**Limitations of Actions Other Than for the Recovery of Real Property;** Authorizes commencement, within specified timeframe, of certain claims after pleading to which such claims relate; provides applicability. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 536(SUB)** (Passidomo) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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#### **HB 449 (3R) by Representative Stafford and others—**

**Children's Initiatives;** Creates Tampa Sulphur Springs Neighborhood of Promise Success Zone within City of Tampa in Hillsborough County & Overtown Children & Youth Coalition within City of Miami in Miami-Dade County; provides for management by not for profit corporations not subject to state control, supervision, or direction. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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#### **HB 6003, 1st Eng. (3R) by Representative White—**

**Participant Local Government Advisory Council;** Abolishes the Participant Local Government Advisory Council. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **CS/SB 614(SUB)** (Montford) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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#### **CS/HB 529 (3R) by the Committee on Commerce Committee and Representative Diaz, M.—**

**Florida Fire Prevention Code;** Requires specified containers be allowed in exit corridors of certain apartment occupancies under certain circumstances; authorizes authorities having jurisdiction to approve alternative containers; requires such authorities to allow phase-in period to comply; provides for future repeal. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 746(SUB)** (Bean) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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#### **CS/CS/HB 483, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Commerce Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee, Representative Yarborough and others—**

**Unfair Insurance Trade Practices;** Revises types, value & frequency of advertising & promotional gifts that licensed insurers or their agents may give to insureds, prospective insureds, or others; authorizes such insurers or agents to make certain charitable donations on behalf of insureds or prospective insureds; prohibits title insurance agents, agencies, & insurers from giving insureds, prospective insureds, or others merchandise in excess of specified value; authorizes certain licensed insurers & agents to give specified complimentary services or discounted rates on specified services. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 762(SUB)** (Mayfield) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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#### **HB 6009 (3R) by Representative Geller and others—**

**Write-In Candidates;** Repeals provisions relating to write-in candidate residency requirement. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/HB 675 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee and Representative Brodeur—**

**Pharmacies;** Revises membership of Board of Pharmacy; establishes Class III institutional pharmacies; provides requirements for such pharmacies; revises notice requirements; authorizes distribution of medicinal drugs & prepackaged drug products without specified permit under certain conditions; removes provision exempting certain drug repackagers from specified permit requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1128(SUB)** (Stargel) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 6535 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee, Civil Justice and Claims Subcommittee and Representative Newton—**

**Relief/Estate of Dr. Sherrill Lynn Aversa/Department of Transportation;** Provides appropriation to compensate Estate of Dr. Sherrill Lynn Aversa for Dr. Aversa's death as result of negligence of DOT; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **SB 40(SUB)** (Thurston) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**HB 7037, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Government Accountability Committee and Representative Caldwell—**

**Election Dates for Municipal Office;** Requiring the governing body of a municipality to determine the dates on which an initial and runoff election for municipal office are held and providing options therefor; requiring counties that have established certain dates for the election of municipal officers through a special act to conduct municipal elections on specified dates; requiring municipal recall elections to be held concurrently with municipal elections under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2020

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1262(SUB)** (Hutson), read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 937 (3R) by the Committees on Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Health Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Nunez and others—**

**Perinatal Mental Health;** Requires DOH to offer perinatal mental health care information through Family Health Line toll-free hotline accessible to general public; revises components included in postpartum evaluation & followup care provided by birth centers to include mental health screening & information on postpartum depression; provides appropriation. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 138(SUB)** (Book) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**HB 6505 (3R) by Representative Jenne—**

**Relief/Vonshelle Brothers/Department of Health;** Provides appropriation from DOH to compensate Vonshelle Brothers & daughter Lyonna Hughey for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of Brevard County Health Department; provides limitation on payment of compensation, fees, & costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **SB 42(SUB)** (Rodriguez) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/HB 411 (3R) by the Committee on Government Accountability Committee, Representative Clemons and others—**

**Public Records and Public Meetings/Firesafety Systems;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for firesafety system plans held by agency, exemption from public records & public meetings requirements for information relating to firesafety systems for certain properties & meetings relating to such systems & information, & exemption from public meetings requirements for portions of meetings that would reveal such plans held by agency; provides for retroactive application, for future legislative review & repeal, & statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/CS/CS/HB 705 (3R) by the Committees on Government Accountability Committee, Oversight, Transparency and Administration Subcommittee, Natural Resources and Public Lands Subcommittee and Representative Burgess—**

**Pub. Rec./Water Management District Surplus Lands;** Provides exemption for certain records relating to sale of surplus lands; authorizes disclosure of such records under certain circumstances; provides for future legislative review & repeal. Effective Date: On the same date that HB 703 or similar legislation takes effect

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**CS/HB 1065, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representatives Eagle, Jones and others—**

**Expunction of Criminal History Records;** Providing that a person receiving a judgment of acquittal or not guilty verdict is eligible to have his or her criminal record expunged; revising the circumstances under which the Department of Law Enforcement must issue a certificate of eligibility for the sealing of a criminal history record, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

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**CS/HB 703 (3R) by the Committee on Government Accountability Committee and Representative Burgess—**

**Water Management District Surplus Lands;** Requires water management districts to publish notice of intention to sell surplus lands on its website; revises circumstances when water management districts must publish first notice of intention to sell surplus lands; revises process for selling certain lower valued surplus lands. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/HB 1301 (3R) by the Committee on Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Representative Fitzenhagen and others—**

**Sexual Offenders and Predators;** Reducing aggregate & consecutive number of days used to determine residency for purposes of sexual predator or sexual offender registration; provides for mandatory sentence of community control with electronic monitoring for certain offenses committed by sexual predators & sexual offenders if court does not impose prison sentence. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for CS/SB 1226(SUB) (Book), read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/HB 565 (3R) by the Committee on Education Committee and Representative Mariano—**

**Excess Credit Hour Surcharges;** Requires state university to return specified amount of assessed excess credit hour surcharges to first-time-in-college students who meet certain requirements. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for CS/SB 844(SUB) (Bean) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**HB 6501 (3R) by Representative Toledo—**

**Relief/Cristina Alvarez and George Patnode/Department of Health;** Provides appropriations from DOH to compensate Cristina Alvarez & George Patnode for death of son, Nicholas Patnode, due to negligence of Martin County Health Department; provides for repayment of Medicaid liens; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for CS/SB 44(SUB) (Rodriguez) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/SB 1314 (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Brandes—**

**Florida Capital Formation Act;** Deleting the requirement that the Department of Economic Opportunity manage certain activities related to the commercialization of specified products, services, and ideas; redesignating the Institute for the Commercialization of Public Research as the Institute for Commercialization of Florida Technology; requiring that certain proceeds be returned to the Florida Technology Seed Capital Fund after the payment of certain costs and fees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**HB 1201 (3R) by Representatives Ahern, Lee and others—**

**Education for Prisoners;** Authorizes DOC to contract with certain entities to provide education services for Correctional Education Program; authorizes each county to contract with certain entities to provide education services for county inmates; authorizes use of state funds for operation of postsecondary workforce programs for education of certain state inmates. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/SB 1066 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Baxley—**

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Providing honorary designations of certain transportation facilities in specified counties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/CS/HB 1151, 2nd Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Commerce Committee, Agriculture and Property Rights Subcommittee and Representative La Rosa—**

**Developments of Regional Impact;** Repeals, creates, & revises provisions for statewide guidelines, standards, & requirements for developments of regional impact relating to authorizations to develop; applications for approval of development; concurrent plan amendments; preapplication procedures; preliminary development agreements; conceptual agency reviews; local notice & regional reports; developments inside & outside areas of critical state concern; local government development orders; construction of mitigation facilities; impact fee & exaction credits; comprehensive development applications & master plan development orders; abandonment of developments; dense urban land area exemptions; Florida Quality Developments & Quality Developments Review Board; Administration Commission guidelines & standards; state land planning agency agreements; Florida Land & Water Adjudicatory Commission requirements; local government permit approvals & extensions, reviews & certifications; uniform reviews of developments by state land planning agency & regional planning agencies. 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**CS/CS/CS/HB 1069, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Children, Families and Seniors Subcommittee, Representatives Hager, Harrell and others—**

**Substance Abuse Services;** Authorizes DOH, AHCA, & DCF to grant exemptions from disqualification for service provider personnel to work solely in certain treatment programs & facilities; revises provisions relating to background checks & exemptions from disqualification for certain service provider personnel & owners, directors, & CFOs of recovery residences; provides qualifications for certification as peer specialist; authorizes department to designate certain credentialing entities to certify peer specialists; prohibits recovery residences & specified affiliated individuals from benefitting from certain referrals. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/CS/HB 1337, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Health Quality Subcommittee and Representative Pigman—**

**Nursing;** Defines term "advanced practice registered nurse"; deletes terms "advanced registered nurse practitioner," & "clinical nurse specialist"; provides for certain application requirements for nurses desiring to be licensed APRN; authorizes Board of Nursing to adopt rules. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1594(SUB)** (Brandes) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 1211 (3R) by the Committees on Commerce Committee, Careers and Competition Subcommittee, Representative Abruzzo and others—**

**Airboat Regulation;** Requires commercial airboat operators to have specified documents onboard; provides exception & penalty; directs FWCC to adopt rules by specified date. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

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**CS/CS/CS/HB 165, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Justice Appropriations Subcommittee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative McClain and others—**

**Written Threats to Conduct Mass Shootings or Acts of Terrorism;** Prohibiting a person from making threats to conduct a mass shooting or act of terrorism in a writing or other record and transmitting that threat in any manner that would allow another person to view the threat; revising the offense ranking to include written threats to conduct a mass shooting or act of terrorism, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

**SB 358 (3R) by Senator Broxson and others—**

**Transportation Facility Designations/Senator Greg Evers Memorial Highway;** Providing honorary designation of a certain transportation facility in specified counties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**HB 215 (3R) by Representative Payne and others—**

**Autocycles;** Defines "autocycle" & revises definition of "motorcycle"; requires safety belt usage by autocycle operator/passenger; authorizes autocycle operation without motorcycle endorsement; provides applicability. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 504(SUB)** (Perry), read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 1383 (3R) by the Committees on Government Accountability Committee, Ways and Means Committee and Representative Latvala—**

**Tax Deed Sales;** Requires tax certificateholder to pay specified costs to bring property on which taxes are delinquent to sale; requires tax collector to contract with title company to determine who must be noticed & provided property information reports; revises notification requirements; revises provisions concerning tax deed sales & filings for & distributions of surplus funds. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/SB 848, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Grimsley and others—**

**Telepharmacy;** Providing permit requirements for remote dispensing site pharmacies; requiring the prescription department manager or other pharmacist employed by the supervising pharmacy to visit the remote dispensing site pharmacy; authorizing a Florida licensed pharmacist to serve as the prescription drug manager at more than one remote dispensing site pharmacy under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/HB 581 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Latvala and others—**

**Subpoenas in Investigations of Sexual Offenses;** Authorizes law enforcement agency to issue & serve subpoena in investigation of specified sexual offenses; specifies requirements regarding nondisclosure of information; provides for judicial review of nondisclosure requirements. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 618(SUB)** (Baxley) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

**HB 577 (3R) by Representatives Silvers, Duran and others—**

**High School Graduation Requirements;** Authorizes student to use credit earned upon completion of apprenticeship or preapprenticeship program to satisfy specified high school graduation requirements; requires SBE to approve & identify registered apprenticeship & preapprenticeship programs. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/HB 721 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee, Representative Silvers and others—**

**Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services;** Requires jails to provide medical information pertaining to defendants who have been adjudicated incompetent to proceed or adjudicated not guilty by reason of insanity & committed to DCF; requires continued administration of psychotropic medication to certain defendants when discharged & transferred to jails under certain conditions; specifies final authority regarding administration of such medication; removes requirement that DCF develop certification process by rule for community substance abuse prevention coalitions. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**CS/HB 533 (3R) by the Committee on Insurance and Banking Subcommittee, Representative Hager and others—**

**Unfair Insurance Trade Practices;** Authorizes property & casualty insurers to refuse to insure or continue to insure applicant or insured for failing to purchase certain noninsurance motor vehicle services. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for **CS/SB 756(SUB)** (Grimsley) and read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**HB 599 (3R) by Representative Altman—**

**Lis Pendens;** Provides that person who acquires for value lien on property during course of specified legal actions takes such lien free of claims in certain circumstances; specifies effect of valid, recorded lis pendens in certain circumstances involving judicial sale. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 904(SUB)** (Powell), read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 465, 2nd Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Commerce Committee, Insurance and Banking Subcommittee and Representative Santiago—**

**Insurance;** Providing an exception from valuation rules for stocks in subsidiaries for certain foreign insurers under certain conditions; revising requirements for rules adopted by the Department of Financial Services and the Financial Services Commission relating to the privacy of certain consumer information; revising the definition of the term "specialty insurer" to include viatical settlement providers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 784(SUB)** (Brandes) and read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/SB 820 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Powell—**

**Firesafety Inspectors;** Prohibiting certain actions to influence a firesafety inspector to violate the Florida Fire Prevention Code, other rules of the State Fire Marshal, or ch. 633, F.S., etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2018

*Read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/SB 1862 (3R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Broxson—**

**Physician Fee Sharing Task Force;** Establishing the Physician Fee Sharing Task Force within the Department of Health; providing for duties, membership, and meetings of the task force, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/HB 7087, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Appropriations Committee, Ways and Means Committee and Representative Renner—**

**Taxation;** Provides an exemption from excise tax on certain documents, notes, & mortgages related to housing financing authority; provides sales tax exemptions for specified products destroyed as a result of hurricanes; authorizes ad valorem tax exemptions under specified situations; provides documentary stamp tax exemption for certain transfers of homestead property between spouses; reduces tax levied on specified fees charged for use of real property; revises total amount of community contribution tax credits for projects related to housing opportunities; modifies calculation of dealer's collection allowance; revises provisions regarding adjusted taxable income for corporate income tax purposes; increases total amount of contaminated site rehabilitation tax credits; requires specified reduction of civil penalties; increases tax credits for rehabilitation of drycleaning-solvent-contaminated sites & brownfield sites; extends carry forward period for unused tax credits; provides an appropriation. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

**Transportation;** Revising provisions relating to contracting and negotiation between the Department of Transportation and local governmental entities for acquisition, construction, or operation of turnpike projects; exempting a law enforcement officer from paying a toll on a toll facility when operating an official vehicle while on official law enforcement business; requiring fees generated from tolls to be used to reimburse, by interlocal agreement, a county or another local governmental entity for the direct actual costs of operating a specified fire station providing services to the public on Alligator Alley, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

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**SB 870 (3R) by Senator Bracy—**

**Capital Felonies;** Providing legislative findings and intent regarding the retroactive application of Hurst v. State, No. SC12-1947 (Fla., October 14, 2016), etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Read the second time on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/CS/HB 731, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Education Committee, PreK-12 Innovation Subcommittee, Representative Sullivan and others—**

**Home Education;** Revises provisions relating to home education programs, school attendance requirements, home education student participation in interscholastic & intrascholastic extracurricular student activities, & dual enrollment programs. Effective Date: 07/01/2018

*Substituted for CS/CS/SB 732(SUB) (Baxley), read the second time, and amended on March 8, 2018*

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**CS/HB 7061, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice and Claims Subcommittee, Representatives Perez and Leek—**

**Jurisdiction of County Courts;** Requires specified filing fees for appeals from certain county courts; increases jurisdictional limit for actions at law by county courts; provides county court civil filing fees for claims of specified value; provides for distribution of said fees; provides that certain mediation fee is not applicable to certain appeals. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

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**CS/SB 1348 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Perry—**

**Community Development Districts;** Authorizing sufficiently contiguous lands located within the county or municipality which a petitioner anticipates adding to the boundaries of a new community development district to also be identified in a petition to establish the new district under certain circumstances; providing that the amendment of a district by the addition of a parcel does not alter the transition from landowner voting to qualified elector voting; requiring the petitioner to cause to be recorded a certain notice of boundary amendment upon adoption of the ordinance expanding the district, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2018
