### CS/CS/SB 48 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education, Senator Diaz and others—

**Educational Scholarship Programs;** Requiring the Auditor General to conduct certain audits at least every 3 years instead of annually; adding certain students to those to whom district school boards must provide preferential treatment in the controlled open enrollment process; establishing the McKay-Gardiner Scholarship Program; revising the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program; repealing the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program; providing that private virtual schools meet the requirement to maintain a physical location in this state if such virtual schools maintain at least one administrative office in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

### CS/SB 268 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Perry—

**Preemption of Local Occupational Licensing;** Preempting licensing of occupations to the state; prohibiting local governments from imposing additional licensing requirements or modifying licensing unless specified conditions are met; specifying that certain specialty contractors are not required to register with the Construction Industry Licensing Board; authorizing counties and municipalities to issue certain journeyman licenses, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/SB 582 (2R) by the Committees on Education, Judiciary, Senator Rodrigues and others—**

**Parental Rights;** Creating the "Parents' Bill of Rights"; prohibiting the state, its political subdivisions, other governmental entities, or other institutions from infringing on parental rights unless specified conditions are met; requiring each district school board to develop and adopt a policy to promote parental involvement in the public school system; prohibiting health care practitioners and their employees from providing health care services or prescribing medicinal drugs to a minor child without a parent's written consent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 622 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Perry—**

**Liens and Bonds;** Requiring that a copy of a notice of nonpayment be served on the surety; prohibiting a person from requiring a claimant to furnish a certain waiver in exchange for or to induce certain payments; authorizing a lienor to record one claim of lien for multiple direct contracts; revising information to be included in a notice of commencement; requiring service of documents relating to construction bonds to be made in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 952 (2R) by Senator Burgess—**

**Water Management Districts;** Authorizing water management districts to purchase commodities and contractual services from the contracts of other specified entities under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 1140 (2R) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Rodrigues and others—**

**Unlawful Use of DNA;** Citing this act as as the "Protecting DNA Privacy Act"; prohibiting DNA analysis and disclosure of DNA analysis results without express consent; prohibiting the collection or retention of a DNA sample of another person without express consent for specified purposes; prohibiting specified DNA analysis and disclosure of DNA analysis results without express consent, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 1378 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bradley—**

**Corporate Espionage;** Citing this act as the "Combating Corporate Espionage in Florida Act"; prohibiting theft of a trade secret; prohibiting trafficking in trade secrets; providing criminal penalties; reclassifying the criminal penalty and increasing the offense severity ranking for an offense committed with specified intent, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/SB 1734 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Commerce and Tourism and Senator Bradley—**

**Consumer Data Privacy;** Citing this act as the "Florida Privacy Protection Act"; requiring certain businesses that collect consumer personal information to provide certain information to the consumer; providing that consumers have the right to direct certain businesses not to sell their personal information; prohibiting businesses from selling the personal information of consumers younger than a specified age without express authorization from the consumer or the consumer's parent or guardian under certain circumstances; authorizing consumers to initiate civil actions for violations; providing civil remedies, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

**CS/CS/SB 1788 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Community Affairs and Senator Boyd—**

**Construction Permits;** Revising the requirements for when a county may request certain information; authorizing all components of a completed application to be submitted electronically or in person; requiring a local enforcement agency to reduce a building permit fee by a specified percentage for failing to meet certain deadlines; requiring a local government or a local building department, respectively, to reduce a building permit fee or master building permit fee, as applicable, by a specified percentage for failing to meet certain deadlines, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

**CS/SB 1802 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Pizzo—**

**Interception of Wire, Oral, or Electronic Communications Made in Violation of Protective Orders;** Providing an exception to prohibitions on interception and recording of communications when the communication is received in violation of a specified injunction or order; limiting the use of the intercepted communication to evidencing a violation of the specified injunction or order, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

**SB 1850 (2R) by Senator Perry—**

**Electronic Threats;** Prohibiting a person from sending, posting, or transmitting, or from procuring the sending, posting, or transmission of a written or electronic record when in such record the person makes a threat to kill or to do bodily harm to another person or to conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2021

**CS/CS/SB 1892 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Diaz—**

**Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund;** Creating the Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund within the Executive Office of the Governor; providing for the deposit and use of funds; providing for future review and termination of the fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2021

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

**CS/CS/SB 2006 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Appropriations and Senator Burgess—**

**Emergency Management;** Authorizing the Legislative Budget Commission to convene to transfer certain funds to the Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund; requiring that the state comprehensive emergency management plan provide for certain public health emergency communications and include the Department of Health's public health emergency plan; redefining the term "essentials" to include personal protective equipment used during public health emergencies; specifying that a political subdivision has the burden of proving the proper exercise of its police power in the issuance of certain emergency orders, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2021

**SB 7052 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—**

**Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust Fund/Department of Education;** Creating the Florida K-12 Education Tax Credit Program Trust Fund within the Department of Education; providing the purpose of the trust fund and the source of funds; exempting the trust fund from the general revenue service charge; requiring any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year to remain in the trust fund and be available for carrying out the purpose of the trust fund; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the trust fund, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 48 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is enacted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

**SB 7064 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism (Hooper)—**

**Public Records/Investigations by the Department of Legal Affairs;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information relating to investigations by the Department of Legal Affairs and law enforcement agencies of certain data privacy violations; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1734 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

**CS/HB 9 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary Committee, Representative Zika and others—**

**Protecting Consumers Against Pandemic-related Fraud;** Defines "personal protective equipment"; prohibits dissemination of false or misleading information relating to personal protective equipment with specified intent; prohibits dissemination of false or misleading vaccine information with specified intent; authorizes state attorney or statewide prosecutor to prosecute violation; authorizes AG to seek civil remedies. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

**HB 529 (2R) by Representative Fine and others—**

**Moments of Silence in Public Schools;** Requires principals to require teachers to set aside time for moment of silence; prohibits teachers from making suggestions to nature of any reflection during moment of silence; deletes provision authorizing district school boards to provide brief period of silent prayer or meditation; requires certain teachers encourage parents or guardians to discuss moment of silence & make suggestions as to the best use of this time. Effective Date: 07/01/2021
