SB 878 (SO) by Senator Martin—

Probation for Misdemeanor Offenses; Increasing probationary periods for certain misdemeanor offenses involving controlled or chemical substances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 538 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice and Senator Bradley—

State Courts System; Revising the availability of judges to require at least one circuit judge in each circuit to be available for hearings with limited notice; revising the duty of the Florida Clerks of Court Operations Corporation to provide an annual budget request to be pursuant to specified provisions; deleting the per diem cap for arbitrators who participate in court-ordered, nonbinding arbitration; authorizing judges to authenticate a jurat, or certificate of proof or acknowledgment, by affixing their signature and printing their name, title, and court, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 480 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Banking and Insurance and Senator DiCeglie—

Nonprofit Agricultural Organization Medical Benefit Plans; Defining the term “nonprofit agricultural organization”; authorizing nonprofit agricultural organizations to provide medical benefit plans; specifying that such plans are not insurance for purposes of the Florida Insurance Code; prohibiting the nonprofit agricultural organization from marketing or selling a medical benefit plan through specified agents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

CS/SB 472 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Truenow—

Education in Correctional Facilities for Licensed Professions; Requiring the Correctional Education Program to design and implement a plan, in coordination with the boards of professions regulated by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, or the department when there is no board, for inmates who take certain classes to receive credit towards licensure requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

CS/CS/SB 56 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Garcia and others—

Geoengineering and Weather Modification Activities; Repealing provisions relating to the definitions, purpose, licensing requirements, applications, proof of financial responsibility requirements, license issuance and discipline provisions, publication of notice of intention to operate requirements, required contents of the notice of intention, publication of the notice of intention requirements, proof of publication requirements, record and reports of operations requirements, provision of emergency licenses, and suspension or revocation of licenses, respectively, of the weather modification law; prohibiting certain acts intended to affect the temperature, the weather, or the intensity of sunlight within the atmosphere of this state; requiring an operator of public infrastructure to report certain information monthly to the Department of Transportation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

CS/SB 86 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Burgess and others—

Peer Support for First Responders; Revising the definition of the term “first responder” to include specified support personnel for the provision of peer support, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 164 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Rodriguez—

Vessel Accountability; Defining the term “vessel owner”; providing a penalty for a person anchoring, mooring, or allowing certain vessels to occupy the waters of this state if an officer of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission or a law enforcement agency finds that specified conditions exist; requiring the commission to issue, at no cost, a permit for the long-term anchoring of a vessel which includes specified information; requiring the commission to use an electronic application and permitting system; requiring that a vessel subject to a specified number of violations within a 24-month period which result in certain dispositions be declared a public nuisance, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025

CS/SB 166 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Simon—

Administrative Efficiency in Public Schools; Exempting district school boards from requirements for adopting certain rules; deleting a requirement for a district school board to employ an internal auditor in certain circumstances; requiring innovation schools of technology to comply with specified provisions relating to instructional multiyear contracts, in addition to annual contracts, for instructional personnel in addition to annual contracts; revising requirements relating to district school board attendance policies for Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Programs; revising requirements for assessments needed for a student to earn a high school diploma; providing requirements for advanced degrees which may be used to set salary schedules for instructional personnel and school administrators hired after a specified date; revising eligibility requirements for individuals to participate in the Teacher Apprenticeship Program, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025

CS/CS/SB 282 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Banking and Insurance and Senator Truenow—

Warranty Associations; Revising the requirements of contractual liability insurance policies; revising the circumstances under which certain service warranty associations are not required to establish unearned premium reserves or to maintain contractual liability insurance and are authorized to allow their premiums to exceed specified ratios; requiring that contracts that include coverage for accidental damage from handling be covered by a specified policy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 316 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Berman—

Limited Liability Companies; Defining the terms “registered foreign protected series of a foreign series limited liability company” and “registered foreign series limited liability company”; specifying that certain limited liability companies are considered a nonresident under certain circumstances; creating the “Uniform Protected Series Provisions”; providing powers and prohibitions for protected series of series limited liability companies; authorizing domestic limited liability companies to establish protected series, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

SB 14 (2R) by Senator Jones—

Relief of the Estate of Peniel Janvier by the City of Miami Beach; Providing for the relief of the Estate of Peniel Janvier by the City of Miami Beach; providing for an appropriation to compensate the Estate of Peniel Janvier for damages sustained as a result of the negligence of the City of Miami Beach; providing a limitation on the payment of compensation and attorney fees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 20 (2R) by Senator Burgess—

Relief of J.N., a Minor, by Hillsborough County; Providing for the relief of J.N., a minor, by Hillsborough County; providing an appropriation to Stephany Grullon, as parent and guardian of J.N., to compensate J.N. for injuries and damages she sustained as a result of the negligence of Hillsborough County in maintaining sidewalks and culvert systems; providing a limitation on compensation and the payment of certain fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/SB 68 (2R) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Martin—

Health Facilities Authorities; Revising the definition of the term “health facility” to include other entities and associations organized not for profit; revising the powers of health facilities authorities to include the power to issue certain loans and execute related loan agreements; specifying requirements for projects financed by loan agreements issued by a health facilities authority, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 138 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Wright—

Driving and Boating Offenses; Citing this act as “Trenton’s Law”; prohibiting a person from driving or being in actual physical control of a vehicle while under the influence of any impairing substance; requiring that a person be told that his or her failure to submit to a lawful test of breath or urine is a second degree misdemeanor or a first degree misdemeanor under certain circumstances; classifying a person’s refusal to submit to a chemical or physical test of breath or urine as a second degree misdemeanor or a first degree misdemeanor under certain circumstances; authorizing state attorneys to create driving under the influence diversion programs, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 248 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Simon—

Student Participation in Interscholastic and Intrasccholastic Extracurricular Sports; Providing that an activity or a sport must meet specified requirements; specifying conditions for a home education student to participate in interscholastic athletics; revising the criteria a private school student must meet to participate in a sport at a Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSA) member school, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 268 (2R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Senator Jones and others—

Public Records/Congressional Members and Public Officers; Providing exemptions from public records requirements for the partial home addresses and telephone numbers of current congressional members and public officers and their spouses and adult children and the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and dates of birth of, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by, the minor children of such congressional members and public officers; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 304 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Sharief and others—

Specific Medical Diagnoses in Child Protective Investigations; Providing an exception to the requirement that the Department of Children and Families immediately forward certain allegations to a law enforcement agency; requiring Child Protection Teams to consult with a licensed physician or advanced practice registered nurse when evaluating certain reports; authorizing, under a certain circumstance, a parent or legal custodian from whom a child was removed to request specified examinations of the child, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 312 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Education Postsecondary, Senator Gaetz and others—

Florida Institute for Human and Machine Cognition, Inc.; Requiring the board of directors of the Florida Institute for Human and Machine Cognition, Inc., rather than the Board of Governors, to authorize the creation of a subsidiary of the corporation; revising the composition of the board of directors of the corporation; authorizing subsidiaries of the corporation to enter into certain affiliation agreements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 438 (2R) by the Committee on Agriculture, Senator Burton and others—

Food and Hemp Products; Providing that a marijuana testing laboratory may acquire hemp and hemp extract only from certain businesses; revising requirements for the sale and distribution of hemp extract; prohibiting businesses or food establishments from possessing hemp or hemp extract products that are attractive to children; prohibiting a business permitted to sell hemp or hemp extract from being located in certain areas; providing a penalty for hemp extract possessed, manufactured, delivered, held, offered for sale, distributed, or sold by certain entities in violation of specified provisions, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2025
