Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; Increases certain vehicle title certificate & license plate fees; revises basis & specified penalties for certain BUI violations; revises vessel operation & identification card requirements; repeals & revises provisions relating to regulation of vessels & imposition of certain vessel fees by municipalities & counties; revises provisions for waterway navigation, safety, & information markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 2536 (SUB)** (Constantine), read the second time and amended, read the third time on April 29, 2009

HB 387 (3R) by Representative Rivera—

Medical Faculty Certificates; Increases maximum number of medical faculty certificates issued to faculty at certain institutions. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **SB 1136 (SUB)** (Gelber) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/CS/HB 439 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committees on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Roads, Bridges, & Ports Policy (EDCA), Representative Reagan and others—

Uniform Traffic Control; Creates Mark Wandall Traffic Safety Program to be administered by DOT; provides for counties & municipalities to enforce traffic control signals using traffic infraction detectors; requires annual report from counties & municipalities to department on use of traffic infraction detectors; provides for preexisting equipment; provides for allocation of portion of fine proceeds to trauma centers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/CS/CS/SB 2004 (SUB)** (Altman), read the second time on April 28, 2009, and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/SB 2276 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Oelrich—

DNA Database; Provides a phase-in schedule whereby persons arrested for specified felony offenses will be required to provide DNA samples to the FDLE. Provides for a statewide automated personal identification system capable of classifying, matching, and storing analyses of DNA and other data. Authorizes the FDLE to adopt rules related to the implementation of the removal of DNA analyses and samples from the statewide DNA database, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/SB 2198 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Haridopolos—

Tobacco Settlement Agreements; Expresses legislative intent to amend specified provision relating to appeal bond requirements for certain cigarette manufacturers. Expresses legislative intent relating to security necessary to stay execution of judgments in actions by certain former class action members, the form of the security, the level of appeals to which the security is applicable, the amount of the security based on the number of appeals, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

SB 166 (3R) by Senator Ring—

Pub. Rec./Donors' Identification/Public Buildings; Creates an exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned building or facility if the donor desires to remain anonymous. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act. Provides a statement of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/SJR 532 (3R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Lynn—

Property Tax Limit/Additional Homestead Exemption; The State Constitution generally limits the maximum annual increase in the assessed value of nonhomestead property to 10 percent annually. This proposed amendment reduces the maximum annual increase in the assessed values of those properties to 5 percent annually. This amendment also requires the Legislature to provide an additional homestead exemption for persons who have not owned a principal residence during the preceding 8 years, etc.

CS/SB 784 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Siplin—

Job Opportunities for Youth; Provides legislative intent to support statewide vocational training and placement provided to at-risk youth through the Jobs for Florida's Graduates program. Requires that a proposal for funding a statewide summer program for youth employment be submitted to the Florida Endowment Foundation for Florida's Graduates. Provides criteria concerning the proposal. Requires a report to the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/HB 479 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Governmental Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Schenck and others—

Retirement; Revises provisions relating to participation in FRS; provides requirements & restrictions on use of promotional materials; excludes participation of certain persons &entities; revises provisions relating to receiving credit for past or prior service; revises provisions relating to retirement benefits; deletes restriction on reemployment of certain personnel by Florida School for Deaf & Blind, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1182 (SUB)** (Fasano), read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/HB 521 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Lopez-Cantera and others—

Ad Valorem Tax Assessment Challenges; Revises burden of proof requirements in taxpayer challenges to ad valorem tax assessments of value; requires property appraisers to prove compliance with specified laws & appraisal practices; provides presumption of correctness under specified circumstances; provides taxpayer burden of proof requirements; deletes provisions relating to presumption of correctness of assessment by property appraiser, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 1006 (SUB)** (Fasano), read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/HB 635 (3R) by the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Scionti and others—

Military Affairs; Clarifies & updates references with respect to courts-martial; revises applicability of provisions with respect to immunity from penalization for National Guard members ordered into state active duty by employers; requires National Guard members to notify employers of intent to return to work; provides exceptions under which employers are not required to allow such members to return to work, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 206 (SUB)** (Justice) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/HB 685 (3R) by the Economic Development & Community Affairs Policy Council, the Committee on Military & Local Affairs Policy (EDCA), Representative Proctor and others—

Educational Dollars for Duty Program; Revises provisions relating to Educational Dollars for Duty educational assistance program; revises duties of Adjutant General with respect to program; removes duties of BOG & SBE with respect to program; provides for education assistance for members of Florida National Guard who enroll in authorized course of study at specified public or nonpublic institution of higher learning, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **SB 442 (SUB)** (Fasano) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

HB 1021 (3R) by Representative Aubuchon—

Department of Transportation; Requires study of alternatives to Interstate 95 corridor; requires report to Governor, Legislature, & affected metropolitan planning organizations by certain date; provides for counties to incur certain costs related to relocation or removal of certain utility facilities under specified circumstances; defines term "backlog", etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 424 (SUB)** (Gardiner), read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/HB 1171 (3R) by the General Government Policy Council, the Committee on Insurance, Business, & Financial Affairs Policy (GGPC), Representatives Proctor, Wood and others—

Residential Property Insurance; Authorizes certain insurers to use rate in excess of otherwise applicable filed rate; prohibits consideration of certain policies when making specified calculation; preserves authority of OIR to disapprove rates as inadequate or disapprove rate filing for using unlawful rating factor; authorizes OIR to direct insurer to make specified type of rate filing under certain circumstances; requires that certain policies contain specified notice, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 30, 2009

Substituted for **CS/SB 2036 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/CS/SB 2104 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Community Affairs, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Constantine—

Environmental Protection; Establishes a date by which land management plans for conservation lands must contain certain outcomes, goals, and elements. Revises provisions relating to the disposition of surplus lands. Requires the DEP to provide notice of site rehabilitation to specified entities and certain property owners. Creates the "Florida Coral Reef Protection Act." Revises provisions of power plants using wind or solar energy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 28, 2009, and amended on April 29, 2009

CS/HB 1405 (3R) by the Committee on Health Care Services Policy (HFPC), Representative Homan and others—

Influenza Vaccine; Requires child care facilities, family day care homes, & large family child care homes to provide parents with certain information regarding causes, symptoms, & transmission of influenza virus. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for **CS/SB 2296 (SUB)** (Constantine) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/SB 1978 (3R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Diaz de la Portilla and others—

Classroom Expenditures; Requires that school districts spend a minimum percentage of the district general fund on expenditures in the classroom. Requires that the DOE develop a uniform calculation and a common format for district reporting. Requires that school districts publish information regarding classroom expenditures. Requires that the DOE analyze the expenditures of school districts that fail to meet required classroom expenditure levels, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/SB 1380 (3R) by the Committee on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, Senator King and others—

Solar Energy; Requires the Solar Energy Center to charge testing fees. Provides that if a specified commissioner of the Florida Energy and Climate Commission is not confirmed during the 2009 Regular Session or the 2010 Regular Session, the commissioner's appointment shall be extended until May 1, 2010, except for any member who, during that time, the Senate expressly refuses to confirm, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/SB 1122 (3R) by the Committee on Health Regulation, Senator Gaetz and others—

Health Insurance/Payment of Benefits/Claims Forms; Requires that insurer make payment to designated provider of services whenever an insured, using any health insurance claim form, specifically authorizes payment of benefits directly to any recognized hospital, licensed ambulance provider, physician, dentist, or other person who provided services in accordance with provisions of the policy. Provides that insurance contract may not prohibit payment of benefits directly to such providers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2009

CS/CS/SB 2658 (3R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Health Regulation and Senator Baker—

Fraud and Abuse in State-funded Programs; Designates Miami-Dade County as a health care fraud area of special concern for certain purposes. Provides additional licensure requirements for home health agencies, home medical equipment providers, and health care clinics. Requires the posting of a surety bond in a specified minimum amount under certain circumstances. Provides limitations on the licensure of home health agencies in certain counties. Provides an exception, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 1487 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation, Criminal Justice, and Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/SB 910 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Wilson—

Criminal Justice; Cites this act as the "Keep Florida Working Act." Requires state agencies and regulatory boards to prepare reports that identify and evaluate restrictions on licensing and employment. Prohibits state agencies from denying an application for a license, permit, certificate, or employment based on a person's lack of civil rights. Requires an employer to review the results of a criminal background investigation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/CS/SB 682 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Regulated Industries and Senator Fasano—

Government Reorganization; Transfers by a type II transfer the Bureau of Onsite Sewage from the DOH to the DEP. Creates the Division of Service Operations of the DBPR. Nullifies a provision of another bill which increases the threshold value of certain equipment for construction projects below which a contractor working with such equipment need not be a licensed engineer, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2009

CS/SB 254 (3R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Siplin and others—

School Food Service Programs; Creates the Florida Farm Fresh Schools Program within the Department of Education. Requires the department to work with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to recommend policies and rules to the State Board of Education relating to school food services which encourage schools and school districts in this state to buy fresh and local food, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time on April 30, 2009

CS/HJR 833 (3R) by the Finance & Tax Council, Representative Horner and others—

Homestead Ad Valorem Tax Credit/Deployed Military; Proposes amendment to s. 3, Art. VII & creation of s. 31, Art. XII of State Constitution to require Legislature to provide additional property tax exemption by law for members of U.S. military or its reserves, U.S. Coast Guard or its reserves, or Florida National Guard who receive homestead exemption & were deployed in previous year on active duty outside continental US, Alaska, or Hawaii in support of military operations, etc.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SJR 1302 (SUB)** (Gardiner) and read the second time on April 30, 2009

SB 2656 (3R) by Senator Haridopolos—

Arboriculture; Creates the "Florida Arborist Licensing Law." Provides powers and duties of the DOACS. Establishes licensure procedures and requirements to practice arboriculture and provide such services. Authorizes DOACS to enforce certain provisions of state law by specified means. Revises a definition to make tropical foliage exempt from regulation under provisions relating to dealers in agricultural products, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 23, 2009

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 1241 (HC)** in the Committees on Agriculture, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1894 (3R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Judiciary, Senator Bennett and others—

Surplus Lines Insurers; Provides for the nonapplication of certain provisions of state law to surplus lines insurance authorized under the Surplus Lines Law. Provides methods of payment for premiums and claims regarding surplus lines contracts issued on or after a specified date. Requires that certain insurers provide a disclosure statement to a claimant under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2009

Similar to **CS/HB 853 (HC)** in the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Finance and Tax, General Government Appropriations, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 642 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Senator Altman and others—

License Plates; Revises authorized uses of proceeds received from the sale of the United We Stand license plate. Creates a Fraternal Order of Police license plate. Creates an Autism license plate. Creates the Go Green Florida license plate. Creates the Catch Me, Release Me license plate. Creates an Endless Summer license plate. Creates the St. Johns River license plate. Creates a Florida Biodiversity Foundation license plate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and amended on April 24, 2009

CS/CS/SB 274 (3R) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Constantine and others—

Water Resources; Requires the DEP to delineate the springsheds of specified springs. Requires the DEP to adopt spring protection zones by secretarial order and to adopt total maximum daily loads and basin management action plans for spring systems. Provides requirements for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems. Establishes a task force to develop recommendations relating to stormwater management system design, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009 except as otherwise provided.

Read the second time and amended on April 28, 2009; Read the third time and with pending amendment #1 (barcode 589956) by Senator Lawson on April 30, 2009

SB 338 (SO) by Senator Wilson-

Kidcare Outreach Program Study/Uninsured Children;

Requires the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to perform a study of the outreach efforts of the Kidcare program. Provides requirements for the study. Requires a report to the Legislature by a specified date. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation and Health and Human Services Appropriations, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

Similar to **HB 807 (HC)** in the Committees on Health Regulation, Health and Human Services Appropriations, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 906 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Smith—

Motor Vehicle Title Transfer; Revises provisions for limitation of liability for the operation of a motor vehicle that has been sold or transferred. Requires an owner or coowner who has made a sale or transfer of a motor vehicle to notify the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. Provides that failure to obtain the identification card number on a derelict vehicle certificate application is a third-degree felony, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 880 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries, Senator Fasano and others—

Community Associations; Provides for the application of certain amendments to a declaration of condominium to certain unit owners. Provides penalties for any person who knowingly or intentionally defaces or destroys certain records of an association with the intent to harm the association or any of its members. Limits the amount of certain costs to the unit owner. Revises requirements for the reappointment of certain board members, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (barcode 681964) by Senator King on April 30, 2009

Compare to **CS/CS/CS HB 27 (HC)** in the Committees on Regulated Industries, Community Affairs, and Judiciary

CS/CS/SB 2326 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation, Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities and Senator Ring—

License Plates; Creates a Go Green Florida license plate, a Florida Biodiversity Foundation license plate, a Toomey Foundation for the Natural Sciences license plate, and a Trinity license plate. Establishes an annual fee for the plates. Provides for the distribution of use fees received from the annual sale of such plates. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Read the second time, amended, and with pending amendment #6 (barcode 364522) by Senator Storms on April 28, 2009

Compare to **CS/CS/HB 239 (HC)** in the Committees on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Transportation, and General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2286 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Regulation and Senator Gardiner—

Health Care; Designates Miami-Dade County as a health care fraud area of concern. Allocates certain funds recovered under the Florida False Claims Act to fund rewards for persons who report and provide information relating to Medicaid fraud. Provides for certain out-of-state providers to enroll as Medicaid providers. Removes provisions requiring quality-of-care monitors for nursing facilities in agency district offices, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/CS/HB 55 (SO) by the Finance & Tax Council, the Committee on Economic Development Policy (EDCA), Representative Jenne and others—

Excise Tax on Documents; Imposes tax on consideration for short sale transfers of real property; excludes specified unpaid indebtedness from such consideration; defines term "short sale"; authorizes DOR to adopt rules establishing arm's length criteria for short sale purposes. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 728 (SUB)** (Bennett) and read the second time on April 27, 2009; and Motion to retain on Special Order Calendar having been made (Villalobos) and adopted on April 27, 2009, April 28, 2009, April 29, 2009, and April 30, 2009

SJR 1828 (SO) by Senator Wise and others—

Revision of Class Size Requirements/Public Schools;

Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to require that the class size requirements for public schools shall remain at the current limits but be based on the average number of students at the school level, rather than on the maximum number of students, who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms in specified grades, etc.

Space Industry; Expands the duties of Space Florida to include supporting the development and operation of the Space Transportation Research and Development Institute. Establishes the Space Transportation Research and Development Institute within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. Provides that the institute is a multiuniversity initiative. Provides purposes and duties of the institute, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Higher Education reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1212 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Judiciary, Senators Constantine, Gardiner and others—

Public Transit; Provides definitions relating to commuter rail service, rail corridors, and railroad operation for purposes of the rail program within the Department of Transportation. Revises the time period within which the department must revise the rail system plan and requires a report. Authorizes a county to impose a county surcharge upon the lease or rental of a motor vehicle licensed for hire, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 1308 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Commerce—

Baseball Spring Training Facilities; Amends provisions relating to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development and the distribution of certain tax proceeds. Deletes provisions relating to funding facilities for spring training franchises. Authorizes certain units of local government to apply for certification to receive funds for a facility for a spring training franchise. Provides criteria to competitively evaluate applications for certification, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committees on Community Affairs and Finance and Tax, report the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 1560 (2R) by the Committees on Agriculture, Transportation and Senator Baker—

Specialty License Plates; Revises the annual use fee for the Choose Life license plate. Revises provisions for distribution of such use fees. Provides that up to 10 percent of the annual use fees collected from the United We Stand license plate may be used for certain specified administrative and promotion activities. Creates the Florida Horse Park license plate and the Let's Go Surfing license plate. Establishes an annual use fee for the plates, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/CS/SB 2000 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Commerce and Senator Constantine—

Motor Vehicle Lien Enforcement; Authorizes sheriffs expediting execution of a writ of replevin to recover certain additional expenses. Requires courts to advance certain matters related to prejudgment writs of replevin on the calendar. Revises provisions relating to the transfer and exchange of registration license plates and transfer fees. Provides for a motor vehicle owner or lienholder to obtain the release of a motor vehicle from amotor vehicle repair shop, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

SB 2266 (2R) by Senator Crist-

Vehicles & Vessels/Liens/Recovery, Towing, Storing; Creates certain rights for lienholders. Deletes a return receipt mailing requirement. Clarifies provisions. Deletes a provision that allows a complaint to be filed in the county where the owner resides. Creates a cause of action to determine the rights of the parties after a vehicle or vessel has been sold. Provides for attorney's fees and costs. Provides a right of inspection to lienholders, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation and Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary

SB 2652 (2R) by Senator Fasano-

Pub. Rec./Office of Financial Regulation; Provides apublic records exemption for information obtained by the Office of Financial Regulation from the Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System and Registry which is confidential under federal or other state law. Provides an exemption for credit reports obtained by the office for licensing purposes. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the OGSR Act, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Rules

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, ENVIRONMENT, AND LAND USE [EPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 114 (2R) by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Justice and others—

Environmental Cleanup; Revises contamination notification provisions. Requires individuals responsible for site rehabilitation to provide notice of site rehabilitation to specified entities. Requires the DEP to verify compliance with notice requirements. Requires the DEP to provide specified notice to private K-12 schools and child care facilities. Creates the Petroleum Restoration Program Advisory Board, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 868 (2R) by the Committees on Regulated Industries, Agriculture and Senator Dean—

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Revises terminology to modify requirements for supervision provided by certified operators in charge of pest control businesses. Requires minimum food safety standards for producing, harvesting, packing, and repacking tomatoes. Requires the DOACS to maintain certain records relating to marketing orders. Revises standards that a winery must meet to qualify as a certified Florida Farm Winery, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committees on Finance and Tax, and General Government Appropriations

SB 1438 (2R) by Senator Bullard-

Injection Wells; Provides exceptions to requirements of the DEP regarding minimum casing for injection wells used by facilities that have a specified design capacity. Provides requirements for an injection well used as a backup to a primary injection well. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and Health Regulation and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1898 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Environmental Preservation and Conservation and the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation—

Water Management Districts; Reenacts specified provisions relating to the creation of the water management districts, pursuant to the provisions of the Florida Government Accountability Act. Redesignates the Florida Public Service Commission Nominating Council as the "Legislative Nominating Council". Authorizes certain chairs of committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives to submit comments and objections to proposed district budgets, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS [GPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 956 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Alexander—

Elections; Provides for the preemption of certain matters to the state. Expands the list of responsibilities of the Secretary of State when acting in his or her capacity as chief election officer. Requires that certain first-time voters provide identification before election day. Revises the number of years that an initiative petition is valid. Provides circumstances under which an elector is eligible for a provisional ballot, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Governmental Operations

CS/SB 1104 (2R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Storms—

Art in Public Buildings; Repeals specified provision relating to a requirement that a specified portion of appropriations for new construction of state buildings be used for art. Provides for the future reenactment of specified provision and the reversion of the statutory text to that in effect before the repeal. Prohibits expenditures for public art during the interim without prior legislative approval. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1278 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Altman and others—

Children with Disabilities/Prepaid Service Plan; Creates the Prepaid Services for Parents of Children with Developmental Disabilities Study Group to evaluate the creation of a prepaid service plan for children with disabilities. Provides for membership. Provides for administrative support. Provides for the duties of the study group. Provides for per diem and travel expenses for members. Requires the study group to present a final report to the Legislature. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

CS/SB 1604 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Aronberg—

Nursing Services; Requires that hospitals establish nurse staffing collaborative councils. Requires the council to produce annual hospital nurse staffing plans. Requires the chief nurse executive to communicate with the council to ensure appropriate implementation of the nurse staffing plan. Requires that the council conduct a semiannual review of the nurse staffing plan. Requires the nurse staffing plan to be reviewed with the nurse personnel, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB's 1646, SB 1038 (2R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Judiciary, Senators Constantine, Joyner and others—

Foreclosures; (THIS BILL COMBINES S1646 & S1038) Provides that the purchaser of a foreclosed residential dwelling unit may not take possession until a specified period after notifying a tenant of the intent to take possession. Provides requirements for landlords following commencement of a foreclosure action. Creates a pilot program for voluntary mediation between a mortgagor and a mortgagee prior to a foreclosure suit being filed, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 1914 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Detert—

School Districts/Paperwork and Data Reduction; Deletes provisions that require each district school board to reduce paperwork and data collection and report its findings and potential solutions on reducing burdens associated with such collection. Requires that the Commissioner of Education monitor and review the collection of paperwork, data, and reports by school districts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably CS/SB 2272 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Wise—

Regional Professional Development Academies; Provides for regional academies rather than a statewide system of organization. Provides duties of regional professional development academies. Deletes provisions that require academies to meet certain criteria in order to receive start-up funds. Specifies requirements for contracts between district school boards and academies. Requires that income generated from certain activities be shared between the academy and said school board, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2009.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 2248 (2R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Transportation, Senator Hill and others—

Taxation/Public-private Transportation Facilities; Exempts certain public-private transportation facilities from certain specified taxes and special assessments. Excludes certain taxes from such exemption. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means

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
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
