Health Care; Revises eligibility requirements for Florida Reimbursement Assistance for Medical Education Program; creates Rural Access to Primary & Preventive Care Grant Program & Stroke, Cardiac, & Obstetric Response and Education Grant Program within DOH; authorizes Medicaid to reimburse for dental services provided in mobile dental unit that is owned by, operated by, or contracted with health access setting or another similar setting or program; requires health care practitioner to notify patient in writing upon referring patient to certain providers; requires certain health insurers to apply payments for services provided by nonpreferred providers toward insureds' deductibles & out-of-pocket maximums if specified conditions are met; revises provisions relating to dental therapy. Public Officers and Employees; Requires certain public officers & employees to be United States citizens & residents of this state, and, for specified public officers & employees, to reside in certain county or within certain area; requires members of state university board of trustees & members of Board of Governors to be United States citizens & either resident of this state or graduate of state university beginning on specified date; provides that specified offices are deemed vacant; narrowing applicability of certain prohibitions regarding political activities; prohibits certain state officers & employees from engaging in certain political activities; prohibits certain state officers from using authority or influence of their positions for certain purposes; prohibits certain supervisors from engaging in certain conduct; provides criminal penalty; prohibits Career Service System employees from using authority or influence of their positions for certain purposes. SB 7032 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services (Trumbull)—

Medicaid Enrollment for Permanently Disabled Individuals; Requiring that certain persons who receive specified Medicaid-covered

services and who are permanently disabled be presumed eligible for continued Medicaid coverage during redetermination processes; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to continue to make payments for such services; requiring certain persons to notify the agency and the Department of Children and Families of certain changes in disability or economic status; requiring the agency to seek federal authorization to exempt certain persons from annual redetermination of eligibility, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 736 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Truenow and others—

Brownfields; Deleting a provision requiring certain property owners to provide information regarding institutional controls to the local government for mapping purposes; revising the conditions under which an applicant who has rehabilitated a contaminated site may submit and claim certain tax credits; deleting the definition of the term "monetary compensation"; revising the date by which the Department of Environmental Protection must issue annual site rehabilitation tax credit certificate awards, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to CS/HB 733(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1602 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Harrell—

Health Care Patient Protection; Requiring hospital emergency departments to develop and implement policies and procedures, conduct training, record weights in a certain manner, designate a pediatric emergency care coordinator, and conduct specified assessments; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to adopt certain rules for comprehensive emergency management plans; requiring the agency to collect and publish the results of specified assessments submitted by hospitals by specified dates, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to **CS/HB 1119(HC)** in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 1726 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education and Senator Calatayud—

Higher Education; Requiring members of a state university board of trustees and members of the Board of Governors to be United States citizens and either residents of this state or graduates of a state university beginning on a specified date; requiring certain members of the Board of Governors to comply with specified financial disclosure requirements beginning on a specified date; revising term limits for members and the chair of the State Board of Education; providing term limits for members and the chairs of the Florida College System institution boards of trustees; providing that certain actions related to the president of a Florida College System institution are not subject to approval by the State Board of Education, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025

CS/SB 1242 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator McClain—

Community Redevelopment Agencies; Revising the structure of community redevelopment agencies to require a governing body to declare itself to be an agency; prohibiting a governing body from adopting any modification to a community redevelopment plan which expands the boundaries of the community redevelopment area or extends the time certain set forth in the redevelopment plan; revising the authorized activities of community redevelopment agencies; prohibiting community redevelopment agencies from paying for or financing by increment revenues certain projects; revising the date on which community redevelopment agencies must terminate, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1624 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education and Senator Calatayud—

Higher Education; Authorizing the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to develop contracts or agreements with institutions in the State University System for a specified purpose; providing tuition assistance to active members of the Florida State Guard; specifying that the President of the University of Florida appoints the members of the scientific advisory council within the Florida Center for Brain Tumor Research; revising the qualifications for members of the Assistive Technology Advisory Council; revising the date by which the Department of Education is required to publish an annual report on apprenticeship and preapprenticeship programs; authorizing Florida College System institutions with a certain number of full-time equivalent students to enter into cooperative agreements to form a state college regional consortium service organization, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

RESOLUTIONS TO BE ADOPTED BY PUBLICATION ON THURSDAY, MAY 1, 2025

SR 1384 (SR) by Senator Smith-

Muslim-American Heritage Month; Recognizing May 2025 as "Muslim-American Heritage Month" in Florida and celebrating the heritage and culture of Muslim Americans in this state, etc.

SR 1432 (SR) by Senator Davis-

National Hypertension Month; Designating May as National Hypertension Month in Florida to promote greater awareness, public education, and expanded efforts to prevent, detect, and manage hypertension, and to advocate for greater patient access to innovative treatment therapies, etc.

SR 1874 (SR) by Senator Rodriguez-

Prader-Willi Syndrome Awareness Day; Designating May 1, 2025, as "Prader-Willi Syndrome Awareness Day" in Florida and expressing continued support for groundbreaking research that is improving the quality of life of individuals in this state who have the disorder and their families, etc.

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 12 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Gruters—

Relief of L.P., a Minor, by the Department of Children and Families; Providing for the relief of L.P., a minor, by the Department of Children and Families; providing an appropriation to a special needs trust, to compensate L.P. for injuries and damages sustained due to the negligence of employees and caseworkers of the department; providing a limitation on compensation and the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SJR 174 (2R) by Senator DiCeglie-

Assessment of Homestead Property; Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to authorize the Legislature, by general law, to prohibit the consideration of any change or improvement made to homestead property to mitigate flood damage in determining the assessed value of such property for ad valorem taxation purposes, to limit the transfer of such value to new homestead property, and to provide an effective date, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 176 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator DiCeglie—

Assessment of Homestead Property; Requiring that changes, additions, or improvements that replace or are made to elevate homestead property be assessed in a specified manner; specifying how such assessment must be calculated under certain conditions; authorizing property appraisers to require certain evidence, etc. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by SJR 174 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, if such amendment is approved at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SJR 318 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax and Senator Truenow—

Ad Valorem Tax Exemption; Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to exempt certain tangible personal property from ad valorem taxation, etc.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 626 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Osgood—

Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys; Revising the quorum requirements for the Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys to require only 9 members for a quorum; authorizing members to appear by communications media technology; providing that members who appear by such technology are considered present and may be counted toward the quorum requirement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 754 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Burton—

International Baccalaureate Bonus Funding; Revising the requirements for the calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership and certain bonuses based on International Baccalaureate examination scores of students to include students who earn a minimum grade in a specified course, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably CS/CS/SB 810 (2R) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, Senator Burgess and others—

Stormwater Management Systems; Defining the terms "MS4" and "MS4 entity"; requiring each MS4 entity to conduct an operation and maintenance inspection of certain stormwater management systems by a specified date; requiring each MS4 entity to complete a stormwater facility inspection checklist, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 1132 (2R) by the Committees on Agriculture, Commerce and Tourism, Senator Truenow and others—

Consumers' Right to Repair Certain Equipment; Creating the "Portable Wireless Device Repair Act"; requiring portable wireless device manufacturers to make certain items available to device owners and independent repair providers; prohibiting certain manufacturers from requiring authorized repair providers to continue purchasing certain information in a proprietary format; providing that a complaint may be filled in circuit court under certain circumstances; requiring original equipment manufacturers of agricultural equipment to make certain diagnostic and repair information available for no charge and in a certain manner to independent repair providers and owners, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1288 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Grall—

Parental Rights; Requiring parental consent for a minor's treatment for certain diseases; requiring a school district to provide parents with specified information before the district administers certain questionnaires or forms to students; revising exceptions for certain parental rights; creating the parental right to consent in writing to the use of a biofeedback device on a parent's minor child, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1290 (2R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Transportation and Senator Collins—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Requiring licensure in lieu of registration of motor carriers operating certain qualified motor vehicles; requiring motor carriers to obtain fuel use decals in lieu of identifying devices; revising due dates for motor fuel use tax returns submitted by licensed motor carriers; requiring vehicle registration applicants to provide a Florida address; defining the term "economically disadvantaged area", etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 1292 (2R) by Senator Collins-

Public Records/E-mail Addresses/DHSMV; Expanding an exemption from public records requirements for e-mail addresses collected by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for providing renewal notices to include e-mail addresses collected for use as a method of notification generally and not only for the purpose of providing renewal notices; expanding the exemption to include e-mail addresses collected for use as a method of notification related to vessel registrations; providing retroactive applicability; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1290 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations

SB 1578 (2R) by Senator Davis-

Coverage for Mammograms and Supplemental Breast Cancer Screenings; Requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to provide Medicaid coverage for annual mammograms and supplemental breast cancer screenings for certain women meeting specified criteria, subject to the availability of funds and any limitations or directions the Legislature provides in the General Appropriations Act; revising coverage for mammograms under certain individual accident and health insurance policies, certain group, blanket, and franchise accident and health insurance policies, and certain health maintenance contracts, respectively, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1580 (2R) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Rodriguez—

Infrastructure and Resiliency; Granting the Department of Environmental Protection the exclusive authority to execute coastal resiliency projects through public-private partnerships; authorizing the department to take certain actions to encourage investment from the private sector in coastal resiliency projects, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1664 (2R) by the Committees on Finance and Tax, Community Affairs and Senator Trumbull—

Local Option Taxes; Requiring that specified taxes be renewed or reenacted by an ordinance in a specified manner; requiring that specified taxes have an expiration date and are subject to approval in a specified manner; requiring that specified taxes be reenacted by an ordinance in a specified manner; requiring that specified taxes be renewed or continued by an ordinance in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

HB 5009 (2R) by the Committee on Budget Committee-

Government Administration; Revises provisions relating to government administration including auditing, reviews, & investigations of programs, appropriations, & state entities; government accountability; planning & budgeting; estimating conferences; EOG budget recommendations; & budget requests. Effective Date: 07/01/2025

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Appropriations

HB 5013 (2R) by the Committee on Budget Committee-

State Group Insurance; Requires that state group health insurance plan copayments for prescription drugs be established annually in General Appropriations Act; removes provisions relating to formulary inclusions of specified drugs; requires DMS to make monthly administrative health insurance assessments against stage agencies based on certain vacant positions within agencies; requires state agencies to remit administrative health insurance assessments to State Employees Health Insurance Trust Fund; requires state agencies to provide department with list of certain position numbers, include certain information in list, & update list monthly; requires state agencies to take steps to include administrative health insurance assessments in their indirect cost plans for each fiscal year; requires state agencies to notify certain entities on updated indirect cost plans; authorizes EOG to transfer certain budget authority between state agencies for specified purpose. HB 5203 (2R) by the Committee on State Administration Budget Subcommittee and Representative Lopez, V.—

Capitol Center; Provides that Governor, Cabinet officers, & Legislature are permanent tenants of Capital Complex: prohibits certain space from being reduced or moved without express consent of tenants; provides Legislature with first right of refusal if additional vacant space becomes available; requires DMS to coordinate with & receive approval of certain tenants before planning or scheduling certain projects; requires department to consider Legislature's schedule, time constraints, & needs for projects that impact certain space; authorizes President of Senate & Speaker of House of Representatives to take certain actions in relation to certain spaces without approval by department; provides that President of Senate & Speaker of House of Representatives have direct control over utilities for certain spaces; requires department to consult with & receive approval from President of Senate or Speaker of House of Representatives, as appropriate, before including certain projects in specified report: requires department to solicit feedback on development of certain state-owned property from all permanent tenants of Capitol Center; prohibits certain parking spaces from being reduced or reassigned without express consent of Legislature; provides Legislature with first right of refusal if additional parking spaces become available.
