CS/SB 274 (2R) by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, Senator Dean and others—

POW-MIA Flag/State Parks; Requires the Department of Environmental Protection to purchase and display, year-round, the POW-MIA flag at state parks displaying the United States flag, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 300 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Crist—

Service of Process; Increases the fees charged by the sheriff in civil cases for service of process from \$20 to \$40. Deletes a prohibition on additional fees for alias and pluries documents when service was not affected on the original document in the county of original request by that sheriff. Provides that criminal witness subpoenas and criminal summonses may be served by a special process server appointed by the local sheriff or by a certified process server, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 472 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Senator Dean and others—

DNA Testing; Revises the offenses for which a conviction requires the person convicted to provide biological specimens in specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/SB 622 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Dockery—

Orders of No Contact with Victims of Crimes; Requires that offenders convicted of specified violent offenses, including, but not limited to, arson, sexual battery, robbery, kidnapping, aggravated child abuse, aggravated abuse of an elderly person or disabled adult, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, murder, manslaughter, or aggravated stalking be prohibited from having any contact with the victim for the duration of the sentence imposed, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1606 (2R) by Senator Baker and others—

Veterans Special License Plates; Expands the types of veterans special license plates from which revenues generated from the sale of such plates may be used solely to construct, operate, and maintain domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans. Requires that applications, registrations, and renewal forms for motor vehicles must include language permitting a voluntary contribution of \$1 to state homes for veterans, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, and reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

Concealed Weapon and Firearm Licenses/Revocation; Authorizes the Department of Law Enforcement to disclose data collected from court records to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the purposes of determining whether a license should be revoked or suspended when a previously issued license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm was issued to a licensee who is adjudicated mentally defective or has been committed to a mental institution, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

Underground Utilities/Excavations and Demolitions; Prohibits charging a member operator for the costs or expenses associated with compliance with system procedures by an excavator. Prohibits charging an excavator for the costs or expenses associated with compliance with system procedures by a member operator, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 1426 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Baker and others—

Mobile Homes Sales Tax Reimbursement/Tornadoes; Extends a deadline for certain mobile home owners to file an application for reimbursement of sales taxes paid on mobile homes purchased to replace mobile homes damaged by a tornado. Requires that certain unexpended funds certified forward be used for the purpose of paying the reimbursements, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Relief/Tyler Giblin/Munroe Regional Health System; Provides relief for Tyler Giblin, a minor, by and through Gina and Mark Giblin, parents of Tyler Giblin, for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Munroe Regional Health System, Inc. Provides for the use of funds. Provides limitation on the payment of fees and costs. Provides for payment of unreimbursed medical costs to the Agency for Health Care Administration, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably, with one amendment, by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation

SB 186 (2R) by Senator Alexander and others—

University of South Florida Lakeland; Establishes the University of South Florida Lakeland campus to be operated as a separate organizational and budget entity of the University of South Florida (USF) and to operate under separate accreditation when in the best interest of the campus. Provides for a Campus Board. Provides for administration by a Campus Executive Officer who shall be appointed by, report directly to, and serve at the pleasure of the President of USF, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 370 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Wise and others—

Personal Care Attendant Program; Requires the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to enter into an agreement by a certain date with the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living to administer a program to provide personal care attendants to persons who have severe and chronic disabilities. Names the program the "James Patrick Memorial Work Incentive Personal Attendant Services Program." Revises eligibility requirements for participation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 642 (2R) by Senator Siplin and others—

School/Multiple Birth Siblings/Classroom Placement; Defines "multiple birth siblings" as twins, triplets, quadruplets, or other siblings resulting from a multiple birth. Gives parents the right to request the same or separate classrooms in the same grade level for said siblings. Specifies that the provisions of this bill do not apply to the rights or obligations of exceptional or disabled students or the removal of students pursuant to discipline policies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1648 (2R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Health Regulation and Senator Saunders—

HIV Testing/Informed Consent; Requires that when consent cannot be obtained within the time necessary to conduct an HIV test on an individual and begin prophylactic treatment of the exposed medical personnel, the results of the HIV test shall be documented only in the medical file of the medical personnel and not in the medical file of the patient unless he or she gives written consent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy

CS/SB 2366 (2R) by the Committee on Higher Education and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Medical Faculty Certificates; Authorizes additional universities to employ medical faculty certificateholders. Provides a limitation on the number of certificateholders per university, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

CS/SB 2610 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations and Senator Oelrich—

Pub. Rec./Organ & Tissue Donor Registry; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information in the organ and tissue donor registry which would identify a donor. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the OGSR Act, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations

CS/SB 2618 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Jones—

Public Health; Limits application of the environmental health program of the Department of Health to state institutions for the mentally ill rather than all institutions used for the incarceration of prisoners and inmates. Revises responsibilities of the Institutional Review Board. Repeals the Florida Biomedical and Social Research Act. Repeals provisions relating to standards for compressed air used for recreational diving, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 2630 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Governmental Operations and Senator Oelrich—

Organ and Tissue Donation; Revises provisions for making an organ donation. Adds additional persons to the list of persons who may donate a decedent's body. Provides additional mechanisms for making an anatomical gift including registering with the organ and tissue donor registry. Requires the HSMV to inform the donor registry of instances of making an anatomical gift and of withdrawal of an anatomical gift, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 2692 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Storms and others—

The Teaching of Chemical and Biological Evolution; Cites act as the "Evolution Academic Freedom Act." Provides public school teachers with a right to present scientific information relevant to the full range of views on biological and chemical evolution. Prohibits a teacher from being discriminated against for presenting such information. Prohibits students from being penalized for subscribing to a particular position on evolution, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably

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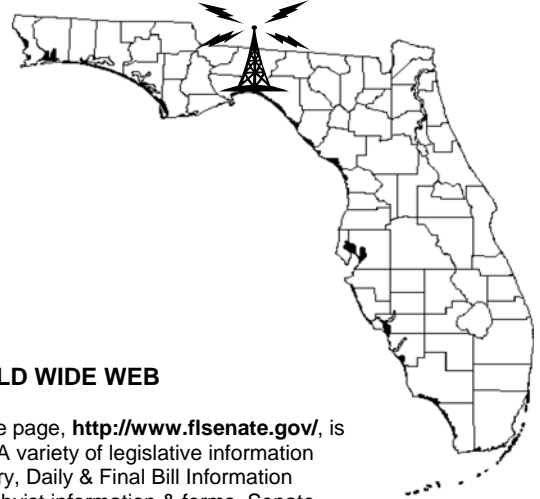
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
