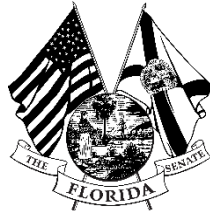

CS/HB 281, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee and Representative Stevenson—

Pub. Rec./Voters and Voter Registration; Provides exemption from public records requirements for telephone numbers & email addresses of voter registration applicants & voters; provides exemption from public records requirements for information concerning preregistered voter registration applicants who are minors; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides for retroactive application; provides statements of public necessity. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Substituted for **SB 342(SUB)** (Lee) and read the third time, reconsidered on April 26, 2019, pending roll call*

CS/CS/HB 23 (3R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Ways and Means Committee, Representative Yarborough and others—

Telehealth; Establishes standard of care for telehealth providers; authorizes telehealth providers to use telehealth to perform patient evaluations; authorizes certain telehealth providers to use telehealth to prescribe specified controlled substances; provides that nonphysician telehealth provider using telehealth & acting within scope of practice is not deemed to be practicing medicine without license; provides that health insurer or HMO is allowed tax credit against specified tax imposed if it covers services provided by telehealth providers. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

CS/HB 19 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee and Representative Leek—

Prescription Drug Importation Programs; Creates programs for purpose of safely importing cost-effective prescription drugs into state from Canada & other foreign nations under specified conditions; provides eligibility criteria for prescription drugs & program participants; provides distribution requirements; provides annual reporting requirements; provides application & permitting requirements for certain participating entities; provides that implementation of International Prescription Drug Importation Program is contingent on federal arrangement or obtaining federal guidance. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1528(SUB)** (Bean), read the second time, and amended on April 26, 2019*

CS/HB 21 (3R) by the Committee on Health Market Reform Subcommittee and Representative Fitzenhagen—

Health Care Facility Market Barriers; Establishes local health councils; requires AHCA to coordinate planning of health care services in state & maintain comprehensive health care database; requires DOH to contract with local health councils for specified services; requires AHCA to establish licensure standards for providers of adult cardiovascular services; repeals certain provisions relating to issuance of certificates of need by AHCA & Health Facility & Services Development Act. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

*Substituted for **CS/CS/SB 1712(SUB)** (Harrell), read the second time, and amended on April 26, 2019*

HB 7067 (3R) by the Committee on Health Quality Subcommittee and Representative Yarborough—

Registration Fees; Requires an out-of-state health care provider to pay an application fee and biennial renewal fee to be registered to provide telehealth services in this state. Effective Date: On the same date that HB 23 or similar legislation takes effect

Read the second time on April 26, 2019

CS/SB 1622 (3R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Montford—

Public Records/Foster Parent and Foster Parent Applicant Names; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the names of foster parent applicants and licensed foster parents, and the names of the spouses, minor children, and adult household members of such applicants and foster parents, which are held by the Department of Children and Families; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Read the second time on April 26, 2019

CS/CS/CS/SB 1666 (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Flores and others—

Vessels; Revising boating safety identification requirements for certain persons; directing the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to conduct, contingent upon appropriation, a specified study of the impacts of long-term stored vessels and certain anchored and moored vessels on local communities and the state and to submit a report to the Governor and Legislature within a specified timeframe; authorizing certain counties to create no-discharge zones; specifying the fines for violations related to no-discharge zones, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

CS/HB 843 (3R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Committee and Representative Rodriguez, A.M.—

Patient Access to Primary Care and Specialist Providers; Requires hospital to notify & provide specified information & records to patient's primary care or specialist provider within specified timeframe after patient's admission & discharge; requires hospital to inform patient, upon admission, of option to request consultation between primary care or specialist provider & treating physician at hospital. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Substituted for CS/SB 7078(SUB) (Harrell), read the second time, and amended on April 26, 2019

HB 647, 1st Eng. (3R) by Representatives Grieco, Rommel and others—

Community Association Fire and Life Safety Systems; Requires certain associations to post certain signs or symbols on buildings; requires State Fire Marshal to adopt rules governing such signs & symbols; provides for enforcement; revises provisions relating to evidence of association compliance with fire & life safety code; revises provisions related to retrofitting. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Substituted for CS/CS/CS/SB 908(SUB) (Hooper), read the second time, and amended on April 26, 2019

C-51 Reservoir Project; Revising the portions of the C-51 reservoir project for which the South Florida Water Management District may negotiate; revising water storage and use requirements specified for the project if state funds are appropriated for the project; specifying that Phase II of the project may be funded by appropriation, in addition to other sources, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/HB 95(HC) in the Committees on Environment and Natural Resources; Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 302 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Health Policy and Senator Brandes—

Nonemergency Medical Transportation Services; Authorizing certain transportation network companies to provide nonemergency medical transportation services to a Medicaid recipient under certain circumstances; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to update its regulations, policies, or other guidance by a specified date to reflect such authorization, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Committee on Banking and Insurance reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to CS/HB 411, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committees on Health Policy; Banking and Insurance; and Rules

CS/CS/SB 464 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Flores and others—

Prepaid College Plans; Authorizing the transfer of fees associated with dormitory residency to approved qualified nonprofit organizations under certain circumstances; prohibiting transferred fees from exceeding a specified amount, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 547(HC)** in the Committees on Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 536 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Innovation, Industry, and Technology, Senator Brandes and others—

911 Services; Requiring that the Technology Program within the Department of Management Services develop a plan to require that emergency dispatchers be able to transfer an emergency call from one E911 system to another E911 system in this state; defining the terms "first responder agency" and "911 public safety answering point"; requiring each agreement to require a PSAP to be able to directly communicate with first responder agencies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Innovation, Industry, and Technology; the Committee on Infrastructure and Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 630 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Perry and others—

Nonopioid Alternatives; Requiring the Department of Health to develop and publish on its website an educational pamphlet regarding the use of nonopioid alternatives for the treatment of pain; requiring that the pamphlet include specified information, including the advantages and disadvantages of the use of such alternatives, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 718 (SO) by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space and Senator Gruters—

Honor and Remember Flag; Designating the Honor and Remember flag as an emblem of the state; authorizing the display of the flag at specified locations, on specified days, and in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2020

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Space; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 722 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Hooper—

Carrying of Firearms by Tactical Medical Professionals; Exempting certain licensed medical professionals from specified provisions concerning the carrying of firearms; requiring certain policies and procedures for law enforcement agencies; providing immunities and privileges for such professionals; requiring the appointing law enforcement agency to issue any firearm or ammunition to tactical medical professionals, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Infrastructure and Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 728 (SO) by the Committee on Infrastructure and Security and Senator Lee—

Community Development Districts; Authorizing sufficiently contiguous lands located within the county or municipality which a petitioner anticipates adding to the boundaries of a new community development district to also be identified in a petition to establish the new district under certain circumstances; providing requirements for the petition; providing notification requirements for the petition, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Infrastructure and Security; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 772 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance, Senator Stargel and others—

Liens Against Motor Vehicles and Vessels; Authorizing a person claiming a lien against a motor vehicle to obtain the release of the vehicle from a lien claimed by a motor vehicle repair shop under certain circumstances; prohibiting a motor vehicle repair shop from violating certain provisions; revising notice requirements for enforcing a lien by sale of a motor vehicle; requiring a motor vehicle repair shop, garage, automotive service facility, or storage operator to use a third-party service to provide notices of lien and sale, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2020

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 816 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Perry—

Environmental Regulation; Requiring counties and municipalities to address the contamination of recyclable material in specified contracts; prohibiting counties and municipalities from requiring the collection or transport of contaminated recyclable material by residential recycling collectors, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 771, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committees on Environment and Natural Resources; Community Affairs; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 892 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Passidomo—

Business Organizations; Providing requirements, authorizations, and prohibitions relating to when the terms of a plan or a filed document may be dependent on facts objectively ascertainable outside of the plan or filed document; revising the process authorizing a domestic or foreign corporation to correct a document filed by the Department of State; requiring certain certificates to be taken by certain entities as prima facie evidence of the facts stated; revising requirements and authorizations for the contents of articles of incorporation, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2020

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 980 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Harrell—

Public Records/Petition for Certain Protective Injunctions; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for any information that can be used to identify a petitioner or respondent in a petition for certain protective injunctions, and any related affidavit, notice of hearing, and temporary injunction, until the respondent has been personally served; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/HB 845(HC)** in the Committees on Judiciary; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules*

CS/SB 990 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Gibson and others—

Unemployment Compensation; Prohibiting certain victims of domestic violence from being disqualified for benefits for voluntarily leaving work; adding a circumstance under which the employment record of an employing unit may not be charged, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

*Identical to **CS/HB 563, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Tourism; Judiciary; and Rules*

CS/SB 1164 (SO) by the Committee on Education, Senator Gainer and others—

Postsecondary Fee Waivers; Authorizing certain Florida College System institutions serving counties directly impacted by a hurricane to waive out-of-state fees for students for a specified time period; prohibiting certain students enrolled in certain Florida College System institutions who qualify for such fee waivers from being included in the enrollment totals of such institutions for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 593(HC)** in the Committees on Education; Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 1432 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Baxley—

Foster Parents; Citing this act as the “Foster Parent Bill of Rights”; creating a bill of rights for foster parents; providing for mediation; requiring the Department of Children and Families to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1618 (SO) by the Committee on Innovation, Industry, and Technology, Senator Simmons and others—

Tobacco Products; Citing this act as the “Tobacco 21 Act”; revising shipping documentation requirements for specified sales of tobacco products; deleting provisions requiring driver license penalties for certain persons who commit tobacco-related offenses; revising the age under which it is unlawful to smoke in, on, or near school property; revising the age limitation that applies to the sale, delivery, bartering, furnishing, or giving of certain tobacco products, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Innovation, Industry, and Technology; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1650 (SO) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Policy and Senator Albritton—

Child Welfare; Requiring the Department of Children and Families to establish a direct-support organization to assist the Children and Youth Cabinet with carrying out certain purposes and responsibilities; requiring that the order for placement of a child in shelter care contain a written finding specifying that the Department of Children and Families has placement and care responsibility for certain children; requiring information to be provided to relatives and nonrelatives regarding the Guardianship Assistance Program and the Relative Caregiver Program; revising when a court must return a child to the custody of his or her parents after making certain determinations, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 7099(HC) in the Committees on Health Policy; Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and Appropriations

SB 7020 (SO) by the Committee on Education (Diaz)—

OGSR/University Direct-support Organization/Research Funding or Research Plans; Amending provisions relating to an exemption from public meeting requirements for specified meetings of a university direct-support organization at which proposals seeking research funding or research plans are discussed; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Identical to HB 7001(HC) in the Committees on Education; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules

CS/SB 7024 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Environment and Natural Resources (Montford)—

Department of Environmental Protection Citizen Support Organizations; Requiring the department to submit a report to the Legislature by a specified date; abrogating the scheduled repeal of provisions governing citizen support organizations established under the department; abrogating the scheduled repeal of provisions governing citizen support organizations established under the department for the benefit of the state park system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2019

Recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 7032 (SO) by the Committee on Infrastructure and Security (Lee)—

OGSR/Emergency Planning Assistance/Division of Emergency Management; Amending a specified provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for information furnished by a person or a business to the Division of Emergency Management for emergency planning assistance; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Identical to HB 7011(HC) in the Committees on Infrastructure and Security; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules

SB 7044 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Perry)—

OGSR/Concealed Carry License/Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Amending provisions relating to an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of an individual who has applied for a license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm through a tax collector appointed by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to receive applications and fees; abrogating the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2019

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

*Identical to **HB 7059(HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and Rules*

SB 7082 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Perry)—

Controlled Substances; Adding to Schedule V of the controlled substances list certain drug products in their finished dosage formulations which are approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/HB 7107(HC)** in the Committees on Criminal Justice; Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 1704 (SO) by the Committees on Innovation, Industry, and Technology, Banking and Insurance and Senator Wright—
