# CS/CS/CS/SB 88 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Transportation and Senator Wright—

**Utility Terrain Vehicles**; Authorizing a utility terrain vehicle (UTV) to be operated during all hours; authorizing the operation of UTVs on certain parts of the State Highway System; authorizing the Department of Transportation to prohibit the use of UTVs under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to issue a license plate to the owner or lessee of a vehicle registered as a UTV upon payment of certain taxes and fees, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2026

### CS/SB 102 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Gaetz and others—

**Exceptional Student Education;** Requiring the Department of Education to develop and implement, by a specified date, a workforce credential program for students with an autism spectrum disorder or students on a modified curriculum; requiring the department to produce an annual report during a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

### CS/SB 106 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Martin—

**Exploitation of Vulnerable Adults;** Authorizing the use of substitute service on unascertainable respondents; requiring the court to enter an order providing for specified service when a petitioner files the sworn affidavit; requiring that any proposed transfer of funds or property in dispute be held for a specified time period, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

### SB 130 (SO) by Senator Bradley—

Compensation of Victims of Wrongful Incarceration; Deleting the definition of the term "violent felony"; expanding the period during which a petition for compensation for wrongful incarceration may be filed; providing that a wrongfully incarcerated person is not eligible for compensation for any period of incarceration during which the person was concurrently serving a sentence for a conviction of another felony for which such person was lawfully incarcerated; revising provisions concerning the offset of civil judgments in favor of claimants against awards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

### SB 158 (SO) by Senator Berman—

Coverage for Diagnostic and Supplemental Breast Examinations; Prohibiting the state group insurance program from imposing any cost-sharing requirement upon an enrollee with respect to coverage for diagnostic breast examinations or supplemental breast examinations, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2026

### SB 234 (SO) by Senator Leek—

Criminal Offenses Against Law Enforcement Officers and Other Personnel; Citing this act as the "Officer Jason Raynor Act"; revising a prohibition on the use or threatened use of force to resist arrest or detention; providing for enhanced punishment for manslaughter when committed against specified officers; revising provisions concerning assault or battery upon specified officers and other personnel, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

# CS/CS/SB 262 (SO) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Judiciary and Senator Berman—

**Trusts;** Revising how an authorized trustee may exercise the power to invade principal as an authorized trustee administering a trust; providing that property devised to or from a revocable trust which is devised, given, or distributed to a donee by a settlor during the settlor's lifetime is treated as a satisfaction of devise to that donee if certain criteria are met; providing that homestead property transferred by one or both settlor spouses to a community property trust will not be treated as a change of ownership for the purposes of reassessing the property, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

## CS/SB 274 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Arrington and others—

Transportation Facility Designations/Harris Rosen Way and Geraldine Thompson Way; Providing honorary designations of certain transportation facilities in a specified county; directing the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

## CS/SB 280 (SO) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Arrington and others—

**Candidate Qualification**; Providing eligibility requirements for persons seeking to qualify for nomination as candidates of a political party or as candidates with no party affiliation; providing that certain entities may bring an action for declaratory and injunctive relief based on a certain claim; prohibiting a person from qualifying as a candidate for election and prohibiting his or her name from appearing on the ballot under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Middle School and High School Start Times; Providing that district school boards and charter schools, respectively, are in compliance with certain provisions relating to middle school and high school start times upon submission of a specified report to the Department of Education, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

### SB 356 (SO) by Senator Berman and others—

Information Technology; Creating the Agency for State Systems and Enterprise Technology (ASSET); requiring that the Division of Elections comprehensive risk assessment comply with the risk assessment methodology developed by ASSET; requiring agencies and the judicial branch to include a cumulative inventory and a certain status report of specified projects with their legislative budget requests; revising the powers, duties, and functions of the Department of Management Services, through the Florida Digital Service; requiring ASSET to operate as the state enterprise organization for information technology governance and as the lead entity responsible for understanding needs and environments, creating standards and strategy, supporting state agency technology efforts, and reporting on the state of information technology in this state, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025
