#### CS/CS/SB 48 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Diaz and others—

Educational Scholarship Programs; Requiring the Auditor General to conduct certain audits at least every 3 years instead of annually; adding certain students to those to whom district school boards must provide preferential treatment in the controlled open enrollment process; establishing the McKay-Gardiner Scholarship Program; revising the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program; repealing the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program; providing that private virtual schools meet the requirement to maintain a physical location in this state if such virtual schools maintain at least one administrative office in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 388 (2R) by Senator Wright and others-

**Injured Police Canines;** Authorizing licensed life support services to transport injured police canines under certain circumstances; authorizing a paramedic or an emergency medical technician to provide emergency medical care to injured police canines under certain circumstances; providing for immunity from criminal and civil liability under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 530 (2R) by Senator Perry-

**Nonopioid Alternatives**; Authorizing certain health care practitioners to provide a specified educational pamphlet to patients in an electronic format, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 578 (2R) by Senator Wright-

**Marina Evacuations;** Prohibiting vessels under a specified weight from remaining in certain marinas that have been deemed unsuitable for refuge during a hurricane after the issuance of a hurricane watch; requiring a marina owner, operator, employee, or agent to remove specified vessels under certain circumstances; providing that such owner, operator, employee, or agent may charge the vessel owner a reasonable fee for such removal and may not be held liable for any damages as a result of such removal, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

#### SB 7052 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)-

#### Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust

**Fund/Department of Education**; Creating the Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust Fund within the Department of Education; providing the purpose of the trust fund and the source of funds; exempting the trust fund from the general revenue service charge; requiring any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year to remain in the trust fund and be available for carrying out the purpose of the trust fund; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 48 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is enacted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

#### SB 7054 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)-

**Triumph Gulf Coast Trust Fund/Department of Economic Opportunity**; Re-creating the Triumph Gulf Coast Trust Fund within the Department of Economic Opportunity without modification; removing provisions relating to the termination of the trust fund, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### SB 7056 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)-

**Trust Funds;** Terminating the Public Defenders Revenue Trust Fund within the Justice Administrative Commission; repealing provisions relating to the Public Defenders Revenue Trust Fund; terminating the Welfare Transition Trust Fund within the Department of Military Affairs; terminating the Welfare Transition Trust Fund within the Department of Health, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021
