### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR MONDAY, MAY 1, 2023

#### **CS/CS/CS/SB 1226 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Burgess—**

**Controlled Substances;** Providing criminal penalties; providing for a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment if a person sells, manufactures, or delivers or possesses with intent to sell, manufacture, or deliver specified substances or mixtures, and such substance or mixture has at least one specified attribute; providing enhanced criminal penalties; providing for a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment if a person commits specified prohibited acts relating to controlled substances or mixtures, and such substance or mixture has at least one specified attribute, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to CS/CS/HB 1359(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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#### **CS/SB 528 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Davis and others—**

**Custody and Supervision of Specified Offenders;** Excluding certain offenders from eligibility to receive basic gain-time; excluding certain offenders from eligibility to receive incentive gain-time; excluding certain offenders from eligibility for specified reductions to a term of supervision; requiring a court to impose additional conditions of supervision on specified offenders, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 537(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

#### **CS/CS/SB 766 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Transportation, Senator Burgess and others—**

**Enforcement of School Bus Passing Infractions;** Defining the term “school bus infraction detection system”; authorizing school districts to install and operate school bus infraction detection systems for a specified purpose; requiring school districts that install a school bus infraction detection system to ensure that each such system meets certain requirements; requiring such school districts to enter into interlocal agreements with law enforcement agencies to enforce violations; providing that certain recorded video and images are admissible in certain proceedings, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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#### **SB 7064 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy (Hutson)—**

**Human Trafficking;** Increasing criminal penalties for specified offenses involving adult theaters; providing a civil cause of action for victims of human trafficking against certain entities or persons; authorizing judicial circuits to establish educational programs for persons convicted of or charged with certain violations; creating the Statewide Data Repository for Anonymous Human Trafficking Data at the University of South Florida, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/CS/SB 950 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Community Affairs and Senator Rodriguez—**

**Improvements to Real Property;** Authorizing a residential or commercial property owner to apply to a qualifying improvement program for funding to finance an improvement and to enter into a financing agreement with the local government; authorizing a local government to incur debt for the purpose of providing financing for qualifying improvements; specifying certain requirements for a local government or program administrator that offers a qualifying improvement program for residential properties; providing that a financing agreement may be executed for qualifying improvements in the construction of a commercial property before a certificate of occupancy or similar evidence of substantial completion of new construction or improvement is issued; requiring that, in communicating with residential property owners, the local government or program administrator comply with certain marketing and communications guidelines and prohibiting such entities from certain communication, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2024

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 56 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact;** Enacting the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact; providing for recognition of psychologist licenses in compact states; providing that, while authority over a psychologist's license remains with the home state, receiving states and distant states may define the scope of and act on a psychologist's authority to practice in the receiving or distant state, as applicable, under the compact; requiring the Department of Health to report certain investigative information to the coordinated licensure information system, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 33(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 58 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Harrell—**

**Public Records and Meetings/Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of Health or the Board of Psychology pursuant to the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact; providing an exemption from public meeting requirements for certain meetings of the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact Commission; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 56 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/CS/SB 986 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Education, the Committee on Education Pre-K -12 and Senator Burgess—**

**Education;** Revising which students may be given an enrollment preference by charter schools; specifying training and reporting requirements for charter school sponsors; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt rules to implement a standard monitoring tool; revising how a district school board calculates certain teachers' shares of funds from the Florida Teachers Classroom Supply Assistance Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Compare to CS/CS/HB 443, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**SB 658 (SO) by Senator Burgess—**

**Registration Fees for Malt Beverage Brands and Labels;** Providing that the annual registration fee is required only if labels or brands are sold to a distributor; specifying that no other registration fee is authorized, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to HB 1459(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 670 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Yarborough and others—**

**Paid Family Leave Insurance;** Authorizing life insurers to transact paid family leave insurance; specifying circumstances under which family leave benefits may be provided under a paid family leave insurance policy; specifying requirements for policies relating to benefit periods, waiting periods, benefit amounts and certain offsets, and the payment of benefits; providing that eligibility for family leave benefits may be limited, excluded, or reduced, but must be specified in the policy, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 721(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/SB 1290 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Grall and others—**

**Operation of a Golf Cart;** Authorizing water control districts to designate certain roads for the operation of golf carts; requiring county approval to make such designation; prohibiting a person from operating a golf cart on certain roadways unless he or she possesses a valid learner's driver license or valid driver license that is not suspended or revoked, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 949, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 784 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Burgess—**

**Special Persons Registry;** Citing this act as the "Protect Our Loved Ones Act"; authorizing local law enforcement agencies to develop and maintain a database, to be known as the "Special Persons Registry," for a specified purpose; authorizing local law enforcement agencies to provide relevant information from the registry to law enforcement officers under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2024

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/HB 1275(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 786 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Burgess—**

**Public Records/Special Persons Registry;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for all records, data, information, correspondence, and communications relating to and submitted in connection with the enrollment of persons in the Special Persons Registry maintained by local law enforcement agencies; prohibiting law enforcement agencies, county emergency management agencies, and local fire departments from further disclosing confidential and exempt information; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 784 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

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**SB 1020 (SO) by Senator Wright—**

**Monuments;** Providing legislative intent; establishing the Florida Space Exploration Monument; providing for administration of the monument by the Department of Management Services; providing for the creation of a design contest and selection committee; requiring the department to develop a plan for the design, placement, and cost of the monument; requiring the plan to be submitted to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **CS/HB 1189(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 1084 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services and Senator Trumbull—**

**Pilot Program for Individuals with Developmental Disabilities;** Requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to implement a pilot program for individuals with developmental disabilities residing in specified Statewide Medicaid Managed Care regions to provide coverage of comprehensive services; authorizing the agency to seek federal approval as needed to implement the program; providing that participation in the pilot program is voluntary and subject to specific appropriation; requiring the Agency for Persons with Disabilities to approve a needs assessment methodology for prospective enrollees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **HB 831, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 1094 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Martin—**

**Death Benefits for Active Duty Servicemembers;** Revising the amount and conditions of payment of death benefits; requiring that payment be made to the beneficiary through the process set out by the Department of Military Affairs; requiring the department to request the Chief Financial Officer to draw a warrant for payment of benefits from the General Revenue Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 621(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

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**HB 477 (SO) by Representative Rizo and others—**

**Term Limits for District School Board Members;** Revises term limits for district school board members. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/CS/SB 1258 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Transportation, Senator Trumbull and others—**

**Use of Phosphogypsum;** Authorizing the Department of Transportation to undertake demonstration projects using phosphogypsum in road construction aggregate material to determine its feasibility as a paving material; requiring the department to conduct a study on the suitability of using phosphogypsum as a construction aggregate material; prohibiting phosphogypsum from being regulated as solid waste if used in accordance with an allowed use under specified federal regulations and approvals, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 1191(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 1266 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Rodriguez and others—**

**Venomous Reptiles;** Revising the penalty for certain release or escape of nonnative venomous reptiles; providing a penalty for specified activities involving venomous reptiles without a special permit or license issued by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 1161(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**SB 1300 (SO) by Senator Burton and others—**

**Animals Working with Law Enforcement Officers;** Prohibiting the knowing and willful resistance to, obstruction of, or opposition to a police canine or police horse under certain circumstances; increasing criminal penalties for persons who actually and intentionally maliciously touch, strike, or cause bodily harm to a police canine, fire canine, SAR canine, or police horse, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to **CS/HB 1047(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 1510 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Pizzo—**

**Visiting County and Municipal Detention Facilities;** Authorizing specified persons to visit at their pleasure county and municipal detention facilities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **HB 119(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 1454 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Gruters—**

**Homeowners' Right to Display and Store Items;** Authorizing homeowners to display no more than a certain number of specified flags regardless of certain prohibitions in the governing documents of the homeowners' association; prohibiting homeowners' associations from restricting parcel owners or tenants from displaying items on a parcel which are not visible from the parcel's frontage; prohibiting certain homeowners' association documents from precluding property owners from displaying a certain number of specified flags, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 437(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 1440 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Book—**

**Juvenile Court Proceedings;** Authorizing individuals to appear at or attend dependency proceedings relating to children through audio or audio-video communication technology, except under certain circumstances; requiring parties in certain proceedings to provide their primary e-mail addresses to the court; requiring that court notices for shelter placement hearings held through audio or audio-video communication technology include certain information; specifying how parties to certain hearings involving children may consent to service or notice by e-mail, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 1242 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Boyd—**

**Registrations and Transfers of Heating, Ventilation, and Air-conditioning System Manufacturer Warranties;** Specifying that certain warranties for heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning (HVAC) systems are automatically transferred and remain in effect under certain circumstances relating to the conveyance of property; prohibiting warrantors from charging a fee for such transfers; requiring certain contractors installing HVAC systems to provide certain documentation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to **CS/HB 1203(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**SB 1198 (SO) by Senator Simon and others—**

**Operation New Hope;** Authorizing the Department of Corrections, contingent upon appropriation, to contract with Operation New Hope for specified services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **HB 1207(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 1182 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Simon and others—**

**Education and Training for Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Forms of Dementia;** Designating the “Alzheimer’s Disease and Related Forms of Dementia Education and Training Act”; requiring the Department of Elderly Affairs to offer certain education about Alzheimer’s disease and related forms of dementia to the general public; providing minimum requirements for the training; authorizing persons to satisfy the training requirements of this act using training curricula approved before the effective date of this act until the department adopts rules for training curricula guidelines, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 299(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/CS/SB 1012 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Rouson—**

**Certified Peer Specialist Gateway Pilot Program;** Creating the pilot program within the Department of Corrections; authorizing inmates at participating facilities to apply to participate in the pilot program; exempting persons who complete the pilot program’s requirements from specified background screening requirements for peer specialists, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 1045(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

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**CS/SB 940 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Calatayud and others—**

**Multiple-employer Welfare Arrangements;** Revising eligibility requirements for a bona fide group to qualify as a multiple-employer welfare arrangement, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 897(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

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**CS/SB 926 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K-12, Senator Rodriguez and others—**

**Florida Virtual School;** Providing for flexibility in the administration of specified assessments for Florida Virtual School full-time students of military families residing outside this state; providing a process for the parents or guardians of such students to request the flexibility in assessment administration from the Florida Virtual School; providing flexibility in the administration of specified assessments for certain Florida Virtual School students, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K-12; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/HB 1597(HC)** in the Committee on Appropriations*

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**CS/SB 628 (SO) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Grall—**

**Debt Management Services;** Increasing the maximum fee that may be charged for debt management services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2023
