## CS/SB 1740 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

Water Protection & Sustainability Program TF/DEP;

Re-creates the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund within the DEP without modification. Abrogates provisions relating to the termination of the trust fund, to conform. Provides for the distribution of funds in said trust fund for the 2009-2010 fiscal year. Delays the expiration of certain provisions relating to such fund. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

## CS/SB 1744 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

**Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services;** Requires a permit for weights and measures instruments or devices used commercially or tested by the department. Provides for maximum permit fees based on the number and capacity of such instruments or devices. Provides for the suspension or revocation of permits. Authorizes the department to take certain actions and impose penalties for unpermitted use, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, reports the committee substitute favorably

### CS/SB 1748 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Baker—

**Department of Revenue;** Requires county property appraisers, tax collectors, clerks of the circuit court, and value adjustment boards to bear the expense of reproducing forms prescribed by the DOR to administer and collect ad valorem taxes. Revises the priority order against which payments by a taxpayer apply to amounts owed to the DOR. Requires any taxpayer who does not electronically file a certain tax return to pay a specified fee, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Terminates the DUI Coordination Programs TF within the HSMV. Transfers the current balances in and revenues of the trust fund to the Highway Safety Operating TF within the HSMV. Increases the fee for a copy of a crash report provided by a certified traffic records center. Increases the service charge relating to the suspension of a driver's license. Increases the fee relating to an application for a certificate of title, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/SB 1786 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and Senator Fasano—

**Comprehensive Plan Amendments;** Establishes a transmittal fee for proposed comprehensive plan amendments sent to the state land planning agency. Provides an exception. Provides that a local government is not limited in passing along the fee associated with plan-amendment review to certain entities. Requires the state land planning agency to deposit all fees collected into the Operating Trust Fund within the DCA, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

**State Employees;** Provides for the resolution of economic collective bargaining issues at impasse between the State of Florida and certified bargaining units of state employees. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/SB 1800 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

**State Group Insurance Program;** Provides the state's monthly contribution to an employee's health savings account for the 2009-2010 fiscal year. Deletes a provision that requires that health savings accounts be administered in accordance with the federal requirements and limitations of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/SB 1802 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

**Retirement;** Revises the payroll contribution rates for the membership classes of the Florida Retirement System for the state fiscal years effective July 1, 2009, and July 1, 2010. Provides a declaration of important state interest. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

**State-owned Real Property;** Requires the state to offer to lease state-owned buildings or lands to state agencies and universities before being offered for sale or lease to others. Requires that an agency seeking to lease a privately owned building or land receive a determination from the DMS that the lease serves the best interests of the state. Requires the DMS to create and maintain a database of state-owned property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/SB 1806 (SO) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

**Service Charge on Income of Trust Funds;** Increases the service charge on income of a revenue nature deposited into certain trust funds. Applies the increased service charge to service charges deposited into the General Revenue Fund on or after a certain date. Increases surcharge on income of a trust fund for income relating to marketing orders. Increases the service charge on income to the General Inspection Trust Fund of the DOACS, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/CS/SB 1840 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Finance and Tax, Senator Deutch and others—

**Protecting Health/Surcharge on Tobacco Products;** Levies a surcharge on cigarettes equivalent to \$1 per standard pack. Requires that revenue from the surcharge to be deposited into the Health Care Trust Fund within the AHCA. Provides enhanced penalties for the sale or possession of any quantity of counterfeit cigarettes. Levies a surcharge on tobacco products other than cigarettes and other tobacco products, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

### CS/CS/SB 1958 (2R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Judiciary and Senator Gelber—

Provides an additional limitation on terms of a trust prevailing over provisions of the Florida Trust Code. Authorizes trust instruments to authorize certain persons to designate one or more persons to represent and bind a beneficiary and receive certain information. Authorizes a trustee to delegate investment functions to a cotrustee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

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
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
