Postsecondary Education; Prohibits State Board of Education and BOG from shielding students, staff, and faculty from certain speech; requires State Board of Education to conduct annual assessment on intellectual freedom & viewpoint diversity; creates a cause of action for recording or publication of certain video or audio recordings; revises provisions related to protected expressive activity, university student governments, & codes of conduct. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Appropriations; Providing moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, and supplemental appropriations for the period ending June 30, 2021, to pay salaries, and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021, or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later; however, if this act becomes law after July 1, 2021, then it shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2021

SB 2502 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Implementing the 2021-2022 General Appropriations Act; Incorporating by reference certain calculations of the Florida Education Finance Program; extending for 1 fiscal year authorization for the Department of Education to provide certain appropriated funds to certain education television stations and public colleges and universities for public broadcasting; extending for 1 year the exemption of certain rules pertaining to the medical use of marijuana from certain rulemaking requirements; authorizing the Department of Children and Families to submit a budget amendment to realign funding for implementation of the Guardianship Assistance Program, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021, or, if this act fails to become a law until after that date, it shall take effect upon becoming a law and shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2021

SB 2504 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

State Employees; Providing for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the state and certified bargaining units of state employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

SB 7018 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Rodrigues)—

Employer Contributions to Fund Retiree Benefits; Revising the employer contribution rates for the retiree health insurance subsidy as of a specified date; revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2506 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

State Group Insurance Program; Authorizing persons eligible to participate in the program to elect membership with certain health maintenance organization plans; requiring that at least one health maintenance organization plan be made available to each enrollee residing in this state; deleting a requirement that health plans be offered in specified benefit levels; removing a limitation on the annual maximum amount for coverage for medically necessary prescription and nonprescription enteral formulas and amino-acid-based elemental formulas for home use; requiring the department to ensure that the prescription drug program receives certain benefits; requiring the department to perform annual audits of such benefits, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

SB 2508 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Employee Compensation; Revising a limitation on remuneration from appropriated state funds for Florida College System institution presidents; redefining the term "public funds"; prohibiting the issuance of general salary increases without regard to employee performance when using appropriated state funds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

SB 2510 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

State Agency Law Enforcement Radio System; Revising expiration dates of provisions relating to the remission of surcharges for specified criminal offenses and noncriminal moving traffic violations to the Department of Revenue to fund the state agency law enforcement radio system and to provide technical assistance with respect to statewide systems of regional law enforcement communications, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

CS/CS/SB 1954 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Rodrigues and others—

Statewide Flooding and Sea-level Rise Resilience; Establishing the Resilient Florida Grant Program within the Department of Environmental Protection; requiring the department to complete a comprehensive statewide flood vulnerability and sea level rise data set and assessment by specified dates; requiring the department to develop an annual Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise Resilience Plan and submit the plan to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; requiring the department to implement a scoring system for assessing projects eligible for inclusion in the plan, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2512 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Documentary Stamp Tax Distributions; Revising and deleting distributions of the documentary stamp tax; providing that specified distributions may not be transferred to the General Revenue Fund; revising the purposes for which distributions may be made from the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2021, only if SB 1954 or similar legislation and SB 2514 or similar legislation are adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and become law

SB 2514 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Resilient Florida Trust Fund; Creating the Resilient Florida Trust Fund within the Department of Environmental Protection; providing for the purpose of the fund; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the fund, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect on the same date that SB 1954 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

SB 2516 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Water Storage North of Lake Okeechobee; Requiring the South Florida Water Management District to request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers seek congressional approval of a project implementation report for the Lake Okeechobee Watershed Restoration Project by a specified date; requiring the district, in partnership with the corps, to expedite the development and implementation of aquifer storage and recovery wells; requiring an annual appropriation from the Land Acquisition Trust Fund for the Lake Okeechobee Watershed Restoration Project, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 2518 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Health Care; Revising the amount of money residents of a veterans' nursing home must receive monthly before being required to contribute to their maintenance and support; revising eligibility for Medicaid coverage for children according to the resource limits under the Temporary Cash Assistance Program; deleting authorization for payment for chiropractic, hearing, optometric, podiatric, and visual services provided to Medicaid recipients; revising the years of audited disproportionate share data the agency must use for calculating an average for purposes of calculating disproportionate share payments, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

CS/SB 84 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Rodrigues—

Retirement; Providing for compulsory membership in the Florida Retirement System Investment Plan for specified employees initially enrolled on or after a specified date; modifying provisions governing participation in the investment plan for individuals who are eligible to participate in the State University System Optional Retirement Program to conform to changes made by the act; modifying provisions governing the administration of the investment plan to reflect compulsory membership for specified employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 86 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education and Senator Baxley—

Student Financial Aid; Requiring the Board of Governors of the State University System to create an online dashboard; requiring the procedures to include placing a hold on certain students' registrations; requiring the Board of Governors, the State Board of Education, and the Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida to each approve, by a specified date, a list of career certificate and undergraduate and graduate degree programs that they determine do not lead directly to employment; revising the formula for calculating how Florida Public Student Assistance Grant Program funds are distributed, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 252 (SO) by Senator Stewart and others—

Child Care Facilities; Citing this act as the "Child Safety Alarm Act"; requiring certain vehicles, by a specified date, to be equipped with a reliable alarm system that meets specified criteria; requiring the Department of Children and Families to adopt by rule minimum safety standards for such systems and to maintain a list of approved alarm manufacturers and alarm systems, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1046 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism, Senator Bean and others—

Arrest Booking Photographs; Expanding the applicability of provisions relating to the dissemination of arrest booking photographs to include a person or an entity whose primary business model is the publication or dissemination of such photographs for a commercial purpose or pecuniary gain, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 274 (SO) by Senator Perry and others—

Juvenile Diversion Program Expunction; Requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to expunge the nonjudicial arrest record of certain minors who have successfully completed a diversion program for any offense, rather than only a misdemeanor offense; authorizing a minor who successfully completes a diversion program for any offense, rather than only for a first-time misdemeanor offense, to lawfully deny or fail to acknowledge certain information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 534 (SO) by Senator Gibson and others—

Insurance Representative Examination Requirements; Exempting certain applicants for licensure as an all lines adjuster from a required examination, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 346 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez and others—

Florida Real Estate Appraisal Board; Revising the composition of the board, etc. Effective Date: 11/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 82 (SO) by Senator Baxley and others—

Sponsorship Identification Disclaimers; Modifying provisions governing general independent expenditure disclaimers to conform to changes made by the act; removing an exemption for text messages from certain requirements governing political advertisement disclaimers to conform to changes made by the act; establishing sponsorship identification disclaimer requirements for certain text messages; modifying existing requirements governing telephone call disclaimers; requiring specified persons and organizations sending certain paid text messages to have and maintain a registered agent for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Restitution; Providing for the purposes of restitution in a criminal proceeding; specifying the standards for valuation of a restitution order; authorizing a court to consider hearsay evidence regarding valuation of a restitution award under certain circumstances; providing for the purposes of restitution in a delinquency proceeding; specifying the standards for valuation of a restitution order; authorizing a court to consider hearsay evidence regarding valuation of a restitution award under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

CS/SB 286 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Perry—

Fire Sprinklers; Revising the definition of the term “Contractor V”; authorizing certain fire protection system contractors to design certain systems; revising the definition of the term “fire protection system”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Banking and Insurance reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 602 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Burgess—

Business Organizations; Revising requirements relating to inspecting certain records of limited liability companies; revising the circumstances under which shareholders are entitled to appraisal rights and certain payments; entitling corporations to prepay a shareholder if the shareholder makes a demand for payment; revising requirements for proceedings relating to unsettled demands for payment, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Documentary Stamp Tax Distributions; Revising and deleting distributions of the documentary stamp tax; providing that specified distributions may not be transferred to the General Revenue Fund; revising the purposes for which distributions may be made from the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2021, only if SB 1954 or similar legislation and SB 2514 or similar legislation are adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and become law

SB 2514 (2R1) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Resilient Florida Trust Fund; Creating the Resilient Florida Trust Fund within the Department of Environmental Protection; providing for the purpose of the fund; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the fund, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect on the same date that SB 1954 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

SB 2516 (2R1) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Water Storage North of Lake Okeechobee; Requiring the South Florida Water Management District to request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers seek congressional approval of a project implementation report for the Lake Okeechobee Watershed Restoration Project by a specified date; requiring the district, in partnership with the corps, to expedite the development and implementation of aquifer storage and recovery wells; requiring an annual appropriation from the Land Acquisition Trust Fund for the Lake Okeechobee Watershed Restoration Project, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 2518 (2R1) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Health Care; Revising the amount of money residents of a veterans' nursing home must receive monthly before being required to contribute to their maintenance and support; revising eligibility for Medicaid coverage for children according to the resource limits under the Temporary Cash Assistance Program; deleting authorization for payment for chiropractic, hearing, optometric, podiatric, and visual services provided to Medicaid recipients; revising the years of audited disproportionate share data the agency must use for calculating an average for purposes of calculating disproportionate share payments, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

SB 7018 (2R1) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Rodrigues)—

Employer Contributions to Fund Retiree Benefits; Revising the employer contribution rates for the retiree health insurance subsidy as of a specified date; revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021
