SB 7018 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy (Burton)—

OGSR/Parental Consent Requirements Before Terminating a Pregnancy; Amending provisions relating to an exemption from public records requirements for certain information that could identify a minor petitioning a court to waive parental consent requirements before terminating a pregnancy; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2025

Prearranged Transportation Services; Prohibiting the impersonation of a transportation network company driver; providing that services purchased from a transportation network company are not considered privately owned or operated bus transit systems; requiring transportation service providers to provide certain drivers with access to certain training materials, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Uniform Commercial Code; Creating the "Uniform Commercial Code—Controllable Electronic Records"; specifying when a purchaser of a controllable account or controllable payment intangible is a qualifying purchaser; specifying when a person has control of a controllable electronic record; authorizing account debtors on a controllable account or controllable payment intangible to discharge obligations under certain circumstances; specifying requirements for perfecting security interests that are enforceable and perfected before a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Providing additional requirements for postjudgment execution proceedings to enforce judgments entered against terrorist parties under specified provisions; providing retroactive application of specified provisions, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Removal of Altered Sexual Depictions Posted Without Consent;

Citing this act as "Brooke's Law"; requiring covered platforms to establish a process by a specified date for removal of altered sexual depictions posted without the consent of the identifiable person; providing immunity for good faith compliance, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1346 (SO) by the Committees on Judiciary, Health Policy, Senator Polsky and others—

Fentanyl Testing; Creating "Gage's Law"; requiring hospitals and hospital-based off-campus emergency departments to test for fentanyl as part of any urine testing they conduct to treat individuals for possible drug overdose or poisoning; requiring such facilities to perform a confirmation test if the urine test results are positive for fentanyl; requiring that the results of such tests be retained as part of the patient's clinical record in accordance with the facility's current recordkeeping practices, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 952 (SO) by Senator Ingoglia and others—

Restrictions on Firearms and Ammunition During Emergencies; Repealing provisions relating to specified automatic restrictions on firearms and ammunition during certain declared emergencies, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 910 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Collins—

Veterans' Benefits Assistance; Prohibiting a person from receiving compensation for referring an individual to a provider for advising, assisting, or consulting on any veterans' benefits matter; requiring that persons who advise, assist, or consult on veterans' benefits matters for compensation provide a specified oral and written disclosure before entering into a business relationship with a client; prohibiting a provider who advises, assists, or consults on veterans' benefits matters from charging certain fees; requiring a provider to ensure that individuals who directly assist a veteran in a veterans' benefits matter complete a specified background screening before entering into an agreement with a veteran for veterans' benefits matters, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Former Phosphate Mining Lands; Providing conditions for a cause of action against certain former phosphate mine sites; requiring the Department of Health to conduct gamma radiation surveys of former phosphate land parcels upon petition; requiring that specified documentation of radiation levels be submitted in certain civil actions related to phosphate mining, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 796 (SO) by Senator Bradley—

General Permits for Distributed Wastewater Treatment Systems; Authorizing the Secretary of Environmental Protection to grant a general permit for the replacement of an existing onsite sewage treatment and disposal system with a distributed wastewater treatment system under certain circumstances; providing for the installation of distributed wastewater treatment units to proceed without any further action by the Department of Environmental Protection if a permittee submits a notification to the department at least a specified number of days before installation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

Brownfields; Deleting a provision requiring certain property owners to provide information regarding institutional controls to the local government for mapping purposes; revising the conditions under which an applicant who has rehabilitated a contaminated site may submit and claim certain tax credits; deleting the definition of the term "monetary compensation"; revising the date by which the Department of Environmental Protection must issue annual site rehabilitation tax credit certificate awards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

SB 726 (SO) by Senator Ingoglia—

False Reporting; Providing that a person who misuses emergency communication systems is liable for the costs of prosecution and investigation; providing that a person who makes a false report to law enforcement authorities is liable for the costs of prosecution and investigation; providing that such persons are also liable for restitution if the false report involves another person who sustained injuries or property damage as a result of the false report, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025
