#### **CS/CS/SB 1394, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Transportation and Senator Brandes—**

**Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles;** Requiring the driver of every other vehicle to take specified actions if a utility service vehicle displaying any visual signals or a service patrol vehicle displaying amber rotating or flashing lights is performing certain tasks on the roadside; authorizing, as of a specified date, a specified court to order a certain qualified sobriety and drug monitoring program under a specified pilot program as an alternative to the placement of an ignition interlock device; authorizing insurance companies to receive a salvage certificate of title or certificate of destruction from the department after a specified number of days after payment of a claim as of a specified date, subject to certain requirements, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, and except for this section, which shall take effect July 1, 2016, this act shall take effect on October 1, 2016

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#### **CS/CS/HB 7029, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Education Committee, Education Appropriations Subcommittee, Choice and Innovation Subcommittee, Representatives Cortes, B., Diaz, M. and others—**

**School Choice;** Revises provisions relating to charter schools, virtual education, Credit Acceleration Program, FEFP, educator professional development, & charter school capital outlay funding; creates High Impact Charter Network & Florida Institute for Charter School Innovation. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

*Substituted for CS/SB 1166(SUB) (Gaetz), read the second time, and amended on March 4, 2016*

**Relief of Susana Castillo by the City of Hialeah;** Providing for the relief of Susana Castillo, as personal representative of the Estate of Andrea Castillo; providing for an appropriation to compensate the Estate of Andrea Castillo for her death as a result of the negligence of the City of Hialeah; providing a limitation on the payment of fees and costs; providing that the amounts awarded are intended to provide the sole compensation for all present and future claims related to the wrongful death of Andrea Castillo, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

**Relief of Melvin and Alma Colindres by the City of Miami;** Providing for the relief of Melvin and Alma Colindres by the City of Miami; providing for an appropriation to compensate them for the wrongful death of their son, Kevin Colindres, which occurred as a result of the negligence of police officers of the City of Miami; providing a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/SB 1638 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Lee—**

**Postsecondary Education for Veterans;** Specifying individuals who are eligible for college credit for college-level military training and education; expanding the list of examinations for which the department is required to establish college credit equivalencies; providing that specified programs and test scores meet certain educator certification requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

*Identical to **CS/HB 1157, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committees on Higher Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and Appropriations*

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**CS/CS/SB 372 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Lee—**

**Administrative Procedures;** Providing procedures for agencies to follow when initiating rulemaking after certain public hearings; providing for publication of notices of rule development and of rules filed for adoption; specifying legal authority to file a petition challenging an agency rule as an invalid exercise of delegated legislative authority; providing that administrative challenges to proposed regulatory permits related to special events are subject to certain summary hearing provisions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

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**CS/SB 582 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Gaetz—**

**Public Corruption;** Revising the definition of the term “bribery”; revising requirements for prosecution; revising the prohibition against unlawful compensation or reward for official behavior to conform to changes made by the act; revising the prohibition against official misconduct to conform to changes made by the act; revising applicability of the offense to include public contractors, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2016

**Agency for Persons with Disabilities;** Repealing provisions relating to a program for the prevention and treatment of severe self-injurious behavior; revising the allocations methodology that the agency is required to use to develop each client's iBudget; establishing The Arc Dental Program in the Agency for Persons with Disabilities; providing for annual reviews for persons involuntarily committed to residential services, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2016

**Long-term Care Managed Care Prioritization;** Requiring the Department of Elderly Affairs to maintain a statewide wait list for enrollment for home and community-based services through the Medicaid long-term care managed care program; requiring the department to prioritize individuals for potential enrollment using a frailty-based screening tool that provides a priority score; providing for determinations regarding offers of enrollment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

**Vessels;** Requiring the issuance and use of a safety inspection decal under certain circumstances; prohibiting law enforcement officers from stopping a vessel for a specified purpose under certain circumstances; providing an exception, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

**Tax Exemption for Senior, Totally Permanently Disabled First Responders;** Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to authorize a first responder, who is age 65 or older and totally permanently disabled as a result of an injury sustained in the line of duty, to receive relief from ad valorem taxes assessed on homestead property, if authorized by general law, and to provide an effective date, etc.

**Homestead Tax Exemption;** Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to revise the homestead tax exemption that may be granted by counties or municipalities, if authorized by general law, for the assessed value of property with a just value less than \$250,000 and owned by persons age 65 or older who meet certain residence and income requirements to specify that just value shall be determined in the first tax year that the owner applies and is eligible for the exemption and to provide retroactive applicability and an effective date, etc.

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**CS/CS/SB 488 (SO) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senator Flores and others—**

**County and Municipality Homestead Tax Exemption;** Revising the homestead tax exemption that may be adopted by a county or municipality by ordinance for the assessed value of property with a just value less than \$250,000 which is owned by persons age 65 or older who meet certain residence and income requirements; specifying that just value shall be determined in the first tax year that the owner applies and is eligible for the exemption; providing for a refund of overpaid taxes in prior years, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that CS/SJR 492 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose takes effect, if such joint resolution is approved by the electors at the general election to be held in November 2016, and shall apply retroactively to the 2013 tax roll for any person who received the exemption under s. 196.075(2)(b) before the effective date of this act

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**CS/CS/SB 766 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Finance and Tax and Senator Flores—**

**Ad Valorem Taxation;** Specifying deadlines for value adjustment boards to complete certain hearings and final assessment roll certifications; requiring a property appraiser to serve a notice of intent to record a notice of tax lien under certain circumstances; revising the procedures for filing petitions to the value adjustment board; extending the dates for certain counties to adopt or certify non-ad valorem assessment rolls, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, and except for this section, which shall take effect June 30, 2016, this act shall take effect July 1, 2016

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

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**CS/SB 1088 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Stargel and others—**

**Education Programs for Individuals with Disabilities;** Exempting a foster child from specified eligibility provisions; providing that a student enrolled in a transition-to-work program is eligible for a John M. McKay Scholarship; creating a transition-to-work program for specific students enrolled in the John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program; changing the name of the program to the “Adults with Disabilities Workforce Education Program”; exempting a John M. McKay Scholarship award from a specified funding calculation for purposes of the Florida Education Finance Program, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2016

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

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**CS/SB 1196 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Bean and others—**

**Emergency Allergy Treatment in Schools;** Authorizing a public school and a private school, respectively, to enter into certain arrangements with wholesale distributors or manufacturers for epinephrine auto-injectors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 1305(HC)** in the Committees on Education Pre-K - 12; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 1316 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Grimsley—**

**Nurse Licensure Compact;** Creating the Nurse Licensure Compact; providing for the recognition of nursing licenses in party states; providing requirements for obtaining and retaining a multistate license; providing the effect of the act on a current licensee; requiring all party states to participate in a coordinated licensure information system; designating the state administrator of the Nurse Licensure Compact and other members, employees, or representatives of the Interstate Commission of Nurse Licensure Compact Administrators as state agents for the purpose of applying sovereign immunity and waivers of sovereign immunity, etc. Effective Date: December 31, 2018, or upon enactment of the Nurse Licensure Compact into law by 26 states, whichever occurs first

**Special Election;** Providing for a special election to be held August 30, 2016, pursuant to Section 5 of Article XI of the State Constitution, for the approval or rejection by the electors of this state of amendments to the State Constitution, proposed by joint resolution, relating to an exemption from the tangible personal property tax for solar or renewable energy source devices, a limitation on the assessed value of real property used for nonresidential purposes for the installation of such devices, and an effective date if such amendments are adopted, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law if enacted by a vote of at least three-fourths of the membership of each house of the Legislature and if Senate Joint Resolution 170, 2016 Regular Session, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, is adopted by both houses of the Legislature

**CS/SB 1722 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Stargel—**

**Termination of Pregnancies;** Defining the term “gestation” and revising the term “third trimester”; revising the requirements for disposal of fetal remains; prohibiting state agencies, local governmental entities, and Medicaid managed care plans from expending or paying funds to or initiating or renewing contracts under certain circumstances with certain organizations that perform abortions; requiring certain organizations that provide abortion referral services or abortion counseling services to register with the agency, pay a specified fee, and include certain information in advertisements, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2016

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**CS/CS/SB 1652 (SO) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Senators Bradley, Bean and others—**

**Discretionary Sales Surtaxes;** Authorizing a county to apply proceeds of a pension liability surtax toward reducing the unfunded liability of a defined benefit retirement plan or system; authorizing a county to levy a pension liability surtax by ordinance if certain conditions are met; specifying the manner in which a local government may use the surtax proceeds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 1297, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Community Affairs; Finance and Tax; and Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 1630 (SO) by the Committees on Ethics and Elections, Banking and Insurance and Senator Flores—**

**Operations of the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation;** Specifying that a consumer representative appointed by the Governor to the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation's board of governors is not prohibited from practicing in a certain profession if required or permitted by law or ordinance; requiring the corporation to maintain and make available specified lists of insurers to its agents of record, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2016

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 931(HC) in the Committees on Banking and Insurance; Ethics and Elections; and Appropriations*

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**CS/CS/SB 1010 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Montford—**
