Growth Management; Providing that a proposed development that is consistent with certain comprehensive plans is not required to undergo review pursuant to the state coordinated review process, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Read the second time on March 4, 2016

SB 7022 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Evers)—

OGSR/Depictions or Recordings of the Killing of a Law Enforcement Officer; Amending provisions which provide an exemption from public records requirements for a photograph or video or audio recording held by an agency that depicts or records the killing of a person; narrowing the exemption to depictions or recordings of the killing of a law enforcement officer who was acting in accordance with his or her official duties; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2016

CS/SB 7050 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Ring)—

Information Technology Security; Revising the membership of the Technology Advisory Council to include a cybersecurity expert; providing that risk assessments and security audits may be completed by a private vendor; providing for the establishment of computer security incident response teams within state agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

SB 288 (3R) by Senator Smith—

State Designations; Providing an honorary designation of a certain state park in a specified county; directing the Department of Environmental Protection to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

CS/SB 1322, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Latvala—

Juvenile Detention Costs; Revising the annual contributions by certain counties for the costs of detention care for juveniles; requiring the state to pay all costs of detention care for juveniles residing out of state and for juveniles residing in state detention centers in counties that provide their own detention care for juveniles; deleting a requirement that the Department of Revenue and the counties provide certain technical assistance to the Department of Juvenile Justice, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

CS/SB 1106 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Flores—

International Trust Entities; Providing for a moratorium for a specified timeframe on enforcement by the Office of Financial Regulation of certain licensure requirements for certain organizations and entities providing services to international trust companies; providing conditions to apply the moratorium to specified persons of the organization or entity; requiring the office to issue a notice of denial if it determines that an organization or entity is not a party to the moratorium, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 268, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Ring and others—

Bullying and Harassment Policies in Schools; Requiring school districts to revise their bullying and harassment policy at specified intervals; requiring each school principal to implement the bullying and harassment policy in a certain manner and integrate it with the school's bullying prevention and intervention program; designating Chapter 2010-217, Laws of Florida, as "Taylor's Law for Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Read the second time and amended on March 4, 2016

CS/CS/SB 1394, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Transportation and Senator Brandes—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Requiring the driver of every other vehicle to take specified actions if a utility service vehicle displaying any visual signals or a service patrol vehicle displaying amber rotating or flashing lights is performing certain tasks on the roadside; authorizing, as of a specified date, a specified court to order a certain qualified sobriety and drug monitoring program under a specified pilot program as an alternative to the placement of an ignition interlock device; authorizing the international symbol for the deaf and hard of hearing to be exhibited on the identification card of a person who is deaf or hard of hearing, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, and except for this section, which shall take effect July 1, 2016, this act shall take effect on October 1, 2016

CS/HB 299 (3R) by the Committee on Economic Affairs Committee and Representative Nunez—

Expressway Authorities; Revises qualifications for membership on governing body of certain expressway authorities; provides for termination from authority's governing body upon finding of violation of specified ethical conduct provisions or failure to comply with notice of failure to comply with financial disclosure requirements. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 574(SUB) (Flores), read the second time, and amended on March 4, 2016

HB 819, 1st Eng. (3R) by Representative Diaz, J. and others—

Sunset Review of Medicaid Dental Services; Providing for the future removal of dental services as a minimum benefit of managed care plans; requiring the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to provide a report to the Governor and Legislature; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to implement a statewide Medicaid prepaid dental health program upon the occurrence of certain conditions; specifying requirements for the program and the selection of providers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Substituted for SB 994(SUB) (Negrón) and read the second time on March 4, 2016

CS/CS/HB 1361, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Economic Affairs Committee, Local Government Affairs Subcommittee and Representative La Rosa—

Growth Management; Authorizing county boards to meet and discuss matters of mutual interest with specified counties or municipalities upon due public notice; authorizing the governing body of a county to employ tax increment financing for certain purposes in certain counties; providing that comprehensive plan amendments and land development regulations in the Apalachicola Bay Area of critical state concern will be reviewed and approved by the state land planning agency, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

CS/CS/HB 749, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Agriculture and Natural Resources Subcommittee, Representative Raburn and others—

Agriculture; Revising the period during which certain agricultural lands in eradication or quarantine programs continue to be classified as such; exempting certain farm vehicles from registration requirements under certain circumstances; preempting regulatory authority over commercial feed and feedstuff to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for conservation easement agreements to include provisions which allow agricultural activities under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Applicability of Revenue Laws to Out-of-state Businesses During Disaster-Response Periods; Provides exemptions from certain registration & licensing requirements & taxes for out-of-state businesses & employees that enter the state in response to disasters or emergencies; specifies applicability of certain transaction taxes & fees; specifies obligations & privileges of out-of-state businesses or employees after disaster-response periods. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Unclaimed Property; Provides exception to unclaimed property reporting requirements; requires certain unclaimed funds to be deposited with CFO; revises aggregate value that constitutes small estate account; revises requirements for power of attorney used in recovery of unclaimed property; eliminates maximum fee provision for recovery; revises requirements for contracts to acquire ownership of or entitlement to unclaimed property; repeals provisions relating to void unclaimed property powers of attorney & purchase agreements. HB 549 (3R) by Representative Burton—

Offenses Concerning Racketeering and Illegal Debts; Authorizes investigative agency to institute civil proceeding for forfeiture in circuit court in certain circumstances; revises grounds for an action; authorizes court to order forfeiture of other property of defendant up to value of unavailable property in certain circumstances; authorizes DLA to bring an action for certain violations; provides for civil penalties for natural persons & other persons; authorizes party to specific civil action to petition for entry of consent decree or settlement agreement & provides requirements; revises provisions relating to subpoena confidentiality; provides that investigative agency has authority to stipulate to protective orders with respect to documents & information submitted in response to subpoena; provides for distribution of forfeiture proceeds to victims. Public Assistance; Revises eligibility guidelines for Relative Caregiver Program; requires DCF to impose replacement fee for EBT cards; revises penalties for noncompliance with work requirements for temporary cash assistance; limits receipt of child-only benefits during periods of noncompliance; requires DCF to refer sanctioned participants to appropriate community services; revises consideration of income from illegal or ineligible noncitizen family members in determining eligibility for temporary cash assistance; requires DEO to develop & implement work plan agreement for participants in temporary cash assistance program. Mental Health Counseling Interns; Revises mental health intern registration requirements; revises requirements for supervision of registered interns; deletes specified education & experience requirements; establishes validity period & provides for expiration of intern registrations; requires licensed mental health professional to be on premises when registered intern provides services in clinical social work, marriage & family therapy, & mental health counseling; deletes clinical experience requirement for such registered interns; deletes provision requiring that certain registered interns meet educational requirements for licensure. Fire Safety; Revises provisions relating to certain structures located on agricultural property which are exempt from Florida Fire Prevention Code; requires that certain structures used for agritourism activity be classified; provides criteria for such classifications; provides that certain structures are subject to annual inspection; specifies applicable fire prevention standards; requires that State Fire Marshal adopt rules; revises certain dimensions of tent that is exempt from code; requires that State Fire Marshal adopt rules; authorizes local fire official to consider specified publication when identifying an alternative to firesafety code. HB 93 (3R) by Representatives Jones, S., Williams and others—

Law Enforcement Officer Body Cameras; Requires law enforcement agency that permits its law enforcement officers to wear body cameras to establish policies & procedures addressing proper use, maintenance, & storage of cameras & data; requires such policies & procedures to include specified information; requires agency to ensure that specified personnel are trained; requires that data be retained in accordance with specified requirements; requires periodic review of agency body camera practices; exempts recordings from specified provisions relating to interception of wire, electronic, & oral communications. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 971 (3R) by the Committee on Local Government Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Sullivan—

Community Development Districts; Amends acreage threshold for establishment of community development district; authorizes district to contract with towing operator to remove vehicles or vessels from specified properties; authorizes up to certain number of districts to merge; provides for membership of surviving merged district; provides requirements of merger agreement; provides for public hearings; prohibits petition to merge from being filed within specified timeframe. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

CS/SB 1638 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Lee—

Postsecondary Education for Veterans; Specifying individuals who are eligible for college credit for college-level military training and education; expanding the list of examinations for which the department is required to establish college credit equivalencies; providing that specified programs and test scores meet certain educator certification requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Identical to CS/HB 1157, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Higher Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 372 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Lee—

Administrative Procedures; Providing procedures for agencies to follow when initiating rulemaking after certain public hearings; providing for publication of notices of rule development and of rules filed for adoption; specifying legal authority to file a petition challenging an agency rule as an invalid exercise of delegated legislative authority; providing that administrative challenges to proposed regulatory permits related to special events are subject to certain summary hearing provisions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 7054 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Sobel)—

Agency for Persons with Disabilities; Repealing provisions relating to a program for the prevention and treatment of severe self-injurious behavior; revising the allocations methodology that the agency is required to use to develop each client's iBudget; establishing The Arc Dental Program in the Agency for Persons with Disabilities; providing for annual reviews for persons involuntarily committed to residential services, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2016

CS/SB 7056 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Health Policy (Bean)—

Long-term Care Managed Care Prioritization; Requiring the Department of Elderly Affairs to maintain a statewide wait list for enrollment for home and community-based services through the Medicaid long-term care managed care program; requiring the department to prioritize individuals for potential enrollment using a frailty-based screening tool that provides a priority score; providing for determinations regarding offers of enrollment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016
