## BILLS ON THIRD READING

### CS/SB 2282 (3R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Bennett and others—

**First-responder Services**; Prohibits counties and municipalities from imposing a fee or seeking reimbursement for costs relating to certain first-responder services. Provides exceptions. Defines the term "first responder." Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

### SB 2656 (3R) by Senator Haridopolos—

**Arboriculture**; Creates the "Florida Arborist Licensing Law." Provides powers and duties of the DOACS. Establishes licensure procedures and requirements to practice arboriculture and provide such services. Authorizes DOACS to enforce certain provisions of state law by specified means. Revises a definition to make tropical foliage exempt from regulation under provisions relating to dealers in agricultural products, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2009

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 1241 (HC)** in the Committees on Agriculture, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and General Government Appropriations

# CS/SB 642 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Senator Altman and others—

License Plates; Revises authorized uses of proceeds received from the sale of the United We Stand license plate. Creates a Fraternal Order of Police license plate. Creates an Autism license plate. Creates the Go Green Florida license plate. Creates the Catch Me, Release Me license plate. Creates an Endless Summer license plate. Creates the St. Johns River license plate. Creates a Florida Biodiversity Foundation license plate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2009

# CS/CS/SB 1894 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Judiciary, Senator Bennett and others—

**Surplus Lines Insurers**; Provides for the nonapplication of certain provisions of state law to surplus lines insurance authorized under the Surplus Lines Law. Provides methods of payment for premiums and claims regarding surplus lines contracts issued on or after a specified date. Requires that certain insurers provide a disclosure statement to a claimant under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2009

Similar to **CS/HB 853 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Finance and Tax, General Government Appropriations, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

#### CS/CS/HB 1423 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the General Government Policy Council, Representative Troutman and others—

Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; Increases certain vehicle title certificate & license plate fees; revises basis & specified penalties for certain BUI violations; revises vessel operation & identification card requirements; repeals & revises provisions relating to regulation of vessels & imposition of certain vessel fees by municipalities & counties; revises provisions for waterway navigation, safety, & information markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2536 (SUB)** (Constantine), read the second time and amended, read the third time on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/SB 2614 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Gaetz—

**Health Care**; Repeals provisions relating to a comprehensive nutrition program, healthy lifestyles promotion, and the Healthy Communities, Healthy People Act. Requires the DOH to include in its environmental health program the testing of the air in enclosed ice rinks. Requires certain state agencies to purchase drugs through the statewide purchasing contract administered by the DOH. Revises requirements to be designated as a teaching nursing home, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 27, 2009; and further amended on April 28, 2009

Similar to **CS/HB 1471 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation and Health and Human Services Appropriations

#### CS/CS/SB 2072 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Judiciary, Senator Richter and others—

Workers' Compensation; Repeals specified provision relating to the prohibition against a fee, consideration, or gratuity for an attorney or other person for certain services. Requires that a judge of compensation claims enter an order determining the portion of settlement proceeds to be allocated to child support arrearages. Deletes provisions authorizing said judge to approve alternative attorney's fees under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 28, 2009

# CS/CS/SB 274 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Constantine and others—

Water Resources; Requires the DEP to delineate the springsheds of specified springs. Requires the DEP to adopt spring protection zones by secretarial order and to adopt total maximum daily loads and basin management action plans for spring systems. Provides requirements for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems. Establishes a task force to develop recommendations relating to stormwater management system design, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2009

# CS/CS/SB 2088 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Alexander—

Florida Financial Management Information System; Provides that the Financial Management Information Board is responsible for the system. Establishes the Agency for Enterprise Business Services within the DFS. Establishes the Enterprise Financial Business Operations Council to act in an advisory capacity to the agency. Provides for an Enterprise Financial Business Strategic Plan, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/HB 631 (3R) by the Committee on Civil Justice & Courts Policy (CCJP), Representative Hukill and others—

**Pub. Rec./Estate Inventories and Accountings;** Provides exemptions from public records requirements for specified estate inventories & accountings; requires custodians to disclose specified inventories or accountings to specified persons or by court order; provides retroactive application; provides for review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1400 (SUB)** (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

#### SB 2080 (3R) by Senator Alexander—

West-Central Fla. Water Restoration Action Plan; Provides criteria for the Southwest Florida WMD to meet in implementing the West-Central Florida Water Restoration Action Plan. Requires that the district coordinate with regional water supply authorities and governmental entities to maximize opportunities concerning the efficient expenditure of public funds. Requires that said WMD develop and submit a plan to the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/CS/SB 2104 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Constantine—

**Environmental Protection;** Establishes a date by which land management plans for conservation lands must contain certain outcomes, goals, and elements. Revises provisions relating to the disposition of surplus lands. Requires the DEP to provide notice of site rehabilitation to specified entities and certain property owners. Creates the "Florida Coral Reef Protection Act." Revises provisions of power plants using wind or solar energy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 28, 2009, and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/SB 2158 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Haridopolos—

Pub. Rec./Claims Files and Medical Records; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for specified claims files, medical records that are part of a claims file, information relating to the medical condition or medical status of a claimant, and records pertaining to matters reasonably encompassed in privileged attorney-client communications of the Florida Insurance Guaranty Association. Provides for limited duration of the exemption for claims files, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 29, 2009

## HB 7157 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council and Representative Bogdanoff—

Real Property Used for Conservation Purposes; Provides for full or partial exemption for land dedicated in perpetuity for conservation purposes; exempts certain real property encumbered by conservation easement purchased by federal or state government or by local government; provides special provisions for land consisting of less than 40 acres; provides for assessment of buildings & structures on such lands, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2244 (SUB)** (Altman), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/HB 7031 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Economic Development Policy (EDCA), Representative Carroll and others—

Economic Development; Creates requirements & procedures for economic development incentive application process; provides time periods & requirements for certification for economic development incentive applications; provides duties & responsibilities of Enterprise Florida, Inc., & OTTED; revises county population criteria for loans from Rural Community Development Revolving Loan Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2034 (SUB)** (Garcia), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

### CS/HB 1213 (3R) by the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative A. Gibson and others—

Jacksonville Transportation Authority; Expands authority's scope; revises qualification for membership on governing body; revises authority, powers, rights, & responsibilities of authority to provide for planning, coordinating, developing, financing, refinancing, constructing, owning, leasing, purchasing, operating, maintaining, relocating, equipping, repairing, & managing described transportation projects intended to address needs or concerns in Jacksonville, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **SB 2246 (SUB)** (King), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/HB 7043 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Schenck—

OGSR/Scripps Florida Funding Corporation; Narrows public records exemption for specified information held by Scripps Florida Funding Corp. & public meetings exemption for portions of meetings of board of directors of corporation at which confidential & exempt information is discussed; removes OTTED from public records & public meetings exemptions; clarifies definition of "grantee"; reorganizes & conforms provisions; makes editorial changes & removes superfluous language, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2032 (SUB)** (Garcia) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

### CS/CS/HB 821 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative O'Toole—

Community Development Districts; Provides for application of board of supervisors election time periods to compact, urban, mixed-use districts; authorizes specified property owners to elect district board advisor; provides requirements for district board advisor review & recommendations relating to enforcement of district rules outside district boundaries; requires creation of district board advisor seat after interlocal agreement is entered into, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1602 (SUB)** (Baker) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

# CS/HB 7051 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA) and Representative Ford—

**OGSR/Social Security Numbers;** Provides that social security numbers of current & former agency employees held by employing agency are confidential & exempt from public records requirements; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; requires that agency identify in writing specific federal or state laws governing collection, use, & release of social security numbers & ensure compliance therewith, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1838 (SUB)** (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/SB 1372 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Banking and Insurance, Senator Bennett and others—

Insurance; Cites act as the "Safeguard Our Seniors Act." Expands the definition of "affiliated party" to include certain third-party marketers. Includes family members of insurance agents in a prohibition related to the transaction of life insurance. Expands grounds for discretionary refusal, suspension, or revocation of certain licenses. Authorizes the use of video depositions in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

### CS/SB 746 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Fasano—

**Direct-Support Organizations**; Authorizes the DOEA to create a direct-support organization. Requires the organization to operate under a contract. Provides contract requirements. Requires the Secretary of Elderly Affairs to approve of any transaction or agreement between the department's direct-support organization and any other direct-support organization. Provides that the Capitol Curator may assist in raising funds and making expenditures for the Historic Capitol, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/SB 538 (3R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations, Senator Baker and others—

**Publicly Funded Retirement Programs;** Requires the Trustees of the State Board of Administration to identify and offer at least one terror-free investment product to the Public Employee Optional Retirement Program by a certain date. Redefines the terms "credible service" and "firefighter." Provides that investment caps on foreign securities may only be amended, repealed, or increased by an act of the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/CS/SB 1154 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, Senator King and others—

Energy; Requires that electric utilities meet or exceed specified standards for the production or purchase of clean energy. Authorizes the PSC to allow a utility to recover the costs of converting an existing fossil fuel plant to a biomass plant under certain conditions. Requires the Solar Energy Center to charge testing fees. Directs the Florida Building Commission to make all changes to the building and energy codes necessary to conform to this act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

### CS/CS/HB 611 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Hukill and others—

Public Construction Projects; Increases threshold amount for competitively awarding certain public projects; revises exceptions to requirement that certain public projects be competitively awarded; defines terms "repair" & "maintenance"; requires local governments to provide notice for certain public projects; provides notice requirements; extends notice period for specified public meetings; authorizes governmental entities to consider certain contractors ineligible to bid, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 616 (SUB)** (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

### HB 7119 (3R) by the Education Policy Council and Representative Culp—

**Pub. Rec./Education Records;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for K-12 education records held by agency, public school, center, institution, or other entity that is part of state's education system; expands exemption from public records requirements for records of students in public postsecondary educational institutions to include education records & applicant records, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2374 (SUB)** (Detert) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

CS/CS/CS/CS/HB 425 (3R) by the Full Appropriations Council on General Government &Health Care, the Committees on Government Operations Appropriations (CGHC), the General Government Policy Council, the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Plakon and others—

Department of Business & Professional Regulation; Deletes signature notarization from information that DBPR may require in documents submitted for issuance or renewal of license; authorizes DBPR's representative to appear in criminal proceedings under certain circumstances & provide certain assistance to court; increases penalty DBPR may assess against talent agency that violates certain provisions of law; requires written examination for barbering license, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2262 (SUB)** (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

# CS/HB 1139 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care Regulation Policy (HFPC), Representative Y. Roberson and others—

**Florida Center for Nursing;** Requires Board of Nursing to provide certain information to nurses before they are given opportunity to contribute to funding Florida Center for Nursing at licensure renewal. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2030 (SUB)** (Rich) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

### CS/CS/HB 483 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council, the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representative Grady and others—

**Investor Protection;** Expands jurisdiction of Office of Statewide Prosecution to investigate & prosecute specified additional offenses; revises various provisions of law relating to viatical settlements; exempts specified transactions in viatical settlement investments from specified registration requirements; revises registration requirements; excludes postjudgment interest from payments from fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1126 (SUB)** (Richter) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

# CS/CS/HB 167 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Energy & Utilities Policy (GGPC), Representative Abruzzo and others—

Energy-efficient Appliance Rebate Program; Authorizes Florida Energy & Climate Commission to develop & administer consumer rebate program for specified energy-efficient appliances; authorizes commission to adopt rules; authorizes commission to enter into contracts or memoranda of agreement with other state agencies, public-private partnerships, & other arrangements for specified purposes; provides appropriations; provides requirements for release of appropriation. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 942 (SUB)** (Sobel) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

## HB 7089 (3R) by the Committee on PreK-12 Policy (EPC), Representative Legg and others—

**Exceptional Students;** Revises provisions relating to due process hearings for exceptional students; requires that hearings be conducted by administrative law judge from Division of Administrative Hearings pursuant to contract with DOE; provides that party to hearing related to gifted students may request review by district court of appeal; authorizes district school board to consider change in placement for student who has disability if student violates code of student conduct, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2038 (SUB)** (Detert) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

### CS/HB 895 (3R) by the Committee on PreK-12 Policy (EPC) and Representative K. Roberson—

Pub. Rec./Education Testing/Investigation by DOE; Provides exemption from public records requirements for personally identifiable information or allegations of misconduct obtained or reported in connection with investigation of testing impropriety conducted by DOE; provides that exemption applies until investigation is concluded or becomes inactive; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption under Open Government Sunset Review Act; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1912 (SUB)** (Detert) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

### HB 949 (3R) by Representative Van Zant and others—

Nonrecognition of Foreign Defamation Judgments; Provides that out-of-country foreign judgment need not be recognized in defamation judgment obtained in jurisdiction outside U.S. unless court in this state determines that foreign defamation law provided at least as much protection for freedom of speech & press as in this state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **SB 1066 (SUB)** (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 29, 2009

#### SB 1862 (3R) by Senator Joyner—

Community Corrections Assistance; Adds rehabilitative community reentry programs to the list of programs, services, and facilities that may be funded using community corrections funds. Deletes military-style boot camps from such list. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

# CS/HB 115 (3R) by the Committee on Public Safety & Domestic Security Policy (CCJP), Representative Kiar and others—

Sexual Offenders and Predators; Encourages all public libraries to implement an Internet safety education program for children and adults; requires sexual offenders & predators to provide home telephone numbers & any cellular telephone numbers as part of registration process; corrects references relating to exclusions from sexual offender or predator designation; removes residency requirements in statutes relating to computer pornography involving minor children, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 340 (SUB)** (Ring) and read the second time on April 29, 2009


