SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 2024

SB 46 (SO) by Senator Stewart—

Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence Program; Providing that tutoring provided through the tutoring program established as part of the Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence Program may be provided after the school day; authorizing school districts that participate in the tutoring program to provide a stipend to instructional personnel and high school students who serve as tutors under the program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K -12; reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 66 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Brodeur and others—

Revive Awareness Day; Citing this act as “Victoria’s Law”; designating June 6 of each year as “Revive Awareness Day”; authorizing the Governor to issue an annual proclamation; encouraging the Department of Health to hold events to raise awareness of the dangers of opioid overdose and the availability and safe use of opioid antagonists as an effective way to rapidly reverse the effects of opioid overdose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 280 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator DiCeglie—

Vacation Rentals; Requiring advertising platforms to collect and remit specified taxes for certain vacation rental transactions; defining the term “advertising platform”; adding licensing to the regulated activities of public lodging establishments and public food service establishments which are preempted to the state; requiring advertising platforms to require that persons placing advertisements or listings for vacation rentals include certain information in the advertisements or listings and attest to certain information; authorizing the division to revoke, refuse to issue or renew, or suspend vacation rental licenses under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SCR 324 (SO) by Senator Ingoglia—

Balanced Federal Budget; Applying to the Congress of the United States to call a convention for the sole purpose of proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States which requires a balanced federal budget, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Identical to HCR 703(HC) in the Committee on Rules

SCR 326 (SO) by Senator Ingoglia—

Congressional Term Limits; Applying to the Congress of the United States to call a convention for the sole purpose of proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States to set a limit on the number of terms to which a person may be elected as a member of the United States House of Representatives and to set a limit on the number of terms to which a person may be elected as a member of the United States Senate, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

Identical to HCR 693(HC) in the Committee on Rules

SB 364 (SO) by Senator Collins—

Regulatory Assessment Fees; Exempting certain rules adopted by the Florida Public Service Commission relating to regulatory assessment fees from the requirement of legislative ratification, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SM 398 (SO) by Senator Avila—

Venezuelan Sanctions; Urging the United States Secretary of State to implement policies at the United States Department of State that reinstate economic sanctions on Nicolás Maduro and his Venezuelan dictatorship and impose sanctions on companies that do business with Venezuela, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 478 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Rodriguez—

Designation of Eligible Telecommunications Carriers; Revising the definition of the term “eligible telecommunications carrier”; authorizing the Public Service Commission to designate certain entities as eligible telecommunications carriers for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 494 (SO) by the Committees on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Education Postsecondary, Senator Avila and others—

Graduate Program Admissions; Requiring an institution of higher education to waive certain examination requirements for a servicemember or a person who served in the United States Armed Forces, the Florida National Guard, or the United States Reserve Forces and was discharged or released under any condition other than dishonorable and who applies for admission to a graduate program that requires such examination, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 522 (SO) by Senator Simon—

Tallahassee Community College; Renaming the college as "Tallahassee State College", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SM 540 (SO) by Senator Avila—

Chinese and Cuban Governments; Urging the United States Secretary of State to condemn the emerging partnership between the Chinese Communist Party and the communist regime in Cuba and the establishment of Chinese espionage and military capabilities in Cuba, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 702 (SO) by Senator Martin—

Attorney Fees and Costs; Defining the term "property rights"; requiring courts to award reasonable attorney fees and costs to a prevailing defendant in certain civil actions under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SM 1020 (SO) by Senator Ingoglia—

Designation of Drug Cartels as Foreign Terrorist Organizations; Urging the United States Secretary of State to designate drug cartels as Foreign Terrorist Organizations, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 7010 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, and Ethics and Elections (Burgess)—

OGSR/Voter Registration Applicants; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information concerning preregistered voter registration applicants who are minors; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption; authorizing the disclosure of confidential and exempt information for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 7012 (SO) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections (Burgess)—

OGSR/Secure Login Credentials Held by the Commission on Ethics; Amending a provision which provides exemptions from public records requirements for secure login credentials held by the Commission on Ethics and certain information entered into the electronic filing system for financial disclosures; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

*Similar to **HB 7005(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

CS/SB 7014 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, and Ethics and Elections (Burgess)—

Ethics; Increasing the maximum fine for violations of specified lobbying provisions; prohibiting a member of the Commission on Ethics from serving more than two full terms, instead of two full terms in succession; requiring the commission to submit a copy of a certain referral to an alleged violator within a specified timeframe; providing that persons are deemed to waive their rights to a formal or an informal hearing if the request is not received within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 7026 (SO) by the Committee on Agriculture (Collins)—

Public Records/Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

SB 184 (2R) by Senator Avila and others—

Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders; Defining the terms “first responder” and “harass”; prohibiting a person, after receiving a warning not to approach from a first responder who is engaged in the lawful performance of a legal duty, from violating such warning and approaching or remaining within a specified distance of the first responder with specified intent, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 298 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Polsky and others—

Local Government Coastal Protections; Providing that only coastal counties and coastal municipalities that received written authorization from the Department of Environmental Protection on or before a specified date may establish construction zoning and building code exceptions to coastal construction control lines; authorizing the department to provide coastal counties, beginning on a specified date, with Resilient Florida Grant Program grants to fund saltwater intrusion vulnerability assessments, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 334 (2R) by Senator Burgess—

Rabies Vaccinations; Authorizing certain persons to administer rabies vaccinations to certain animals under the indirect supervision of a veterinarian; providing that a supervising veterinarian assumes responsibility for any person working under the veterinarian’s supervision or at his or her direction; defining the term “indirect supervision”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 7034 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Garcia)—

OGSR/Information Regarding Persons Seeking Mental Health Treatment and Services; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for petitions for voluntary and involuntary admission for mental health treatment, court orders, related records, and personal identifying information regarding persons seeking mental health treatment and services; abrogating the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024
