Relief of Kristin A. Stewart by Sarasota County; Providing for the relief of Kristin A. Stewart by Sarasota County; providing an appropriation to compensate her for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of an employee of Sarasota County; providing limitations on compensation and the payment of attorney fees, lobbying fees, and costs or other similar expenses, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 946 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Grall—

Public Records/Department of State Electronically Filed Records; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for e-mail addresses and secure login credentials held by the Department of State relating to electronically filed records; defining the term "secure login credentials"; providing retroactive applicability; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 948 (2R) by Senator Grall—

Records Electronically Filed with the Department of State; Authorizing the department to implement certain systems relating to electronically filed records; providing requirements and authorizations for the department relating to such systems, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

CS/SB 978 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Bradley—

Secured Transactions; Providing that a description of certain accounts and entitlements by a certain type of collateral is insufficient for the purpose of security agreements, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 980 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Brodeur and others—

911 Public Safety Telecommunicator Certifications; Increasing the timeframe within which an inactive 911 public safety telecommunicator certificate may be reactivated before it permanently expires; deleting a process by which a certificateholder may voluntarily place his or her certificate in inactive status; prohibiting the Department of Health from requiring certificateholders to pay a fee or to make an election to place their certificates in inactive status, beginning on a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 1098 (2R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Burton—

Withholding or Withdrawal of Life-prolonging Procedures; Authorizing a court to delegate the right to consent to the withholding or withdrawal of life-prolonging procedures of incapacitated persons in certain circumstances; requiring that initial and annual guardianship plans, respectively, state whether any power under the ward's preexisting order not to resuscitate or advance directive is revoked, modified, suspended, or transferred to the guardian; authorizing a guardian to petition a court for approval to consent to withhold or withdraw life-prolonging procedures under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Dissolution of Marriage; Authorizing the court to consider the adultery of either spouse and any resulting economic impact in determining the amount of alimony awarded; providing a burden of proof for the party seeking support, maintenance, or alimony; removing the unanticipated change of circumstances requirement regarding modifying a parenting plan and time-sharing schedule; requiring the court to reduce or terminate support, maintenance, or alimony under certain circumstances; authorizing the court to reduce or terminate an award of support, maintenance, or alimony upon specific written findings of fact regarding the obligor's retirement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

SB 1004 (2R1) by Senator Torres and others—

High School Equivalency Diplomas; Prohibiting a district school board from requiring certain students to take a course before taking the high school equivalency examination unless the student failed to earn a passing score on a specified practice test, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1278 (2R1) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Simon and others—

Direct-support Organizations of the Department of Children and Families; Authorizing the Department of Children and Families to establish a direct-support organization for a specified purpose; requiring the Secretary of Children and Families to appoint a board of directors for the direct-support organization; authorizing the department to allow the direct-support organization to use, without charge, the department's fixed property, facilities, and personnel services, subject to certain requirements; authorizing the direct-support organization to collect, expend, and provide funds for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1312 (2R1) by Senator Collins and others—

Regulatory Assessment Fees; Exempting certain rules adopted by the Florida Public Service Commission relating to regulatory assessment fees from the required filing of statements of estimated regulatory costs and from submission for legislative ratification, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1436 (2R1) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Bradley—

Real Property Fraud; Requiring the clerk of the circuit court to create, maintain, and operate an opt-in recording notification service; requiring such clerk to ensure that registration for such service is possible through an electronic registration portal; clarifying that an action may be brought under ch. 65, F.S., to quiet title after a fraudulent attempted conveyance; requiring the court to quiet title and award certain title and rights under certain circumstances; requiring a real estate licensee to send a fraud prevention notice under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 7000 (2R1) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Garcia)—

OGSR/Current or Former Public Guardians; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain identifying and location information of current or former public guardians, employees with fiduciary responsibility, and the spouses and children thereof; defining terms; narrowing the scope of the public records exemption for current public guardians and employees with fiduciary responsibility and former public guardians and employees with fiduciary responsibility, respectively; removing the scheduled repeal date of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 7004 (2R1) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (Rodriguez)—

OGSR/Written Valuations of Surplus Lands; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for written valuations of surplus lands, documents used to form or pertaining to such a valuation, and written offers to purchase surplus land held by a water management district; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 7012 (2R1) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Martin)—

OGSR/Victim of an Incident of Mass Violence; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for the address of a victim of an incident of mass violence; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 7020 (2R1) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Education Pre-K -12 (Simon)—
