SB 1124 (3R) by Senator Altman and others-

Community Residential Homes; Defines the term "planned residential community." Provides that community residential homes that have six or fewer residents located within a planned residential community are not required to obtain local government approval regardless of their proximity to each other. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 14, 2009

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS [GPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 2188 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Joyner—

Administrative Procedures; Requires each agency to give notice of public meetings, hearings, and workshops on the agency's website. Requires an agency to ensure that staff be available at a public hearing regarding the proposed rule. Requires that certain materials submitted to the agency between the date of publication of the notice and the end of the final public hearing be considered by the agency and made a part of the record of the rulemaking proceeding, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 14, 2009

CS/SB 414 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Crist—

Conveyance of Bodies Into or Out of the State; Authorizes an accredited or certified entity to convey plastinated bodies into, within, or out of the state for exhibition and educational purposes. Requires that the entity provide prior notification and documentation to the anatomical board. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 16, 2009

CS/SB 672 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Pruitt—

Road and Bridge Designations; Designates the Stan Mayfield Memorial Highway in Indian River and Osceola Counties. Designates the Kenneth H. "Buddy" MacKay and Jim H. Williams Memorial Bridge in Ocala. Designates the Trooper Ronald Gordon Smith Memorial Bridge in Citrus County. Designates the Coach Jermaine D. Hall Memorial Highway in Duval County. Designates Orange Bowl Way in Miami Lakes. Designates the Andrew J. Capeletti Memorial Bridge in Miami-Dade County, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

CS/CS/SB 2700 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Commerce and Senator Gelber—

Secondhand Dealers; Excludes cardio and strength training or conditioning equipment designed primarily for indoor use from the definition of secondhand goods. Provides for registration and recordkeeping. Provides for the tendering of payments. Provides for the inspection of records and business premises by a law enforcement agency. Provides for a holding period. Prohibits certain acts. Provides penalties, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

SB 1480 (SO) by Senator Lawson and others-

Minority Business Recertification; Extends the period for recertification of a minority business with the office. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Commerce, and General Government Appropriations

Similar to **HB 319 (HC)** in the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Commerce, and General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 2666 (SO) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations, Senator Haridopolos and others—

State Construction Management Contracting; Authorizes the DMS to select and contract with construction management entities to assist in the management of state construction projects. Provides that a construction management entity may be required to offer a guaranteed maximum price and aguaranteed completion date under specified circumstances and secure a surety bond. Revises provisions relating to contracting and construction for educational facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 482 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Baker—

Auctioneers and Apprentices; Revises requirements for licensure as an auctioneer, auctioneer apprentice, and auction business. Requires the submission of fingerprints for a criminal records check. Requires that an applicant for a license bear the cost of fingerprinting and a criminal records check. Prohibits reissuance of a license for a specified period following license revocation. Requires the sponsor of an auctioneer apprentice to review the apprentice's records, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committees on Criminal Justice and General Government Appropriations report the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 582 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Baker—

Florida Transportation Revenue Study Commission; Provides legislative findings with respect to the need to preserve investments in transportation infrastructure and reduce congestion. Creates the Florida Transportation Revenue Study Commission for the purpose of studying the state's transportation needs and developing recommendations. Requires the Center for Urban Transportation Research at the University of South Florida to provide staff support to the commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and the Committees on Community Affairs, Finance and Tax, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, report the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 858 (SO) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Garcia—

Driver Licenses/Contribution to Stop Heart Disease; Requires the driver license application form to include language permitting the applicant to make a voluntary contribution to Stop Heart Disease. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 926 (SO) by the Committees on Higher Education Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Altman and others—

Cemeteries; Exempts from provisions governing cemeteries a columbarium consisting of 5 acres or less and located on the main campus of a state university. Requires a university or university direct-support organization that establishes the columbarium to ensure that it is constructed, kept, and maintained in a manner consistent with specified provisions. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Higher Education reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1100 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Transportation and the Committee on Transportation (Gardiner)—

Department of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles; Reenacts and amends specified provisions relating to the establishment of the department. Eliminates an obsolete reference to the Bureau of Motor Vehicle Inspection. Provides for the implementation of a certain litigation settlement. Revises requirements for motorcycle and moped license tags. Provides for issuance of unique license plates for low-speed vehicles and mini trucks, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

SB 1394 (SO) by Senator Oelrich-

Motor Vehicle Registration Applications; Directs the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to include language on each application form for registration and renewal of registration permitting a contribution to Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. Requires the department to transfer contributions collected each month to Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation, Finance and Tax, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

Identical to **HB 687 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Finance and Tax, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 1534 (SO) by the Committee on Finance and Tax, Senator Storms and others—

Money Services Businesses; Requires that money services business keep records of certain transactions. Requires an applicant for a license as a money services business to submit an application that includes a nonrefundable fee for each branch office and for each location of an authorized vendor. Revises terminology relating to license fees for authorized vendors. Conforms terminology. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1640 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—

Public Accountancy; Provides that persons regulated as public accountants by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation under ch. 473, F.S., are exempt from certain requirement. Provides that certain licensees are not subject to specified continuing education requirements for reactivation of a license. Provides that past board members of probable cause panels who hold licenses must be licensed in this state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committee on Higher Education reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2252 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance and Senator Baker—

Professional Liability Claims; Revises requirements for reporting professional liability claims and actions. Provides definitions. Specifies events for which certain reports are required. Requires certain absence of claims submission reports to be filed under certain circumstances. Provides requirements for treatment of reopened claims. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1950 (SO) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Property Insurance; Revises the dates of an insurer's contract year for purposes of calculating the insurer's retention. Requires the State Board of Administration to offer an additional amount of reimbursement coverage to certain insurers that purchased coverage during a certain calendar year. Requires the State Board of Administration to publish a statement of the estimated claims-paying capacity of the Hurricane Catastrophe Fund, etc. Effective Date: 06/01/2009.

CS/CS/SB 456 (SO) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Gaetz and others—

Mental Illness/Psychiatric Examination; Defines the term "electronic means." Requires a law enforcement agency that transports persons to a receiving facility to have a memorandum of understanding with the facility. Requires that custody of a person who is transported to a receiving or treatment facility be relinquished to a responsible person at the facility. Specifies that apsychiatric examination by certain personnel be conducted face-to-face or by electronic means. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 770 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Fasano—

Area Agencies on Aging; Revises provisions relating to the Department of Elderly Affairs. Deletes references to the boards of area agencies on aging. Extends the period of designation as a lead agency. Designates area agencies on aging as nongovernmental not-for-profit corporations. Requires that each area agency on aging, rather than the department, develop request for proposals for a community care for the elderly lead agency, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 892 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Bennett and others—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; Authorizes the Agency for Health Care Administration to license facilities that provide services as an integrated adult mental health crisis stabilization unit and addictions receiving facility. Provides eligibility criteria for treatment services. Requires the Department of Children and Family Services to adopt rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and the Committees on Health Regulation and Health and Human Services Appropriations, report the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1548 (SO) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Senator Joyner and others—

Theft; Increases the minimum amount of value attributed to certain emergency medical equipment and law enforcement equipment for the theft to reach the threshold for a second-degree felony. Authorizes a law enforcement officer who has probable cause to believe that a defendant has committed retail theft to issue a notice to appear in lieu of arresting the defendant under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 278 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Gaetz—

Charter Schools; Provides that a charter technical career center is subject to certain requirements in a financial emergency. Provides for the development of a financial recovery plan, which may be approved by the Commissioner of Education. Provides for duties of a charter school sponsor and governing board if a charter school or charter technical career center experiences a deteriorating financial condition or is in a financial emergency, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1616 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Oelrich—

Career and Adult Education; Renames the Division of Workforce Education within the DOE as the "Division of Career and Adult Education." Revises the membership of the Seaport Security Officer Qualification, Training, and Standards Coordinating Council by replacing the chancellor of the Community College System with the Commissioner of Education. Provides for a standard high school diploma designation for completed industry certifications, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2482 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Wise—

School Improvement and Accountability; Redefines the term "secondary school" to no longer include an elementary school serving students through grade 6 only. Revises provisions relating to accelerated high school graduation. Revises the credits for certain courses required under the 3-year standard college preparatory program beginning with students who enter grade 9 in the 2009-2010 school year, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2538 (SO) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Detert—

Supplemental Educational Services; Requires that each supplemental educational services provider report certain information to the DOE regarding services to public school students in the district by a specified date each year. Requires that the DOE post a uniform survey on its Internet website to be completed online by principals and school districts. Requires that the DOE evaluate each provider based on such information and assign a service designation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as acommittee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 Appropriations

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
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
