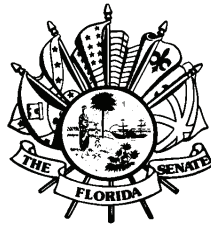

CS/SB 198 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Justice and others—

Firefighter Memorial Flag; Provides for the creation of an official state Firefighter Memorial Flag. Provides for the use of the flag. Provides for the Division of State Fire Marshal of the Department of Financial Services to provide for the creation and distribution of the flag. Provides for the adoption of rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1062 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Commerce and Senator Fasano—

Unemployment Compensation; Redefines the term "employee leasing company" to reflect reporting requirements imposed by the act. Requires an employee leasing company to submit a report regarding its establishments to the Labor Market Statistics Center within the Agency for Workforce Innovation. Provides reporting requirements. Requires the agency to adopt rules. Provides definitions. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

SB 1432 (2R) by Senator Storms—

Insurance Premiums; Provides that certain provisions of state law do not apply to discounts when the premium for the entire policy term is paid at the inception of the term, as long as such discounts meet specified criteria. Prohibits such discounts from being considered related to or components of premium financing. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax

SB 1124 (2R) by Senator Altman and others—

Community Residential Homes; Defines the term "planned residential community." Provides that community residential homes that have six or fewer residents located within a planned residential community are not required to obtain local government approval regardless of their proximity to each other. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

SB 1210 (2R) by the Committee on Agriculture—

Dept. of Citrus/Fl. Government Accountability Act; Reenacts specified provisions relating to the Department of Citrus and the Florida Citrus Commission. Repeals a specified provision relating to the Citrus Stabilization Act of Florida. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

SB 252 (2R) by Senator Constantine and others—

Local Government/Code of Ethics; Specifies standards of conduct for officers and employees of entities serving as the chief administrative officer of a political subdivision. Provides for penalties to be imposed against persons other than lobbyists or public officers and employers for violations of the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees. Provides for the Commission of Ethics to report to the Governor violations involving persons other than lobbyists, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Ethics and Elections, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 160 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Ring—

Sports Coaches/Criminal History Screening; Defines the terms "independent youth athletic team," "minor," and "sports coach." Requires the sanctioning authority of an independent youth athletic team to screen an applicant for sports coach through designated public websites maintained by the FDLE and the United States Department of Justice. Provides that a background screening in compliance with the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act satisfies screening provisions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 408 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Fasano and others—

Clinical Laboratories/Drug Tests/Human Specimens; Deletes the requirement that initial drug tests conducted pursuant to a drug-free workplace program be conducted by a licensed or certified laboratory. Requires clinical laboratories to accept human specimens submitted by advanced registered nurse practitioners. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Commerce reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 552 (2R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Health Regulation and Senator Wise—

Prescribed Pancreatic Enzyme Supplements/Use; Authorizes certain K-12 students to use prescribed pancreatic enzyme supplements under certain circumstances. Requires the State Board of Education to adopt rules. Provides for indemnification. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/SB 620 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Oelrich—

Health Facilities; Redefines the term "health facility" for the purpose of allowing additional types of health facilities to receive assistance from a health facilities authority. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 702 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Gaetz—

Health Care Access; Expands the membership of the board of directors of the Florida Healthy Kids Corporation. Specifies certain provider arrangement contract prohibitions or restrictions. Prohibits prepaid limited health service organizations from specifying certain contract continuation or renewal conditions. Provides for application to HMOs of the prohibition against specifying certain contract continuation or renewal conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 766 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Regulation and Senator Oelrich—

Anatomical Gifts; Revises the list of donees that may accept anatomical gifts and the purposes for which such gifts may be used. Revises provisions relating to a donor's amendment or revocation of an anatomical gift. Revises provisions relating to a donee's use of an anatomical gift at the time of the donor's death. Provides that the laws of this state govern the interpretation of a valid document of gift, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 1018 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Joyner—

Guardians Ad Litem; Authorizes a person certified by a not-for-profit legal aid organization to serve as a guardian ad litem in a dissolution of marriage proceeding that does not involve child abuse, abandonment, or neglect. Requires that such person undergo a security background investigation and undergo training in a program developed by The Florida Bar. Provides a penalty for failing to disclose a material fact in an application to act as a guardian ad litem. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

SB 1248 (2R) by Senator Wise—

Public K-12 Instructional Materials; Deletes a provision that requires a public school principal to collect 50 to 75 percent of a textbook's purchase price from a student who has lost, destroyed, or damaged a textbook that has been in use for more than 1 year. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/SB 1312 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Fasano—

Sexual Battery; Requires each law enforcement officer who investigates an alleged sexual battery incident to assist the victim in obtaining medical treatment if medical treatment is necessary, a forensic examination, and crisis-intervention services from a certified rape crisis center. Requires the law enforcement officer to immediately notify the victim of the legal rights and remedies available to a victim of sexual battery, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

CS/SB 2188 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Joyner—

Administrative Procedures; Requires each agency to give notice of public meetings, hearings, and workshops on the agency's website. Requires an agency to ensure that persons responsible for preparing a proposed rule be available at a public hearing regarding the proposed rule. Requires that certain materials submitted to the agency on or before the date of the final public hearing be considered by the agency and made a part of the record of the rulemaking proceeding, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

CS/SB 574 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Gaetz—

Prescription Drugs/Purchase; Deletes provisions requiring a health care clinic establishment permit for the purchase of certain prescription drugs. Authorizes certain establishments to possess prescription drugs. Establishes criteria for certain business entities to purchase and possess prescription drugs. Assigns responsibilities to a medical director who acts as the qualifying practitioner of a licensed health care clinic, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

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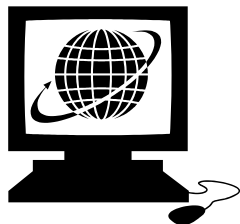
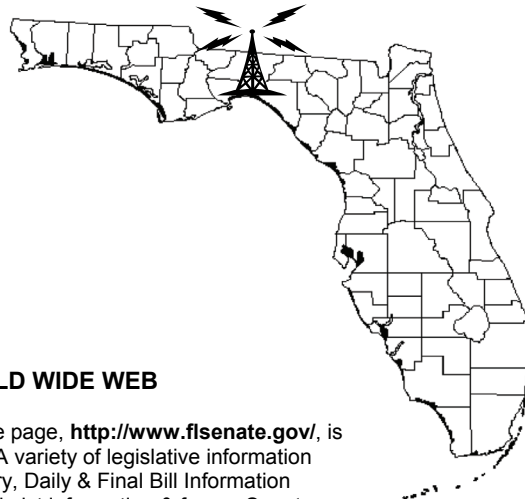
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
