**State Board of Administration;** Prohibiting the State Board of Administration from paying benefits to a Florida Retirement System investment plan member convicted of specified felonies; authorizing the state board to develop investment products to be offered in the investment plan; revising the types of investments in real property and related personal property which the state board may invest in; requiring the public fund to notify companies it places on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List that they may be subject to divestment, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

**Public Nuisances;** Prohibiting a person from intentionally dumping onto private property litter that evidences religious or ethnic animus toward an owner or invitee of such property; providing criminal penalties; prohibiting a person from willfully and maliciously harassing, threatening, or intimidating another person based on the person's wearing or displaying of any indicia relating to any religious or ethnic heritage; removing a minimum damage requirement for a violation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law
