SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 526 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Wise—

Interscholastic Extracurricular Activities; Cites this act as "Erin's Law." Provides that charter and private school students may participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities at a public school under certain conditions. Provides for apublic school student to participate in interscholastic sports at another public school, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Commissioner of Education; Proposes amendments to the State Constitution which will create an elected Commissioner of Education who will be a member of the Cabinet and will be responsible for the supervision of public education as provided by law; requires the Commissioner of Education to hold a bachelor's degree or a higher academic degree; includes the Commissioner of Education with other Cabinet members as a trustee of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund, etc.

HIV and AIDS Educational Requirements; Revises HIV and AIDS educational course requirements for certain employees and clients of the following: hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, mobile surgical facilities, nursing homes, home health agencies, hospices, assisted living facilities, certain facilities for the developmentally disabled, receiving and treatment facilities for the mentally ill, and substance abuse facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Nursing Facilities; Provides that every nursing facility that has a standard license may develop a plan to provide training for certified nursing assistants (CNAs), and that the Agency for Health Care Administration may adopt rules regarding the approval, suspension, or termination of such CNA programs. Modifies the definition of adverse incidents for nursing homes to clarify that events reported to law enforcement "for investigation" are adverse incidents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 696 (3R) by the Committees on Higher Education Appropriations, Higher Education, Senator Oelrich and others—

Community Colleges; Authorizes community college boards of trustees to enter into short-term loans and installments, lease-purchases, and other financing contracts for a term of not more than 5 years, including renewals, extensions, refundings, and to make payments subject to an annual appropriation. Authorizes the trustees to borrow funds and incur long-term debt as specifically provided by the provisions re the workforce education postsecondary student fees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 1652 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Gaetz)—

Charter Schools/Charter Technical Career Centers; Provides that charter technical career centers are subject to certain requirements in the event of a financial emergency. Provides for duties of charter school sponsors and governing boards when charter schools and charter technical career centers experience a financial weakness or a financial emergency. Requires charter schools to disclose the identity of relatives of charter school personnel, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Requires the Department of Education to assist school districts, charter schools, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, and certain private schools and providers in developing policies and procedures governing educator ethics and employment. Requires each district school board to adopt ethical standards for all employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/CS/SB 1906 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Gaetz—

Alternative Credit High School Courses; Establishes a pilot project for awarding high school credit to students enrolled in industry certification programs. Requires that aschool district submit a letter of interest by a specified date in order to participate in the pilot project. Provides for specified courses to be included as alternative credit courses. Requires the DOE to adopt passing minimum scores on approved assessments and maintain a course directory, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Unemployment Compensation Benefits; Authorizes the Agency for Workforce Innovation to develop a system for the payment of benefits by electronic funds transfer. Requires that commodities or services for the system be procured by competitive solicitation or from a state term contract. Requires the agency to adopt rules necessary to administer the system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Provides that, subject to disclosure, an agreement to operate or share ATMs may not prohibit, limit, or restrict the right of owners or operators of ATMs to charge fees or surcharges to certain customers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Removes a requirement for intertrack wagering to be conducted by a quarter horse permitholder. Provides for a grandfather clause, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

SB 1022 (2R) by Senator Peaden and others-

Health Flex Plans; Revises eligibility for enrollment in ahealth flex plan. Extends the expiration date of the health flex plan program to July 1, 2013, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

SB 96 (2R) by Senator Aronberg-

Marital Assets and Liabilities; Defines "barrier to remarriage" to mean, without limitation and not exclusively, any religious, secular, or conscientious restraint or inhibition of which the spouse is aware, which is imposed on the other spouse, and which exists by reason of the spouse's commission or withholding of any voluntary act. Authorizes the court to take into consideration the failure or refusal of one spouse to remove a barrier to the remarriage, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/SB 322 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations, Senator Constantine and others—

Political Subdivision/Officer & Employee Conduct; Specifies standards of conduct for officers and employees of entities serving as the chief administrative officer of political subdivisions. Provides for penalties to be imposed against persons other than lobbyists or public officers and employers. Provides for the Commission on Ethics to report to the Governor violations involving persons other than lobbyists or public officers and employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations

CS/SB 656 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Joyner—

Judicial and Execution Sales of Property; Requires that before a court-ordered sale of property, the mortgagee or lienholder must serve a "Notice Regarding Requested Property Sale" to the property owner or owners which will inform the owner of the possibility of relief through the filing of a bankruptcy petition and warning against purported foreclosure "saving" schemes. Provides for an affirmative defense for failing to provide the notice, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 1036 (2R) by Senator Lawson and others-

Inmate Death Notification; Requires the Department of Corrections to include, in its rules, procedures to provide notice of the death of inmates in state correctional facilities. Prescribes the information to be provided in writing, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 82 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Fasano and others—

Public Library Grants/State Aid; Revises eligibility criteria for multicounty library grants. Revises the determination for and the amount of base grants. Revises eligibility criteria, calculation, and determination for equalization grants. Limits equalization grants and amounts under specified conditions. Federal 2010 Census in Creole; Urges the Congress of the United States to require the United States Census Bureau to make census forms for the United States Decennial Census of 2010 available in the Creole language to provide for optimal accessibility by the Haitian population of Florida and to prepare the census forms in a manner that will allow a respondent to indicate whether he or she is a Haitian national or of Haitian descent. etc.

CS/SB 1070 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator King—

Intergovernmental Cooperation; Authorizes parties to an interlocal agreement to provide for the use or maintenance of facilities or equipment. Authorizes district school boards to perform certain functions by means of an interlocal agreement. Provides for the use of school buses for additional public purposes. Provides for reimbursement and indemnification, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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
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
