies the criteria to be used in arriving at just valuation of a structural improvement, condominium parcel, or cooperative parcel. Revises purposes for which State Apartment Incentive Loans may be used. Revises requirements for distribution of funds in the Local Government Housing Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/SB 644 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Justice and others—

My Safe Florida Home Program/Wind Certification; Requires that wind certification entities meet certain minimum criteria to qualify for selection by the Department of Financial Services. Deletes a provision requiring hurricane mitigation inspectors participating in the program to meet the requirements for a criminal record check by a specified date. Deletes a provision authorizing the department to transfer certain funds to Volunteer Florida Foundation, Inc., for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

Compare to **HB 7103 (HC)** in the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/SB 886 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce, Senator Justice and others—

Toxic Substances in Children's Products; Prohibits a person from using or applying a toxic substance in or on any toy or child care article in this state. Prohibits a person from manufacturing, selling, offering for sale, or distributing a toy or child care article that contains a toxic substance. Provides that a knowing and intentional violation of the act is a felony of the third degree, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

HB 7109 (3R) by the Government Efficiency & Accountability Council and Representative Attkisson—

Small Business Regulatory Relief; Designates Florida Small Business Development Center Network as principal business assistance organization of small businesses in state; cites act "Small Business Regulatory Advisory Council; creates Small Business Regulatory Advisory Council; creates Office of Small Business Advocate; authorizes council to access or request information & assistance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 928 (SUB)** (Diaz de la Portilla) and read the second time on April 29, 2008

HB 313 (3R) by Representative Kelly and others—

Dating Violence; Designates act "Barwick-Ruschak Act"; revises provisions relating to dating violence incidents to provide requirements for investigations, notice to victims, & reporting similar to those for incidents of domestic violence & to apply certain immunity provisions thereto; prohibits certain willful violations of pretrial release conditions; provides for warrantless arrest of violators. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for **SB 1188 (SUB)** (Dean) and read the second time on April 29, 2008

CS/SB 1304 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Saunders—

Fish and Wildlife Conservation; Consolidates chapters 370 and 372, F.S., to create chapter 379, F.S., entitled "Fish and Wildlife Conservation." Renumbers, amends, and repeals sections of such chapters to conform to changes made by this act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1430 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Aronberg—

Sexual Predators/Sexual Offenders/Public Safety; Revises provisions relating to reimbursement of specified costs by sexual predators. Specifies residency distance limitations for persons convicted of certain sexual offenses. Provides additional residency restrictions for certain offenders. Revises provisions relating to probation or community control for sexual predators and sexual offenders, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/CS/HB 653 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Policy & Budget Council, the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Traviesa and others—

Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program; Revises program purposes; revises provisions authorizing total amount of tax credits that may be granted; revises authorized uses of scholarship funds; revises provisions relating to expenditure of contributions; authorizes expenditure of contributions for specified administrative expenses by certain scholarship-funding organizations; provides for annual return of specified eligible contributions to State Treasury; revises scholarship amounts, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1440 (SUB)** (Gaetz), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/SB 1502 (3R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Margolis—

Leased Property for Public Purposes; Exempts counties operating under a home rule charter from a 30-year lease limitation under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time on April 29, 2008

CS/SB 1552 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax, Senator Saunders and others—

Everglades Restoration Bonds; Authorizes the issuance of additional Everglades restoration bonds to implement the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern protection program. Requires the Legislature to analyze the ratio of the state's debt to projected revenues before authorizing issuance of certain bonds. Authorizes the DEP, subject to specific appropriation, to use moneys from the Save Our Everglades TF to fund projects identified in the Keys Wastewater Plan, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

HB 879 (3R) by Representative Kelly and others—

Early Learning; Revises provisions relating to membership of early learning coalitions; authorizes use of telecommunication methods by early learning coalition boards; transfers requirements for establishment of statewide child care resource & referral network by DCFS to AWI; provides for use of early learning coalitions as child care resource & referral agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/CS/SB 1670 (SUB)
(Gaetz), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

HB 7067 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Pickens and others—

Virtual Education; Provides that K-8 virtual schools are public schools & a public school choice option; establishes school district K-8 Virtual School Program; requires school districts to offer program beginning with 2009-2010 school year; provides requirements for contracted providers & requires DOE approval of district programs; requires participation in statewide assessment & accountability programs; provides for funding through FEFP, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1752 (SUB)** (Wise), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/CS/SB 2026 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Ring and others—

Sexual Offenders and Predators; Requires sexual offenders and predators to provide home telephone numbers and any cellular telephone numbers as part of the registration and reregistration process. Specifies what sexual predator and offender information and features must be available on the Internet. Requires that the FDLE be notified of the home telephone number and any cellular telephone number of a juvenile sexual offender released after serving a period of residential commitment, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/HB 887 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Government Efficiency & Accountability Council, Representative Coley and others—

Career Service System; Revises criteria for certain rules & procedures for suspension, reduction in pay, transfer, layoff, demotion, & dismissal of employees in career service; increases amounts of time in which to submit grievances & respond to grievances; revises notice requirements; increases amount of time in which employee must file appeal to Public Employees Relations Commission; revises procedures applicable to appeals filed with commission, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2202 (SUB)** (Dean) and read the second time on April 29, 2008

CS/HB 1313 (3R) by the Schools & Learning Council and Representative Precourt—

Students with Disabilities; Revises terminology used to identify students with certain disabilities; authorizes State Board of Education to adopt rules for eligibility of certain children with disabilities for admission to special programs & related services; revises terminology used to identify postsecondary education students with intellectual, emotional, or behavioral disabilities. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2700 (SUB)** (Wise), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, APRIL 30, 2008

CS/CS/SB 474 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation, Community Affairs and Senator Garcia—

Growth Management; Deletes an exemption from the limitation on the frequency of amendments of comprehensive plans. Requires counties to certify that they have prepared a list of county-owned property appropriate for affordable housing before obtaining certain funding. Extends the date for local governments to adopt plan amendments to implement a financially feasible capital improvements element, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

CS/CS/SB 1914 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Gaetz—

Education; Requires the State Board of Education to periodically review and revise state curriculum standards. Requires that the State Board of Education replace the Sunshine State Standards with the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. Requires policies of each district school board to address an annual review of student education plans. Revises provisions governing application of testing requirements for high school graduation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as accommittee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12

Compare to **CS/HB 7045 (HC)** in the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 and Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1962 (SO) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Health Regulation and Senator

Tax Exemptions/Nonprofit Hospital Laundries; Requires a member of a nonprofit cooperative hospital laundry to immediately divest itself of participation in the cooperative if it loses its nonprofit status. Provides that the provision of emergency services to a nonmember business does not invalidate the certificate of tax exemption, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time, amended, pending amendment #2 (390694) by Senator Haridopolos, and Point of Order having been made by Senator Rich on April 29, 2008

Similar to **CS/HB 1059 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation and Finance and Tax

CS/CS/CS/SB 1978 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Baker—

Department of Transportation; Requires the DOT to establish a transportation methodology to serve as the basis for sustainable development impact assessments. Expands the power of authorities to borrow money to include issuing certain debt obligations. Authorizes a lease agreement of up to 50 years for Alligator Alley. Authorizes the driving of a hybrid, low-emission, or energy-efficient vehicle in a HOV lane regardless of occupancy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time, pending amendment #1 (037438) by Senator Dockery, and with Point of Order having been made by Senator Villalobos

CS/SB 390 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Oelrich and others—

Controlled Substances; Prohibits owning, leasing, renting, or possessing a place, structure, trailer, or other described place with knowledge that it will be used to manufacture, sell, or traffic in a controlled substance. Provides that possession of 25 or more cannabis plants constitutes prima facie evidence of intent to sell or distribute, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

Identical to **CS/HB 173 (HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/CS/SB 652 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations and Senator Lynn—

Workplace Safety; Creates the Florida Public Task Force on Workplace Safety within the Safety Florida Consultation Program at the University of South Florida. Provides the purpose of the task force. Requires that the task force address certain issues concerning workplace safety in the public and private sectors. Provides for staffing. Authorizes the task force to procure information or assistance from any officer or agency of the state, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 694 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce, Senator Aronberg and others—

Caller ID Anti-spoofing Act; Prohibits entering or causing to be entered false information into a telephone caller identification system with the intent to deceive, defraud, or mislead. Provides that a violation is an unlawful trade practice under specified provisions. Provides for enhancement of penalties when a violation is committed during the commission of acriminal offense or when a violation facilitates a criminal offense, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary

Identical to **CS/HB 225 (HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Criminal Justice

CS/SB 790 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Baker and others—

School Safety/Bullying and Harassment; Cites this act as the "Jeffrey Johnston Stand Up for All Students Act." Prohibits bullying and harassment of any student or employee of apublic K-12 educational institution. Requires each school district to adopt a policy prohibiting such bullying and harassment. Provides immunity to certain persons who report an act of bullying or harassment in good faith and in compliance with the policy, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

Similar to **HB 669 (HC)** in the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 and Criminal Justice

CS/CS/SB 992 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance, Senator Fasano and others—

Foreclosure Fraud; Prohibits a foreclosure-rescue consultant from engaging in certain acts or failing to perform contracted services. Requires that all agreements for foreclosure-related rescue services and foreclosure-rescue transactions be in writing. Requires that an equity purchaser verify the homeowner's ability to make payments under a repurchase agreement. Provides price limitations for repurchase transactions, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

Identical to **CS/HB 643 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Judiciary

SB 1022 (SO) by Senator Peaden and others—

Health Flex Plans; Revises eligibility for enrollment in ahealth flex plan. Extends the expiration date of the health flex plan program to July 1, 2013, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

Identical to **HB 461 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1128 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Fasano—

Minors/Distribution of Harmful Material; Provides that it is a third-degree felony for any person to sell, distribute, transmit, advertise, or possess with the intent to sell, distribute, transmit, or advertise certain materials to minors. Provides that ignorance of a minor's age or the minor's consent is not a defense in a prosecution for such a violation if the minor is younger than 12 years of age, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Commerce reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

Similar to **CS/HB 559 (HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice, Commerce, and Judiciary

CS/CS/SB 1208 (SO) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Gaetz—

Water Pollution Control; Provides requirements for basin management action plans. Allows such plans to take into account the benefits of pollutant load reduction achieved by point or nonpoint sources, where appropriate. Authorizes water quality protection programs to include the trading of water quality credits. Specifies that a water quality credit trading pilot project be limited to the Lower St. Johns River Basin as a pilot project, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.


