CS/CS/CS/SB 736, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Hutson—

Construction Defect and Building Code Violation Claims; Revising the limitations period for certain actions founded on the design, planning, or construction of an improvement to real property; revising the circumstances under which a person has a cause of action for a violation of the Florida Building Code; requiring a notice of claim to include an inspection report that is verified by the person conducting the inspection; requiring the court to stay an action if a claimant initiates an action without first accepting or rejecting a supplemental offer, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2022

SB 2500 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Appropriations; Providing moneys for the annual period beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, and supplemental appropriations for the period ending June 30, 2022, to pay salaries, and other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, and other improvements, and for other specified purposes of the various agencies of state government, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later; however, if this act becomes law after July 1, 2022, then it shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2022

SB 2502 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Implementing the 2022-2023 General Appropriations Act; Incorporating by reference certain calculations of the Florida Education Finance Program; authorizing the Board of Trustees of the University of Florida to use funds to establish the Hamilton Center for Classical and Civic Education; authorizing the Agency for Health Care Administration, in consultation with the Department of Health, to submit a budget amendment to realign funding for a component of the Children's Medical Services program to reflect actual enrollment changes; extending for 1 year the exemption of certain rules pertaining to the medical use of marijuana from certain rulemaking requirements; specifying the manner by which state funds for postsecondary workforce programs may be used for inmate education, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or, if this act fails to become a law until after that date, it shall take effect upon becoming a law and shall operate retroactively to July 1, 2022

SB 2504 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

State Employees; Providing for the resolution of collective bargaining issues at impasse between the state and certified bargaining units of state employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 7038 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Brandes)—

Retirement; Revising the employer contribution rates for the retiree health insurance subsidy as of a specified date; revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class of the Florida Retirement System, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 2506 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Ratification of Department of Management Services Rules; Ratifying specified rules relating to health maintenance organization plan regions established by department rule for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 110.123(3)(h)2.d., F.S., which requires ratification of the rules in order for them to take effect, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 2530 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Motor Vehicle Title Fees; Requiring that a specified amount of certain excess motor vehicle title fee collections in any fiscal year be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2528 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Trust Funds/Opioid Settlement Trust Fund; Creating the Opioid Settlement Trust Fund within the Department of Children and Families; providing for sources of moneys; providing for reversion of unencumbered and undisbursed balances; providing for future review and termination of the fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2526 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Health; Providing an appropriation to the Board of Directors of the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute for a specified purpose; authorizing pharmacists and wholesalers employed by or under contract with forensic facilities managed by the Agency for Persons with Disabilities to import prescription drugs under the Canadian Prescription Drug Importation Program for dispensing to clients in such facilities; requiring that the Department of Children and Families' contracts with managing entities be made available on the department's website; deleting a requirement that the Agency for Health Care Administration collect and publish on its website certain data related to the retail prices of specified prescribed medicines, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2524 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Education; Revising the maximum number of students for whom scholarships are established under the Family Empowerment Scholarship Program, beginning in specified school years; requiring the Department of Education to provide incentives to school readiness personnel and prekindergarten instructors who meet specified requirements, subject to the appropriation of funds for that purpose; revising requirements for materials assigned for use within dual enrollment courses; creating the Inclusive Transition and Employment Management Program; creating the Seal of Excellence in Advancing Literacy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2522 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

District Courts of Appeal; Revising the number of district courts of appeal from five to six; revising the headquarters of the Second Appellate District; revising the number of judges in the present appellate districts; revising which offices of the public defender handle appellate duties in an appellate district; assigning the public defender of the tenth judicial circuit to the Sixth Appellate District, etc. Effective Date: Except as expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

SB 2520 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Department of Financial Services Opioid Settlement Clearing Trust Fund; Creating the Department of Financial Services Opioid Settlement Clearing Trust Fund; providing an exemption from specified service charges; providing for disbursement of funds to the opioid settlement trust funds of the various agencies; prohibiting the investment of such moneys; exempting the trust fund from constitutional termination, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 2518 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Information Technology; Providing for a type two transfer of the specified functions and components of the Florida Digital Service to the Executive Office of the Governor; creating the Enterprise Florida First Technology Center within the Executive Office of the Governor; requiring the center to consult with the Department of Management Services to establish an information technology policy for specified procurement activities; providing that the director of the Office of Policy and Budget, rather than the Secretary of Management Services, is the executive director of advisory council, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2516 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Office of the Judges of Compensation Claims; Deleting a requirement for the office to maintain district offices and personnel at a certain level, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 2514 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Electronic Filing of Taxes; Reducing the threshold at which the executive director of the Department of Revenue may require a taxpayer to electronically file returns and remit payments, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2023

SB 2512 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Aircraft; Creating the executive aircraft pool within the Department of Management Services; requiring that state officials who request use of or travel in pool aircraft ensure that such use or travel comply with specified provisions; providing that the use of such aircraft is on a first-call, first-served basis, except in the event of a scheduling conflict the priority order applies; requiring the department, in consultation with the state chief information officer, to annually publish a list of approved drone manufacturers from which a governmental agency may purchase or acquire drones, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2510 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Florida Gaming Control Commission; Deleting a requirement that a commissioner be appointed from each appellate district; exempting certain state agency employees who are registered lobbyists from the prohibition against being appointed to or employed by the commission; requiring the commission to evaluate slot license fees and make specified recommendations to the Legislature before a specified date; revising applicability for game promotions in connection with the sale of consumer products or services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

SB 2508 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations (Stargel)—

Environmental Resources; Providing that certain land acquisitions are not required to meet specified valuation procedures; providing requirements for budget amendments requesting the release of state funds for specified water project components; requiring the South Florida Water Management District to make a specified certification to the Legislature regarding its recommendations to the United States Army Corps of Engineers for new or modified Lake Okeechobee provisions, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2022

SB 534 (SO) by Senator Harrell—

Prescription Drugs Used in the Treatment of Schizophrenia for Medicaid Recipients; Authorizing the approval of drug products or certain medication prescribed for the treatment of schizophrenia or schizotypal or delusional disorders for Medicaid recipients who have not met the step-therapy prior authorization criteria, when the drug product or certain medication meets specified criteria, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 706 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Education, Community Affairs and Senator Perry—

School Concurrence; Revising provisions specifying when school concurrence is deemed satisfied; requiring a district school board to notify a local government that capacity is available for development within a certain timeframe; specifying that proportionate-share mitigation must be set aside and not spent if an improvement has not been identified, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 772 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Diaz and others—

Protection of Victims and Witnesses; Revising the standard for orders to protect certain testifying victims and witnesses; prohibiting depositions of certain victims and witnesses in certain proceedings without a showing of good cause; revising factors to be considered by a court in a motion seeking to protect a victim or witness; requiring the court to appoint a guardian ad litem or other advocate for the deponent under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1062 (SO) by the Committees on Commerce and Tourism, Judiciary and Senator Bradley—

Service of Process; Authorizing the Department of State to electronically receive service of process under ch. 48, F.S.; revising procedures for service on partnerships, limited liability partnerships, and limited partnerships; requiring designation of registered agents and registered offices by certain partnerships, corporations, and companies; revising provisions related to service on public agencies and officers; providing for substituted service on certain nonresidents and foreign business entities and on individuals and foreign business entities concealing their whereabouts, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect January 2, 2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1260 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Gruters—

Independent Hospital Districts; Authorizing the governing body of an independent hospital district to evaluate certain benefits of the potential conversion of the independent hospital district to a nonprofit entity under certain circumstances; requiring that the evaluation be completed and the final report be presented to the governing body within a specified timeframe; requiring the governing body to negotiate and complete an agreement with the board of county commissioners for each affected county before converting the independent hospital district to a nonprofit entity; prohibiting members of the board of county commissioners for counties party to such agreements from serving on the board of the successor nonprofit entity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 170 (SO) by Senator Polsky and others—

Public Records/Lottery Winners; Creating a temporary exemption from public records for the names of lottery winners who win prizes of more than a specified value; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

*Identical to **HB 159(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

CS/CS/SB 1536 (SO) by the Committees on Commerce and Tourism, Banking and Insurance and Senator Boyd—

Money Services Businesses; Providing that a rule may require certain reports to the Office of Financial Regulation to contain declarations by control persons, rather than officers or other responsible persons; providing that control persons, rather than officers, are not liable for loss or damages under certain circumstances; requiring licensees to report changes in control persons, rather than certain other entities or persons; repealing a provision relating to control of a money services business, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1680 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Gruters—

Financial Institutions; Providing that the failure of foreign nationals to participate through video conference in certain hearings is grounds for denial of certain applications; revising the circumstances under which the Office of Financial Regulation is required to conduct certain examinations; revising the entities that may acquire liabilities and assets, and the liabilities and assets that may be acquired, according to certain procedures, conditions, and limitations; requiring the office, upon receiving applications for authority to organize a bank or trust company, to investigate the need for a target market and the ability of the primary service area or target market to support proposed and existing bank or trust facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1534 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Boyd and others—

Retail Theft; Prohibiting certain retail theft at multiple locations within a specified timeframe; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1000 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Albritton—

Nutrient Application Rates; Defining the terms “certified professional” and “site-specific nutrient management”; authorizing the use of site-specific nutrient management in specified circumstances; authorizing citrus producers to use written recommendations from certified professionals to tailor their recommended nutrient application rates under certain circumstances; directing the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences to analyze the use of site-specific nutrient management for certain crops, develop a research plan and certain recommendations, and submit a report to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Committee on Agriculture reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 1058 (SO) by Senator Hutson—

Property Insurer Reimbursements; Defining the term “unsound insurer”; revising requirements for coverage under the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund of certain policies assumed by authorized insurers or the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1002 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Burgess—

Florida Citrus; Citing this act as the “Citrus Recovery Act”; revising the membership of the Florida Citrus Commission; increasing the number of citrus districts in this state and revising the counties that comprise each district; requiring certain entities to provide reports on citrus production research to the commission at specified intervals and upon request of the commission; requiring that new varieties of citrus fruit produced from research or studies funded by state funds be made exclusively available for licensing and commercialization to the Department of Citrus or its designee for a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SM 174 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism, Senator Pizzo and others—

Trade; Urging Congress to expeditiously renew trade promotion authority for the executive branch, urging the executive branch to negotiate a comprehensive and mutually beneficial free trade agreement between the United States and the United Kingdom, and urging Congress to ratify such agreement, etc.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 7030 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Pizzo)—

OGSR/Health Information of an Inmate or an Offender; Amending a provision which provides exemptions from public records requirements for protected health information of an inmate or an offender, and for the identity of any inmate or offender upon whom an HIV test has been performed and the inmate's or offender's test results; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemptions, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 7032 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Pizzo)—

OGSR/Criminal Intelligence Information or Criminal Investigative Information; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for criminal intelligence information or criminal investigative information that reveals the personal identifying information of a witness to a murder; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 264 (SO) by Senator Hooper—

Firefighter Inquiries and Investigations; Providing that firefighters have certain rights during an informal inquiry; providing that a firefighter may not be threatened with certain disciplinary action during an informal inquiry or interrogation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

*Identical to **HB 31(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

SB 350 (SO) by Senator Bean—

Procedures for Petitions for Utility Rate Relief; Increasing the maximum annual sales, expressed in gigawatt hours, which natural gas or public electric utilities may have to be eligible to request that the Public Service Commission use certain procedures for the utility's petition for rate relief, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 806 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Perry and others—

Alzheimer's Disease and Related Forms of Dementia Education and Public Awareness; Creating the "Ramping up Education of Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia for You (READY) Act"; requiring the Department of Health to educate certain health care practitioners regarding specified information related to Alzheimer's disease and related forms of dementia, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 914 (SO) by Senator Harrell—
