#### **CS/SB 156 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice and Senator Leek—**

**Criminal Offenses Against Law Enforcement Officers and Other Personnel;** Citing this act as the "Officer Jason Raynor Act"; revising a prohibition on the use or threatened use of force to resist arrest or detention; providing for enhanced punishment for manslaughter when committed against specified officers; revising provisions concerning assault or battery upon specified officers and other personnel; revising a provision concerning resisting, obstructing, or opposing specified officers or legally authorized persons, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

#### **SB 168 (SO) by Senator Truenow—**

**Public Nuisances;** Revising the list of places that may be declared a public nuisance to include the site of a gambling house; revising provisions relating to the assessment and collection of fines for public nuisances; deleting a limit on the total amount of fines that may be imposed on a public nuisance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

#### **SB 288 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Rural Electric Cooperatives;** Prohibiting a cooperative that sells electricity at retail from adopting, enacting, or enforcing a fee meeting specified criteria; revising the applicability of such prohibition on the types or fuel sources of energy production which may be used, delivered, converted, or supplied by specified entities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

#### **SB 292 (SO) by Senator Rouson—**

**Public Records/Appellate Court Clerks;** Defining the term "appellate court clerk"; providing an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying and location information of current appellate court clerks and the spouses and children of such appellate court clerks; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

#### **CS/SB 296 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Berman and others—**

**Victims of Domestic Violence and Dating Violence;** Requiring the Division of Telecommunications within the Department of Management Services to consult with certain entities to conduct a feasibility study regarding a specified alert system; providing requirements for such alert system; authorizing victims of dating violence to apply to participate in the Attorney General's address confidentiality program; requiring the Attorney General to designate certain entities to assist victims of dating violence applying to be address confidentiality program participants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/SB 298 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Berman and others—**

**Public Records/Victims of Domestic and Dating Violence;** Providing that certain identifying information of victims of dating violence who participate in the Address Confidentiality Program for Victims of Domestic and Dating Violence which are held by the Office of the Attorney General or contained in voter registration or voting records held by the supervisor of elections or the Department of State are exempt from public records requirements; providing for retroactive application; providing for future legislative review and repeal; providing statements of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 296 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 364 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Gruters and others—**

**Public Accountancy;** Authorizing the Board of Accountancy to competitively procure contracted services with certain corporations not for profit for the performance of certain duties assigned to the Division of Certified Public Accounting of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; revising the education and work experience requirements for a certified public accountant license; directing the board to prescribe specified coursework for licensure; revising requirements for the approval of providers who administer continuing education on ethics for certified public accountants, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 386 (SO) by Senator Trumbull—**

**Farm Equipment;** Authorizing a consumer to report farm equipment that is defective and does not conform to specified warranties to the manufacturer or its authorized service agent during a specified timeframe to allow the manufacturer or its authorized agent to conform such farm equipment to such warranty; requiring the manufacturer or its authorized agent to make such repairs to conform the farm equipment to the warranty upon receipt of such report, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture; reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 7000 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security (Wright)—**

**OGSR/Persons Provided Public Emergency Shelter;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for the addresses and telephone numbers of persons provided public emergency shelter and held by the agency that provided the emergency shelter; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/SB 7002 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security (Wright)—**

**OGSR/Department of Military Affairs/United States Department of Defense;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of Military Affairs stored in a United States Department of Defense system of records, transmitted using a United States Department of Defense network or communications device, or pertaining to the United States Department of Defense; extending the scheduled repeal date of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 7004 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice (Martin)—**

**OGSR/Conviction Integrity Unit Reinvestigation Information;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain conviction integrity unit reinvestigation information; abrogating the scheduled repeal of such exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 7006 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries (Bradley)—**

**OGSR/Florida Public Service Commission;** Deleting the scheduled repeal of an exemption from public meeting requirements for portions of a hearing before the Florida Public Service Commission wherein certain proprietary confidential business information is discussed, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 7008 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries (Bradley)—**

**OGSR/Florida Gaming Control Commission;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records and public meeting requirements for exempt or confidential and exempt information obtained by the Florida Gaming Control Commission; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 7012 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Transportation (Massullo)—**

**OGSR/Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for information received by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles as a result of an investigation or examination of a department-authorized private rebuilt inspection provider; amending provisions which provide exemptions from public records requirements for information received by the department as a result of an investigation or examination of a person suspected of having violated certain laws, rules, or orders; removing the scheduled repeal of such exemptions, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/SB 7014 (SO) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and Commerce and Tourism (Leek)—**

**OGSR/Social Media Platform Investigations;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain information received in investigations by the Attorney General or a law enforcement agency into social media platform activities; extending the scheduled repeal date of the exemption; amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain information received in investigations by the Department of Legal Affairs or a law enforcement agency into violations by certain social media platforms; extending the scheduled repeal date of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 7016 (SO) by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism (Leek)—**

**OGSR/Administration of Small Business Loan Programs Held by an Economic Development Agency;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for certain information relating to the administration of small business loan programs held by an economic development agency; deleting the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law

**SR 1772 (SR) by Senator Wright—**

**Space Shuttle Challenger Remembrance Day;** Recognizing January 28, 2026, as “Space Shuttle Challenger Remembrance Day” in Florida to honor the Challenger crew, reflect on Florida’s enduring role in space exploration, and reaffirm this state’s commitment to education, safety, innovation, and the peaceful exploration of space, etc.

**CS/SB 62 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Arrington and others—**

**Candidate Qualification;** Specifying that a person seeking to qualify for office as a candidate must be a registered member of a political party, or registered without any party affiliation, for 365 consecutive days preceding the beginning of qualifying for an election; authorizing qualified candidates or certain political parties to challenge compliance with specified provisions by filing suit in a specified circuit court; prohibiting a person from being qualified as a candidate for nomination or election and appearing on the ballot under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 624 (2R) by Senator Yarborough and others—**

**Batterers’ Intervention Program Activities;** Authorizing batterers’ intervention programs to offer supplemental faith-based activities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026
