BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, APRIL 27, 2011

CS/CS/SB 830 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Senator Thrasher and others—

Labor and Employment; Prohibits a state agency from deducting from employee wages funds for political activity. Prohibits a county, municipality, or other local governmental entity from deducting from employee wages funds for political activity. Prohibits labor organizations from collecting dues, assessments, fines, or penalties for the purposes of political activity without written authorization. Requires that the labor organization provide notice of such contributions and expenditures, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

*Compare to **CS/HB 1021(HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs; Budget; and Rules*

CS/CS/SB 234 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Criminal Justice, Senator Evers and others—

Firearms; Provides that a person in compliance with the terms of a concealed carry license may openly carry a handgun notwithstanding specified provisions. Allows the Division of Licensing of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to take fingerprints from concealed carry license applicants. Provides that concealed carry licensees shall not be prohibited from carrying or storing a firearm in a vehicle for lawful purposes. Repeals provisions relating to the purchase of rifles and shotguns in contiguous states, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/CS/SB 402 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Criminal Justice, Senator Negron and others—

Regulation of Firearms and Ammunition; Clarifies and reorganizes provisions that preempt to the state the entire field of regulation of firearms. Prohibits the violation of the Legislature's occupation of the whole field of regulation of firearms and ammunition by the enactment or causation of enforcement of any local ordinance or administrative rule or regulation. Provides additional intent of the act. Eliminates provisions authorizing counties to adopt an ordinance requiring a waiting period between the purchase and delivery of a handgun, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/CS/SB 432 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Regulation, Criminal Justice and Senator Evers—

Privacy of Firearm Owners; Provides that a licensed medical care practitioner or health care facility may not record information regarding firearm ownership in a patient's medical record. Provides an exception for relevance of the information to the patient's medical care or safety or the safety of others. Provides that unless the information is relevant to the patient's medical care or safety or the safety of others, inquiries regarding firearm ownership or possession should not be made by licensed health care practitioners or health care facilities, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 155(HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Health Regulation; Judiciary; and Budget*

CS/CS/SB 1524 (SO) by the Committees on Commerce and Tourism, Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities, Senator Simmons and others—

Telecommunications; Creates the "Regulatory Reform Act." Revises legislative intent with respect to the jurisdiction of the Florida Public Service Commission. Repeals provisions relating to price regulation, regulatory methods for small local exchange telecommunications companies, experimental and transitional rates, limited proceedings, procedures for seeking a stay of proceedings, joint rates, tolls, and contracts, rate adjustment orders, intrastate interexchange service contracts, and unlawful charges against consumers, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 1231(HC)** in the Committees on Communications, Energy, and Public Utilities; Commerce and Tourism; and Budget*

CS/SB 998 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Simmons and others—

Property Rights; Redefines the terms "inordinate burden" and "inordinately burdened" as they relate to the Bert J. Harris, Jr., Private Property Rights Protection Act to specify that a moratorium on development in effect for longer than a specified period constitutes an inordinate burden. Revises the time within which a property owner who seeks compensation must present the claim in writing to the head of the governmental entity. Revises the time within which a governmental entity must make a written settlement offer to a claimant, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

*Compare to **CS/CS/HB 701(HC)** in the Committees on Community Affairs; Judiciary; and Budget*

CS/CS/SB 818 (SO) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Health Regulation, Senator Fasano and others—

Controlled Substances; Authorizes certain health care practitioners to complete a continuing education course relating to the prescription drug monitoring program. Creates a felony of the third degree for any person to register or attempt to register a pain-management clinic through misrepresentation or fraud. Revises the list of entities that are not required to register as a pain-management clinic. Requires that the prescription drug monitoring program comply with the minimum requirements of the National All Schedules Prescription Electronic Reporting Act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 1546 (SO) by the Committees on Budget, Higher Education, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Thrasher—

Charter Schools; Requires that the Department of Education provide or arrange for training and technical assistance for charter schools. Provides for the designation of charter schools as high-performing if certain requirements are met. Requires that the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability conduct a study comparing the funding of charter schools to the funding of public schools. Provides requirements for the study. Requires the office to submit its recommendations and findings to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

CS/SM 1654 (SO) by the Committee on Higher Education and Senator Wise—

Educational Programs Beyond the Secondary Level; Notifies the Federal Government of colleges and universities in this state which are authorized to operate educational programs beyond the secondary level.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

CS/SB 1996 (SO) by the Committees on Budget, and Education Pre-K - 12—

Education Law Repeals; Repeals provisions relating to the creation of the Digital Divide Council in the Department of Education. Repeals provisions relating to making false claims of academic degree or title. Repeals provisions relating to the Preteacher and Teacher Education Pilot Programs and the Teacher Education Pilot Programs for High-Achieving Students. Deletes a provision requiring that certain middle school students who earned high school credit in Algebra I take the Algebra I end-of-course assessment during the 2010-2011 school year, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; and Budget Subcommittee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

*Similar to **CS/HB 7087(HC)** in the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; Budget Subcommittee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations; and Budget*

CS/SB 1466 (SO) by the Committee on Budget and Senator Simmons—

Class Size Requirements; Deletes a reference to the State Constitution regarding class size maximums. Requires that class size maximums be satisfied on or before the October student membership survey each year. Requires that the Department of Education identify from the Course Code Directory the core-curricula courses for the purpose of satisfying the maximum class size requirement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; and Budget Subcommittee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

CS/CS/SB 1414 (SO) by the Committees on Budget, Banking and Insurance and Senator Wise—

Health Insurance; Prohibits certain health insurance policies and health maintenance contracts from providing coverage for abortions. Provides that certain restrictions on coverage for abortions apply to certain group health insurance policies issued or delivered outside the state which provide coverage to residents of the state. Provides that certain restrictions on coverage for abortions apply to plans under the Employee Health Care Access Act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

CS/CS/SJR 1538 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Flores—

Abortion/Public Funding/Construction of Rights; Proposes amendments to the State Constitution to generally prohibit public funding of abortions and prohibit the State Constitution from being interpreted to create broader rights to an abortion than those contained in the United States Constitution.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Regulation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 626 (SO) by Senator Thrasher and others—

Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc.; Clarifies provisions relating to references to the corporation known as Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc. Clarifies provisions regarding the purpose of the corporation. Authorizes the corporation to create corporate subsidiaries and affiliates. Provides that Shands Teaching Hospital and Clinics, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Medical Center, Inc., Shands Jacksonville Healthcare, Inc., and any not-for-profit subsidiary of such entities are instrumentalities of the state for purposes of sovereign immunity. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation; Higher Education; and Budget

Compare to CS/CS/HB 395, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Health Regulation; Higher Education; and Budget

CS/CS/CS/SB 408 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Richter and others—

Property and Casualty Insurance; Revises the definition of "losses," relating to the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund, to exclude certain losses. Authorizes an insurer to renegotiate the terms a surplus note issued before a certain date. Revises the amount of surplus funds required for domestic insurers applying for a certificate of authority after a certain date. Authorizes the OIR to reduce the surplus requirement under specified circumstances. Renames the "Citizens Property Insurance Corporation" as the "Taxpayer-Funded Property Insurance Corporation," etc. Effective Date: June 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations; the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1992 (SO) by the Committees on Budget, and Children, Families, and Elder Affairs—

Background Screening; Adds law enforcement officers who have a good moral character to the list of professionals who are not required to be refingerprinted or rescreened. Includes volunteers within the definition of the term "direct service provider" for purposes of background screening. Exempts a volunteer who meets certain criteria and a client's relative or spouse from the screening requirement. Exempts certain licensed professionals and persons screened as a licensure requirement from further screening under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

CS/CS/SB 1150 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Transportation and Senator Latvala—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Specifies that the executive director of the department serves at the pleasure of the Governor and Cabinet. Creates a Division of Motorist Services within the department. Provides that certain traffic citations may not be issued or prosecuted unless a law enforcement officer used an electrical, mechanical, or other speed-calculating device that has been tested and approved, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

**CS/SB 900 (SO) by the Committee on
Transportation and Senator Bennett—**

Specialty License Plates; Provides for the issuance of a Combat Infantry Badge license plate. Provides qualifications and requirements for the plate. Provides for the use of proceeds from the sale of the plate. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the
Committee on Transportation; and the Committee on Budget
reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 650 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated
Industries, Senator Jones and others—**

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local code and ordinance violations to be cited to the responsible party. Prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for a duty or responsibility of the other party. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the
Committee on Regulated Industries; and the Committees on
Community Affairs; and Rules reports the committee substitute
favorably*

SB 652 (SO) by Senator Simmons and others—

Liability of Spaceflight Entities; Saves a provision from future repeal which provides spaceflight entities with immunity from liability for the loss, damage, or death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of spaceflight activities. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Military Affairs,
Space, and Domestic Security; Judiciary; and Rules*

SB 704 (SO) by Senator Sachs and others—

Special Observances/Purple Heart Day; Designates August 7 of each year as "Purple Heart Day." Effective Date: 07/01/2011

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Military Affairs,
Space, and Domestic Security; Governmental Oversight and
Accountability; and Rules*

SB 1632 (SO) by Senator Lynn—

Florida Industrial Development Corporation; Repeals provisions relating to the Florida Industrial Development Corporation. Deletes references to conform to changes made by the act. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Tourism; and Budget*

CS/SB 844 (SO) by the Committee on Budget, Senator Benacquisto and others—

Violations/Probation/Community Control/Widman Act; Creates the "Officer Andrew Widman Act." Authorizes a circuit court judge, after making a certain finding, to issue a warrant for the arrest of a probationer or offender who has violated the terms of probation or community control. Authorizes the court to commit or release the probationer or offender under certain circumstances. Authorizing the court, in determining whether to require or set the amount of bail, to consider the likelihood that the person will be imprisoned for the violation of probation or community control, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Budget

SM 954 (SO) by Senator Flores and others—

Parental Rights Amendment; Urges the Congress of the United States to propose to the states for ratification an amendment to the United States Constitution relating to parental rights.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Judiciary; Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and Governmental Oversight and Accountability

CS/CS/SB 1346 (SO) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Commerce and Tourism, and Commerce and Tourism—

Obsolete References and Programs; Removes an obsolete reference to the Department of Commerce and the Department of Labor and Employment Security. Updates a reference to the Department of Commerce to refer instead to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. Repeals provisions relating to agreements of the Department of Labor and Employment Security with county tax collectors. Repeals provisions relating to child abuse prevention training in the district school system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1196 (SO) by the Committees on Commerce and Tourism, Regulated Industries and Senator Bogdanoff—

Construction Liens; Specifies that a lessor's interest in property is not subject to a construction lien for improvements made by a lessee if certain documents containing specific information and meeting certain criteria are recorded in the official records of the county before the recording of a notice of commencement. Authorizes certain contractors and lienors to demand that a lessor serve verified copies of a lease prohibiting liability for improvements made by a lessee, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism

CS/SCR 4 (SO) by the Committee on Budget and Senator Haridopolos—

Balanced Federal Budget; Urges Congress to call a convention for the purpose of proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States to achieve and maintain a balanced federal budget.

SB 1000 (2R1) by Senator Wise—

Interscholastic and Intrasccholastic Sports; Removes certain provisions relating to a pilot program in which a middle school student or a high school student in a private school may participate in athletics at a public school. Provides for statewide implementation of the program. Requires that the athletic director of each public school maintain the records of students participating in the program. Limits participation in the program to students who are enrolled in non-FHSAA member private schools consisting of a maximum number of students, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; Health Regulation; and Budget

CS/SB 1158 (2R1) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Garcia—

Teaching Agency for Home and Community-based Care; Authorizes the Department of Elderly Affairs to designate a home health agency as a teaching agency for home and community-based care. Establishes criteria for qualification. Authorizes a teaching agency to be affiliated with an academic research university in the state that meets certain criteria. Authorizes a teaching agency to be affiliated with an academic health center, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committees on Health Regulation; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1176 (2R1) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Ring—

High School Athletic Trainers; Revises membership requirements for the Board of Athletic Training. Revises requirements for licensure by examination for athletic trainers. Requires certification requirements for license renewal. Revises continuing education requirements for licensure renewal. Encourages school districts to employ or contract with certified athletic trainers at certain high schools in this state. Requires athletic trainers to be certified by the Board of Certification of the National Athletic Trainers' Association, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1194 (2R1) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Higher Education and Senator Oelrich—

Postsecondary Education; Deletes provisions relating to the use of test scores for assessment of college-level communication and computation skills. Requires the establishment of the Articulation Coordinating Committee and provides its responsibilities. Deletes provisions that exclude students with intellectual disabilities from eligibility for substitute requirements for admission to or graduation from a public postsecondary educational institution. Abrogates the repeal of provisions which created the 21st Century World Class Scholars Program, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 1196 (2R1) by the Committees on Commerce and Tourism, Regulated Industries and Senator Bogdanoff—

Construction Liens; Specifies that a lessor's interest in property is not subject to a construction lien for improvements made by a lessee if certain documents containing specific information and meeting certain criteria are recorded in the official records of the county before the recording of a notice of commencement. Authorizes certain contractors and lienors to demand that a lessor serve verified copies of a lease prohibiting liability for improvements made by a lessee, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism

CS/CS/SB 1206 (2R1) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Negron and others—

Eyewitness Identification; Cites this act as the "Eyewitness Identification Reform Act." Requires state, county, municipal, and other law enforcement agencies that conduct lineups to follow certain specified procedures. Requires the eyewitness to sign an acknowledgement that he or she received the instructions about the lineup procedures from the law enforcement agency. Requires the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to create educational materials and conduct training programs on how to conduct lineups in compliance with the act, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Certificates/Licenses/Health Care Practitioners; Provides for issuance of a temporary license to specified health care practitioners who are spouses of active duty members of the Armed Forces under certain circumstances. Provides for criminal history checks. Provides that certain persons are ineligible for such license. Requires certain temporary licensees to practice under the indirect supervision of other licensees. Names the temporary certificates issued to physicians who practice in areas of critical need after Rear Admiral LeRoy Collins, Jr., etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/SB 1300 (2R1) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Storms—

Juvenile Civil Citations; Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice to encourage and assist in the implementation and improvement of civil citation and similar diversionary programs. Requires that a juvenile civil citation and similar diversion program be established at the local level with the concurrence of the chief judge of the circuit and other designated persons. Authorizes a law enforcement agency, the Department of Juvenile Justice, a juvenile assessment center, the county or municipality, or an entity selected by the county or municipality to operate the civil citation or similar diversion program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committees on Judiciary; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1366 (2R1) by the Committees on Health Regulation, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Child Welfare/Mental Health/Substance Abuse; Requires the DCFS, the DOH, the APD, the AHCA, community-based care lead agencies, managing entities, and agencies that have contracted with monitoring agents to adopt certain revised policies for the administrative monitoring of child welfare service providers, mental health service providers, and substance abuse service providers. Limits the frequency of required administrative, licensure, and programmatic monitoring for mental health service providers and substance abuse service providers that are accredited by specified entities, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/SB 1426 (2R1) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Hays—

Repeal of Health Insurance Provisions; Repeals provisions relating to a requirement that the board of directors of the Florida Health Insurance Plan annually report to the Governor and the Legislature. Deletes a requirement that the Office of Insurance Regulation of the Department of Financial Services annually report to the Governor and the Legislature concerning the Small Employers Access Program. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and the Committees on Health Regulation; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1574 (2R1) by the Committee on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Latvala and others—

Business Enterprise Opportunities/Wartime Veterans; Revises legislative intent. Renames and revises the Florida Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Opportunity Act to expand the vendor preference in state contracting to include certain businesses owned and operated by wartime veterans or veterans of a period of war. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1650 (2R1) by the Committee on Military Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Senator Storms and others—

Child Custody; Provides that a parent's activation, deployment, or temporary assignment to military service and the resultant temporary disruption to the child may not be the sole factor in granting a petition for or modification of time-sharing and parental responsibility. Provides that a time-sharing and parental responsibility order in effect before a temporary change due to a parent's military service shall automatically be reinstated after a specified period after return and notice by the returning parent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/SB 1656 (2R1) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Wise—

McKay Scholarships/Students With Disabilities; Makes John M. McKay Scholarships available to students with disabilities who have a 504 accommodation plan issued under s. 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act. Allows a parent to request and receive a scholarship for a student to enroll and attend a private school if the student has a 504 accommodation plan. Provides that students with certain temporary 504 accommodation plans are ineligible for a scholarship. Provides that a parent may choose to enroll the student in a public school in an adjacent district under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1822 (2R1) by Senator Benacquisto—

School Choice; Revises legislative intent and eligibility requirements for participation in the Opportunity Scholarship Program. Deletes provisions that authorize an opportunity scholarship for attendance at a private school. Requires that an opportunity scholarship remain in force until the student graduates from high school. Revises school district obligations and deletes provisions relating to private schools to conform to changes made by the act. Deletes an obsolete provision relating to the John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; and Budget

CS/CS/SB 1824 (2R1) by the Committees on Transportation, Regulated Industries and Senator Hays—

Regulated Professions and Occupations; Authorizes the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to release certain digital images to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to identify certain persons. Authorizes the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to grant waivers of renewal fees under certain circumstances. Revises continuing education requirements for certain license reactivations. Repeals provisions relating to Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice, etc Effective Date: upon becoming a law, except as otherwise provided

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1884 (2R1) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Gaetz—

Consumer Protection; Prohibits a post-transaction third-party seller from charging a consumer for a good or service sold over the Internet unless certain disclosures are made and the seller receives the informed consent of the consumer. Requires a post-transaction third-party seller to provide a simple mechanism for a consumer to cancel a purchase of a good or service and stop any recurring charges. Prohibits an initial merchant from disclosing certain account numbers of a consumer to a post-transaction third-party seller under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Budget reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 2064 (2R1) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse Treatment; Redefines the term "court" to include county courts in certain circumstances. Requires the Department of Children and Family Services to provide a discharged defendant with up to a 7-day supply of psychotropic medication when he or she is returning to jail from a state treatment facility. Authorizes a county court to order the conditional release of a defendant for the provision of outpatient care and treatment. Creates the Forensic Hospital Diversion Pilot Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

Reported favorably by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; Judiciary; and Budget

SJR 2084 (2R1) by the Committee on Judiciary—

Repeal of Supreme Court Rule by General Law; Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to reduce the vote threshold required for the Legislature to enact a law repealing a rule of court and to prohibit the Supreme Court from readopting a rule repealed by the Legislature for a prescribed period.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Budget

Judicial Nominating Commissions; Provides for the termination of terms of all current members of judicial nominating commissions. Provides for staggered terms of newly appointed members. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
