Drones; Expanding the authorized uses of drones by law enforcement agencies, by a state agency or political subdivision, or by certified fire department personnel for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules
