# CS/HB 3 (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations Committee, Representatives Leek, Brannan and others—

#### Law Enforcement Officer, Benefits, Recruitment, and Training; Revises salary minimums for county sheriffs; provides for adoption benefits for law enforcements officers; creates Florida Law Enforcement Recruitment Bonus Payment Program: provides exemption from certain law enforcement officer training requirements for military veterans; provides requirements for skills training for law enforcement officers relating to officer health & safety; makes children of law enforcement officers eligible for Family Empowerment Scholarships; encourages school districts to establish public safety telecommunication training programs & offer law enforcement explorer programs; requires Board of Governors & State Board of Education to create process that enables eligible law enforcement officers or former officers to earn credit for college-level training & education acquired while serving an officer; creates Florida Law Enforcement Academy Scholarship Program; provides for reimbursement for out-of-state & special operations forces law enforcement equivalency training. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

# CS/HB 7, 2nd Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Education and Employment Committee and Representative Avila—

Individual Freedom; Provides that subjecting individuals to specified concepts under certain circumstances constitutes discrimination based on race, color, sex, or national origin; revising requirements for required instruction on the history of African Americans; requiring the department to prepare and offer certain standards and curriculum; authorizing the department to seek input from a specified organization for certain purposes; prohibits instructional materials reviewers from recommending instructional materials that contain any matter that contradicts certain principles; requires DOE to review school district professional development systems for compliance with certain provisions of law. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

# CS/HB 1467, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Appropriations Committee, Representative Garrison and others—

**K-12 Education**; Establishing term limits for school board members; deleting a requirement that district school boards maintain a specified list on their websites; requiring certain meetings relating to instructional materials to be noticed and open to the public; revising requirements for the department relating to the development of training programs for the selection of materials used in schools and library media centers; revising district school board requirements for the selection and adoption of certain materials, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

# CS/HB 7049 (3R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Judiciary Committee, Representatives Grall, Fine and others—

Legal Notices; Revises requirements for newspapers publishing legal notices; removes option for publication on newspaper's website; provides for publication of legal notices on publicly accessible websites; authorizes governmental agency to publish legal notices on publicly accessible website; authorizes governmental agency with certain percentage of its population located within county meeting population threshold to use publicly accessible website; requires governmental agency to provide specified notice to residents & property owners relating to alternative methods of receiving notices; provides requirement for public bid advertisements made by governmental agencies on publicly accessible websites. Effective Date: 01/01/2023

CS/CS/HB 861 (SO) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Committee, Professions and Public Health Subcommittee and Representative Massullo—

**Medical Specialty Designations;** Provides that using term designating certain medical specialty is grounds for disciplinary action; provides enforcement authority; authorizes DOH to adopt rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Rules

### CS/CS/SB 1702 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Regulated Industries, Senator Bradley and others—

**Building Safety;** Defining the term "milestone inspection"; specifying that the purpose of a milestone inspection is not to determine compliance with the Florida Building Code or the firesafety code; requiring certain associations to periodically have a study conducted relating to required reserves after a specified date; requiring associations to provide for the maintenance, repair, and replacement of condominium property; authorizing boards to adopt a special assessment or borrow money for certain reasons without unit owner approval; revising certification and education requirements for directors of association boards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/HB 455 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Trabulsy—

**Rupert J Smith Law Library, St. Lucie County;** Provides for appointment of an additional member to board of trustees. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 457 (LB) by Representative Trabulsy—

**St. Lucie County**; Provides for transfer of real property from Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund to District Board of Trustees of Indian River State College; provides requirements for the use, sale or disposition, & conveyance of property. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law or on June 1, 2022, whichever occurs earlier

#### HB 471 (LB) by Representative Roth-

Town of Lake Clarke Shores, Palm Beach County; Provides for municipal annexation of specified territory; provides boundaries, & that specified territory be considered enclave of Town of Lake Clarke Shores. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 497 (LB) by Representative Persons-Mulicka and others—

Lee County School District, Lee County; Repeals Lee County School Board resolution which provides for appointed superintendent of schools; provides for elected superintendent of schools & referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of the qualified electors of Lee County voting in a referendum conducted in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections currently in force.

### HB 535 (LB) by Representative Fine-

Barefoot Bay Recreation District, Brevard County; Authorizes amendment to district charter, subject to approval by vote of electors of district, to increase length of terms & stagger election cycle for members of Board of Trustees of the Barefoot Bay Recreation District. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 651 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Williamson—

Navarre Beach Fire Rescue District, Santa Rosa County; Creates independent special district to provide fire control, fire prevention, emergency medical, rescue response, & public safety services; provides district boundaries; provides for governing board & for the election, organization, and operation of such board; authorizes district to levy non-ad valorem assessments; provides for amendment only by special act; provides severability & referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors residing within the district voting in a referendum no later than December 31, 2022

#### HB 895 (LB) by Representative McFarland—

Lakewood Ranch Stewardship District, Manatee and Sarasota Counties; Revises boundaries of district; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon this act becoming a law

### HB 927 (LB) by Representative Hage—

Downtown Crystal River Entertainment District, Citrus County; Designates boundaries of entertainment district within downtown area of city; authorizes DBPR to issue special licenses or modify existing licensees for bona fide licensees operating validly licensed premises within such entertainment district for sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off premises; provides special licenses or modifications of existing licenses are in addition to other authorized temporary permits; requires bona fide licensees to comply with all other statutory requirements. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 929 (LB) by Representative Silvers-

City of West Palm Beach, Palm Beach County; Revises definition of "salary"; provides definition does not include certain persons in a collective bargaining agreement; provides for retroactive restoration of benefit accrual rate to 3 percent for all years of member's service within specified time period; provides eligible members receive lump-sum payment for accumulated leave payable upon retirement. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 993 (LB) by Representative Tuck—

Sebring Airport Authority, Highlands County; Revises powers of Authority; authorizes Authority to issue bonds secured by & payable from any legally available source, to issue bonds on unsecured basis, to pledge all legally available funds for repayment of debt, & to enter into public-private partnerships to effectuate purposes of act; revises bidding threshold; provides all debt obligations issued by authority are tax exempt to extent allowed by law. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 995 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Hage—

Sumter County; Creates The Village's Independent Fire Control & Rescue District; provides boundaries; provides for district board of commissioners & membership, officers, & meetings thereof; provides powers & duties of district & board & appointment & terms of office; provides for modification of district boundaries & for amendment of charter by special act of Legislature; requires referendum. Effective Date: Only upon its approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors residing within the district voting in a referendum to be held no later than December 31, 2023

### HB 1045 (LB) by Representative Buchanan-

West Villages Improvement District, Sarasota County; Revises boundaries of district; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 1047 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Gregory—

Cedar Hammock Fire Control District, Manatee County; Revises boundaries; provides for expansion of district; authorizes district to provide fire control & emergency medical services, levy & collect taxes, assessments, & fees, & administer fire rescue programs & services within district's expanded boundaries; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# CS/HB 1049, 1st Eng. (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Gregory—

**Trailer Estates Fire Control District, Manatee County;** Abolishes district; transfers assets of district. Effective Date: 09/30/2022

#### HB 1103 (LB) by Representative Gregory—

North River Ranch Improvement Stewardship District, Manatee County; Revises boundaries of district. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1105 (LB) by Representative Truenow—

Lake County Water District, Lake County; Provides district is dependent special taxing district; provides for appointment of members to board of advisors; deletes provisions relating to development, ownership, maintenance, or operation of certain parks by Lake County Water Authority & authorizing board of advisors to sell or donate land for parks; requires Board of County Commissioners of Lake County to consider & approve, modify, or reject annual budget & millage proposed by board of advisors & approve district's final budget & millage; requires district revenue to be used only for specified purposes; provides for initial appointments to board of advisors & staggered terms; provides all special acts comprising charter of district are ordinances of Lake County & may be revised, amended, or repealed by board of county commissioners. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1107 (LB) by Representative McClain—

City of Inverness, Citrus County; Creates special zone; provides boundaries & exception to general law; provides requirements for issuance of special permit for certain licensed vendors in described area for sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off licensed premises & on public rights-of-way & public park property during city-approved special events; provides that special permits are in addition to certain other authorized temporary permits; requires bona fide licensed vendor to comply with all other statutory requirements. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1135 (LB) by Representative Williamson—

**Santa Rosa County;** Removes school board as taxing authority; revises method of electing civil service board & budget appropriations; repeals implementing rules relating to classified pay plan, leave, & holiday policies; provides actions related to suspensions, demotions, & dismissals may be filed through board of county commissioners' human resources department. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1161 (LB) by Representative Robinson, W.—

**Manatee County;** Creates Northlake Stewardship District; provides charter; requires referendum for ad valorem taxation. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1189 (LB) by Representatives Andrade and Salzman—

Firefighters' Relief and Pension Fund of the City of Pensacola, Escambia County; Removes reductions to a retiree's spousal benefits & the prohibition of remarriage for the widow or widower; provides for pensionable overtime hours & basic life support. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# CS/HB 1231 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Latvala—

**East Lake Tarpon Community, Pinellas County;** Revises boundaries; removes municipal annexation expiration date. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1423 (LB) by Representative Plasencia and others—

**City of Edgewood, Orange County;** Creates special zones in City of Edgewood; provides boundaries, exception to general law, & requirements for special alcoholic beverage licenses for restaurants in described areas. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 1427 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative McClure—

Hillsborough County Aviation Authority; Codifies, amends, repeals, & reenacts special acts relating to authority. Effective Date: 10/01/2022

#### HB 1429 (LB) by Representative McClain-

**City of Ocala, Marion County;** Authorizes certain sales of alcoholic beverages for consumption off-premises at specified events in certain areas. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1431 (LB) by Representatives Plasencia, Truenow and others—

City of Apopka, Orange County; Provides exception to general law; provides space, seating, & minimum gross revenue requirements for special alcoholic beverage licenses for restaurants in described areas; provides boundaries. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1433 (LB) by Representative Plasencia and others—

**Orange County**; Creates special zones in Orange County; provides exception to general law; provides space, seating, & minimum gross revenue requirements for special alcoholic beverage licenses for restaurants in described areas. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

# CS/HB 1491 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Shoaf—

Alligator Point Water Resources District, Franklin County; Revises district boundaries; requires referendum.

### CS/HB 1493 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee, Representative Clemons and others—

Alachua County; Amends Alachua County Home Rule Charter to require election of county commissioners in single-member districts; provides for referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of the qualified electors of Alachua County voting in a referendum conducted in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections currently in force

#### CS/HB 1495 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Melo—

Immokalee Water and Sewer District, Collier County; Codifies, amends, repeals, & reenacts special acts relating to district. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### HB 1497 (LB) by Representative Duggan and others—

City of Jacksonville, Duval County; Creates special zone in downtown Jacksonville; provides space, seating, & minimum gross revenue requirements for special alcoholic beverage licenses for public food service establishments in described areas. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 1499 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee, Representative Mooney and others—

City of Key West, Monroe County; Authorizes certain number & type of affordable housing units to be constructed for certain public sector governmental & essential services personnel. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1581 (LB) by Representative Drake and others—

**Jackson County Sheriff's Office;** Repeals provisions relating to the permanent status for certain employees of the Office of the Sheriff. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### CS/HB 1583 (LB) by the Committee on Local Administration and Veterans Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Salzman—

Emerald Coast Utilities Authority, Escambia County; Provides requirements for filling vacancies on Emerald Coast Utilities Authority; prohibits certain members from reelection; revises personnel guidelines; removes personnel appeals board; revises personnel appeals process & procedure; revises qualifications for executive director; removes exclusion of certain personnel from civil service protections. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

#### HB 1591 (LB) by Representative Ingoglia-

**Hernando County;** Designates board of county commissioners to serve as Hernando County Port Authority. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

### SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 228 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax, Senator Rodriguez and others—

Resiliency Energy Environment Florida Programs; Providing that a property owner may apply to a Resiliency Energy Environment Florida (REEF) program for funding to finance a qualifying improvement and may enter into an assessment financing agreement with a local government; authorizing a local government to enter into an agreement with a program administrator to administer a REEF program on the local government's behalf; specifying underwriting, financing estimate, disclosure, and confirmation requirements for program administrators relating to residential real property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

### CS/CS/SB 398 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Transportation and Senator Hooper—

**Transportation Projects;** Revising the requirement for the annual commitment of State Transportation Trust Fund revenues for public transportation projects by the Department of Transportation; providing that the department's program for innovative transportation projects may include progressive design-build contracts; revising the department's authority relating to design-build contracts; revising a dollar limit of proposed budget estimates of construction contracts for which an applying contractor may submit certain financial statements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

### CS/SB 410 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Rodriguez and others—

Enforcement of School Zone Speed Limits; Authorizing counties and municipalities to enforce speed limits on certain road areas and at specified periods through the use of speed detection systems; authorizing counties and municipalities to install, or contract with a vendor to install, speed detection systems; requiring counties and municipalities that install speed detection systems to provide certain notice to the public; authorizing counties and municipalities to authorize traffic infraction enforcement officers to issue traffic citations for certain violations, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

#### CS/CS/SB 954 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Brodeur and others—

**Energy;** Revising the selection criteria for purchasing or leasing vehicles for state agency, college, or university or certain local government fleets; removing a provision requiring the use and procurement of ethanol and biodiesel fuels; requiring the Department of Management Services, before a specified date, to make recommendations to state agencies and local governments relating to the procurement and integration of electric and natural gas fuel vehicles; revising the definition of the term "single-trade inspection", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; recommended favorably as a committee substitute by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

### CS/SB 990 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Diaz—

Towing Vehicles; Prohibiting investigating agencies from releasing motor vehicles towed to an agency's storage facility until certain proof of payment is presented to the agency; specifying that investigating agencies that do not obtain proof of payment must pay certain charges within a specified timeframe; revising the timeframe required for sending notices of lien; prohibiting towing companies from releasing vehicles owned by rental car companies, which are towed under certain circumstances, to the person who rented the vehicle unless the rental car company appoints the person as its agent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

#### SB 1274 (2R) by Senator Broxson-

#### Ratification of Rules of the Department of Financial Services; Ratifying a specified rule relating to the Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual, for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule meeting any specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; recommended favorably by Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

### CS/CS/SB 1302 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Regulated Industries, Senator Burgess and others—

in regulatory costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

**Criminal History Records**; Requiring a court to automatically seal certain criminal history records that meet specified criteria; requiring the clerk of the court to seal certain criminal history records, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; Appropriations Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice recommends the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

### CS/CS/SB 1610 (2R) by the Committees on Appropriations, Finance and Tax, Senator Rodriguez and others—

**Taxation**; Providing for the eligibility for abatement of ad valorem taxes and non-ad valorem assessments for residential improvements destroyed following certain events; requiring property appraisers to provide specified statements to tax collectors; prohibiting property appraisers and tax collectors from issuing specified notices for parcels meeting certain requirements; requiring property appraisers to notify taxpayers of the abatement of taxes and non-ad valorem assessments under certain circumstances; requiring value adjustment boards to dismiss petitions under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

### SB 7046 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Brandes)—

Public Employment; Requiring the Department of Management Services to periodically contract for the completion of certain compensation surveys; requiring the department to submit a report to the Governor and the legislative presiding officers upon completion of the surveys; authorizing Special Risk Class members who are law enforcement officers and meet certain criteria to participate in the deferred retirement option program for an additional time period; revising required employer retirement contribution rates for each membership class and subclass of the Florida Retirement System; revising allocations to investment plan member accounts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2022

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/HJR 1 (2R) by the Committees on State Affairs Committee, Ways and Means Committee, Representative Tomkow and others—
