Dependent Children; Specifying the venue in proceedings for the appointment of a guardian for a child or young adult who has been adjudicated dependent; authorizing a court to receive and consider any information provided by the Guardian Ad Litem Program and the child's attorney ad litem if a child is under the jurisdiction of a dependency court, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 178 (2R) by Senator Gruters—

Florida Tourism Marketing; Amending provisions relating to the Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation direct-support organization and the Division of Tourism Marketing of Enterprise Florida, Inc., respectively; abrogating the scheduled repeal of provisions related to the corporation and the division, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 256 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Baxley—

Child Protection Teams; Revising the definition of the term "officer, employee, or agent," as it applies to immunity from personal liability in certain actions, to include any member of a child protection team established by the Department of Health in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 262 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Albritton and others—

Child Welfare; Providing for the name of a child's guardian ad litem or attorney ad litem to be entered on court orders in dependency proceedings; requiring cooperation between certain parties and the court to achieve permanency for a child as soon as possible; requiring the court during an adjudicatory hearing to advise parents in plain language of certain requirements to achieve permanency with their child, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 322 (2R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Banking and Insurance and Senator Simpson—

Preexisting Conditions; Defining the terms "operative date" and "preexisting medical condition" with respect to individual and group health insurance policies, respectively; requiring insurers, contingent upon the occurrence of either of two specified events, to make at least one comprehensive major medical health insurance policy available to all residents of this state within a specified timeframe; prohibiting such insurers from excluding, limiting, denying, or delaying coverage under such policies due to preexisting medical conditions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Firefighters' Bill of Rights; Requiring that witnesses be interviewed and certain information be provided to a firefighter subjected to interrogation before the interrogation is conducted; prohibiting a firefighter from being threatened with certain disciplinary action during the course of an interrogation; requiring that a firefighter be notified and provided certain information before certain disciplinary actions are taken, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

SJR 690 (2R) by Senator Rodriguez—

Single Subject Limitation for Taxation and Budget Reform

Commission; Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require that any proposals to revise the State Constitution, or any part thereof, filed by the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission be limited to a single subject, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules
