BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, MARCH 2, 2022

HB 5301 (SO) by the Committee on State Administration and Technology Appropriations Subcommittee and Representative Stevenson—

Capitol Center; Provides certain facilities projects within Capitol Complex must be developed in consultation with, & may not be implemented, changed, or amended unless approved by certain persons; prohibits construction & placement of monument on premises of Capitol Complex unless design & placement of such monument is approved by certain persons after considering recommendations of certain entities; requires DMS to consult with Governor, President of Senate, & Speaker of House of Representatives before closing & reopening buildings within Capitol Center during declared state of emergency; requires DMS to provide annual maintenance & upkeep report; provides specifications for report. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Appropriations

HB 5015 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations Committee and Representative Perez—

Evaluation of Significant State Risks; Creates Legislative Office of Risk Assessment; provides office shall be headed by chief risk officer; requires office to develop & update State Risk Register; provides specifications for State Risk Register; requires office to biennially submit register & certain list to LBC; requires office to submit annual progress report to Legislature; establishes Risk Estimating Conference; requires conference to estimate economic damage associated with risks identified in register. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Appropriations

HB 5011 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations Committee and Representative Trumbull—

Budgeting for Inflation that Drives Elevated Needs Fund; Creates Budgeting for Inflation that Drives Elevated Needs Fund within EOG; provides purpose of fund; provides for deposit & use of funds; provides for future review & termination of fund; directs CFO to transfer specified sum to fund. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 1712 (SO) by Senator Burgess and others—

Veteran Suicide Prevention Training Pilot Program; Requiring the Department of Veterans' Affairs to establish the pilot program; requiring pilot program participants to receive certain training; requiring the department to contract with an organization to develop the curriculum for such training; requiring the department to submit an annual report to the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 1358 (SO) by Senator Rouson—

Task Force on the Monitoring of Children in Out-of-Home Care; Creating the task force adjunct to the Department of Law Enforcement; requiring the department to provide certain services; requiring the Florida Institute for Child Welfare to conduct certain focus groups and submit its findings to the task force by a specified date; requiring the Department of Children and Families to submit certain monthly reports to the task force through a specified date; requiring the task force to submit a report to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; providing for future repeal, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 160 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Harrell—

Transportation-related Facility Designations; Providing honorary designations of certain transportation facilities in specified counties; directing the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 940 (SO) by Senator Baxley—

Professional Structural Engineers; Prohibiting a person who is not licensed as an engineer from using a specified name or title; authorizing the Board of Professional Engineers to refuse to certify an applicant for a professional structural engineer license for certain reasons; providing licensure and application requirements for a professional structural engineer license; specifying acts that constitute grounds for disciplinary action, including civil penalties, against a professional structural engineer, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 7012 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Environment and Natural Resources (Brodeur)—

Cleanup of Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl; Requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to adopt rules for statewide cleanup target levels for perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances in soil and groundwater by a specified date; prohibiting such rules from taking effect until ratified by the Legislature; providing that certain persons are not subject to administrative or judicial action under certain circumstances; providing that certain statutes of limitations are tolled from a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1952 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Albritton—

Evidence of Vendor Financial Stability; Authorizing an agency, in making a certain determination, to establish financial stability criteria and require a demonstration of financial stability; providing that an agency that requires a vendor to demonstrate financial stability during a competitive solicitation process must accept certain evidence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1614 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Transportation and Senator Harrell—

Public Records/Motor Vehicle Crashes/Traffic Citations; Revising agencies to which a public records exemption for certain motor vehicle crash reports applies; revising the types of crash reports that may be made immediately available to certain radio and television stations and newspapers; providing a public records exemption for certain electronic crash data; providing an exemption from public records requirements for driver information contained in a uniform traffic citation; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing statements of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 03/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1402 (SO) by Senator Burgess—

Domestic Surplus Lines Insurance; Defining the term “domestic surplus lines insurer”; providing for the eligibility of domestic surplus lines insurers; subjecting and exempting surplus lines insurers and surplus lines policies from certain requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 1244 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Gibson—

Statutes of Limitations for Sexual Offenses; Eliminating statutes of limitations periods for prosecution of specified sexual offenses, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1338 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Diaz—

Floating Solar Facilities; Defining the term “floating solar facility”; providing that a floating solar facility must be a permitted use in appropriate land use categories in each local government’s comprehensive plan; requiring each local government to amend its development regulations to promote the expanded use of floating solar facilities; requiring the Office of Energy within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to submit specified recommendations to the Legislature to provide a regulatory framework relating to floating solar facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/CS/HB 1411(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1326 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Rodriguez and others—

Comprehensive Review Study of the Central and Southern Florida Project; Requiring the South Florida Water Management District to prepare and submit a consolidated annual report regarding the status of a specified study to the Office of Economic and Demographic Research, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Governor, and the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 513(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1246 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Gruters—

Benchmark Replacements for the London Interbank Offered Rate; Requiring that recommended benchmark replacements selected or recommended by specified persons be benchmark replacements on the United States dollar London Interbank Offered Rate (LIBOR) replacement date for certain contracts, securities, and instruments; authorizing specified persons to select benchmark replacements under certain circumstances; requiring benchmark replacement conforming changes to become an integral part of contracts, securities, and instruments under certain circumstances; providing that a person is not liable for damages and is not subject to claims and requests for equitable relief under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to CS/HB 925(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 630 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Jones and others—

Pregnant Women in Custody; Citing this act as "Ava's Law"; requiring that every female who is arrested and not released on bond within 72 hours after arrest be administered a pregnancy test within a specified timeframe, upon her request; authorizing a sentencing court to stay the beginning of the period of incarceration for up to a certain timeframe for a pregnant woman convicted of any offense; authorizing a sentencing court to order a pregnant woman to comply with specified terms and conditions during the stay of the incarceration, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/HB 5 (SO) by the Committee on Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee, Representatives Grall, Persons-Mulicka and others—

Reducing Fetal and Infant Mortality; Revises purpose & requirements for Comprehensive Statewide Tobacco Education & Use Prevention Program; requires DOH to contract with local healthy start coalitions for creation of fetal & infant mortality review committees; prohibits physician from performing abortion if gestational age of fetus is determined to be more than specified number of weeks; provides exception; requires directors of certain medical facilities & certain physicians to submit monthly report to AHCA electronically; requires hospitals participate in minimum number of quality improvement initiatives. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 292 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Polsky and others—

Newborn Screenings; Requiring hospitals and other state-licensed birthing facilities to test for congenital cytomegalovirus in newborns within a specified timeframe under certain circumstances; revising the timeframe in which health care providers attending home births must make certain referrals; requiring a newborn's primary health care provider to refer the newborn for testing for congenital cytomegalovirus under certain circumstances; requiring that certain test results be reported to the Department of Health within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1010 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Health Policy and Senator Gibson—

Uterine Fibroid Research and Education; Requiring the Department of Health to develop and maintain an electronic database of information related to uterine fibroids; requiring health care providers to submit certain information to the department for inclusion in the database; prohibiting the database from including any personal identifying information; requiring the department to develop and include information related to uterine fibroids in certain literature currently made available to the public for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 1210 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Albritton—

Pollution Control Standards and Liability; Providing that the Secretary of Environmental Protection has exclusive jurisdiction in setting standards or procedures for evaluating environmental conditions and assessing potential liability for the presence of contaminants on certain agricultural lands; prohibiting the secretary from delegating such authority to a local governmental entity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Committee on Agriculture reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

*Identical to **CS/HB 909(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 1194 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Boyd and others—

Local Tax Referenda Requirements; Requiring referenda elections related to tourist development taxes, tourist impact taxes, and children's services and independent special district property taxes to be held on the day of a general election; requiring referenda elections related to increases in county and municipal ad valorem tax millages to be held on the day of a general election; requiring referenda elections related to local option fuel taxes to be held on the day of a general election, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; the Committee on Finance and Tax reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 777(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/SB 898 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Stewart and others—

Tenant Safety; Citing this act as "Miya's Law"; requiring landlords of nontransient or transient apartments to require employees to undergo background screenings as a condition of employment; authorizing landlords to disqualify persons from employment under certain circumstances relating to criminal offenses; revising what constitutes reasonable notice for repairs of dwelling units; requiring public lodging establishments licensed as nontransient or transient apartments to take certain actions relating to employee background screenings and keys for dwelling units, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government recommends the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 780 (SO) by Senator Hutson—

Airports; Revising the types of airports eligible for specified funding of master planning and eligible aviation development projects by the Florida Department of Transportation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

*Identical to **HB 631(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/SB 796 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Bradley—

Tampering with or Fabricating Physical Evidence; Providing enhanced criminal penalties for tampering with or fabricating physical evidence in certain criminal proceedings and investigations, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

*Identical to **CS/HB 287(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

CS/SB 268 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Diaz—

Proclamation of "Victims of Communism Day"; Requiring the Governor to proclaim November 7 annually as "Victims of Communism Day"; requiring the day to be observed in public schools and by public exercise; requiring a day other than November 7 to be observed by public schools under a specified circumstance; requiring certain high school students to receive specified instruction on Victims of Communism Day, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/HB 395(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/SB 1808 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Bean and others—

Immigration Enforcement; Revising the definition of the term "sanctuary policy" to include specified laws, policies, practices, procedures, or customs that limit or prohibit a law enforcement agency from providing specified immigration information to a state entity; requiring each law enforcement agency operating a county detention facility to enter into a specified agreement with the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement to assist with immigration enforcement; prohibiting a governmental entity from executing, amending, or renewing a contract with common carriers or contracted carriers under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 340 (SO) by Senator Garcia—

Care of Students with Epilepsy or Seizure Disorders; Providing for the creation of an individualized seizure action plan for a student with epilepsy or seizure disorders to receive health care at school; requiring school nurses or appropriate school employees to coordinate the care of such students and ensure that specified training is provided to specified school employees and individuals; requiring school districts to provide specified information and training to school bus drivers who transport students with epilepsy or seizure disorders; providing immunity from liability under certain conditions, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

*Similar to **CS/HB 173(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 224 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Gruters and others—

Regulation of Smoking in Public Places; Authorizing counties and municipalities to further restrict smoking within the boundaries of public beaches and public parks under certain circumstances, with exceptions; requiring that any signs installed in relation to such restrictions include certain information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

*Similar to **CS/HB 105, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

CS/SB 1002 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Burgess—

Florida Citrus; Citing this act as the "Citrus Recovery Act"; revising the membership of the Florida Citrus Commission; increasing the number of citrus districts in this state and revising the counties that comprise each district; requiring certain entities to provide reports on citrus production research to the commission at specified intervals and upon request of the commission; requiring that new varieties of citrus fruit produced from research or studies funded by state funds be made exclusively available for licensing and commercialization to the Department of Citrus or its designee for a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/HB 1097(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

CS/SB 1026 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Cruz and others—

Living Organ Donors in Insurance Policies; Prohibiting insurers under specified policies from declining or limiting coverages and discriminating against persons based solely on their status as living organ donors, and from precluding insureds from donating organs; authorizing the Financial Services Commission to adopt rules and take actions to enforce specified laws, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Health Policy reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

*Similar to **CS/HB 1099(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

SM 1108 (SO) by Senator Baxley—
