Property Taxation; Tolls the expiration period of a tax certificate and the statute of limitations relating to proceedings involving tax lien certificates or tax deeds during the period of an intervening bankruptcy. Revises, updates, and consolidates provisions of ch. 197, F.S., relating to definitions, tax collectors, lien of taxes, returns and assessments, unpaid or omitted taxes, discounts, interest rates, Department of Revenue responsibilities, tax bills, judicial sales, prepayment of taxes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time and amended on March 23, 2011

CS/SB 444 (3R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Bogdanoff and others—

Scrutinized Companies; Prohibits a state agency or local governmental entity from contracting for goods and services of more than a certain amount with a company that is on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List. Provides for a contract provision that allows for termination of the contract if the company is found to have been placed on such list. Provides a statute of repose. Prohibits a private right of action, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

SB 228 (3R) by Senator Siplin—

Code of Student Conduct; Requires the district school board to include in the code of student conduct adopted by the board an explanation of the responsibilities of each student with regard to appropriate dress and respect for self and others and the role that appropriate dress and respect for self and others has on an orderly learning environment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Read the second time on March 23, 2011

SB 344, 1st Eng. (3R) by Senator Rich—

Animal Cruelty; Provides definitions. Prohibits specified activities with an animal. Prohibits specified related activities. Provides penalties. Provides that the act does not apply to certain husbandry, conformation judging, and veterinary practices. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Read the second time and amended on March 23, 2011

CS/SB 146, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Smith and others—

Criminal Justice; Cites this act as the "Jim King Keep Florida Working Act." Requires state agencies and regulatory boards to prepare reports that identify and evaluate restrictions on licensing and employment for ex-offenders. Prohibits state agencies from denying an application for a license, permit, certificate, or employment based on a person's lack of civil rights. Provides an exception, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 94 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Gaetz—

Blood Establishments; Redefines "blood establishment" and defines "volunteer donor." Prohibits local governments from restricting access to public facilities or infrastructure for certain activities based on whether a blood establishment is operating as a for-profit organization or not-for-profit organization. Authorizes the Department of Legal Affairs to assess a civil penalty against a blood establishment that fails to disclose specified information on the Internet, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation; and the Committees on Community Affairs; Budget Subcommittee on Health and Human Services Appropriations; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 172 (2R) by Senator Bennett—

Security Cameras; Reenacts a specified provision relating to prohibited standards for security cameras. Provides for retroactive operation of the act. Provides for an exception under specified circumstances. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs; Judiciary; and Budget

SB 174 (2R) by Senator Bennett and others—

Growth Management; Reenacts provisions relating to the definition of "urban service area" and "dense urban land area" for purposes of the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act. Reenacts provisions relating to certain required and optional elements of a comprehensive plan, concurrency requirements for transportation facilities, a required notice for a new or increased impact fee, the process for adopting a comprehensive plan or plan amendment, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Budget

SB 176 (2R) by Senator Bennett and others—

Affordable Housing; Reenacts a specified provision relating to the state allocation pool used to confirm private activity bonds. Reenacts a specified provision relating to lands that are owned by a community land trust and used to provide affordable housing. Reenacts a specified provision relating to a tax exemption provided to organizations that provide low-income housing. Reenacts a specified provision relating to a property exemption for affordable housing owned by a nonprofit entity, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Budget

SB 238 (2R) by Senator Altman and others—

Child Safety Devices in Motor Vehicles; Provides child-restraint requirements for children ages 4 through 7 years of age who are less than a specified height. Provides certain exceptions. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" to exclude certain vehicles from such requirements. Provides a grace period. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably by the Committees on Transportation; Criminal Justice; and Budget

SB 410 (2R) by Senator Bennett—

Impact Fees; Reenacts a provision relating to the burden of proof required by the government in an action challenging an impact fee. Provides for retroactive operation of the act. Provides for an exception under specified circumstances. Effective Date: upon becoming a law, and shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2009

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs; Judiciary; and Rules

SB 418 (2R) by Senator Flores—

State Lotteries; Requires each retailer of lottery tickets to provide assistance to any individual who is blind or visually impaired and has requested assistance in filling out his or her lottery ticket. Provides that a retailer or an employee of the retailer is not liable under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

SB 462 (2R) by Senator Latvala and others—

Beverage Law; Exempts performance arts centers from obtaining approval from the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation of volunteer officers or directors of the performing arts center or of changes in such positions. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Regulated Industries; Commerce and Tourism; and Rules

CS/SB 618 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Evers—

Juvenile Justice; Repeals provisions relating to legislative intent for serious or habitual juvenile offenders in the juvenile justice system, definitions of terms for a training school and the serious or habitual juvenile offender program, the serious or habitual juvenile offender program in the juvenile justice system, the intensive residential treatment program for offenders less than 13 year of age, and the designation of persons holding law enforcement certification within the Office of the Inspector General to act as law enforcement officers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committees on Budget Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1100 (2R) by Senator Detert—

Residence of the Clerk of the Circuit Court; Repeals provisions relating to the clerk of the circuit court's place of residence. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

FIRST PUBLICATION ON SECOND READING

SM 358 (2R1) by Senator Evers—

Exercise of Federal Power; Urges the Congress of the United States to honor the provisions of the Constitution of the United States and United States Supreme Court case law which limit the scope and exercise of federal power.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

SB 1630 (2R1) by Senator Lynn—

Traffic Offenses; Repeals provisions which prohibits a motor vehicle coasting on a downgrade. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

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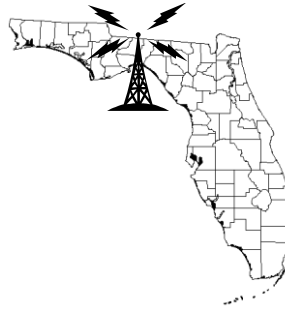
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
