### **CS/CS/SB 1062 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Brodeur and others—**

**Speech and Debate Education;** Designating Florida Speech and Debate Week annually in February; establishing the Florida Debate Initiative, Inc., (FDI) as a statewide speech and debate organization that performs certain functions in support of the Florida Civics and Debate Initiative (FCDI) in the Department of Education; providing the duties of FDI; specifying activities for FDI and FCDI, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

### **SB 1072 (SO) by Senator Calatayud and others—**

**Antisemitism Task Force;** Creating the Antisemitism Task Force adjunct to the Office of Civil Rights within the Department of Legal Affairs for a specified purpose; requiring the department to provide administrative and staff support to the task force; requiring the task force to meet quarterly; requiring the task force to annually submit a report and policy recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

### **CS/CS/SB 1230 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances;** Citing this act as the "Joe Casello Act"; prohibiting, beginning on a specified date, certain use and the sale, purchase, or distribution of aqueous film-forming foam in this state; prohibiting, beginning on a specified date, the possession and use of aqueous film-forming foam in this state; requiring certain public entities disposing of domestic wastewater biosolids and treated effluent to quarterly conduct specified samplings and submit the results to the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 1019(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

### **CS/SB 1706 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Pizzo—**

**My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot Program;** Revising eligibility requirements for participation in the My Safe Florida Condominium Pilot Program; requiring the Department of Financial Services to adopt rules to verify household income; specifying that condominium property with mixed-income occupancies is eligible to participate in the pilot program under certain circumstances; authorizing financial grants to be used by associations for a specified purpose; limiting the award of grant funds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

---

### **CS/SB 186 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Garcia and others—**

**Student Health and Safety;** Revising Department of Health responsibilities for educational programs concerning epilepsy; revising the definition of the term "school"; revising requirements for a student's individualized seizure action plan; revising the list of which employees must complete training in the care of students with epilepsy and seizure disorders; requiring the Department of Education to identify for a specified purpose posters that meet certain requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 1201(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

### **CS/CS/SB 598 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Truenow—**

**Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services;** Prohibiting a licensee of funeral or cemetery services from entering into certain contracts, agreements, or arrangements; revising the requirements for an applicant seeking licensure by endorsement to be an embalmer; deleting an exception to the educational requirements for an applicant seeking licensure to be a funeral director; authorizing a licensee or a licensed facility to dispose of human remains in a specified manner if the legally authorized person of the decedent fails, neglects, or refuses to direct the disposition, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

**CS/SB 432 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Yarborough—**

**Intoxicating Substances;** Creating “Meg’s Law”; prohibiting tobacco or nicotine dealers, or their agents or employees, from possessing, selling, possessing with intent to sell, delivering, or giving, directly or indirectly, nitrous oxide on or from the dealer’s licensed premises; excepting from the list of Schedule I controlled substances certain xylazine animal drug products approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration and used for certain purposes; creating the offense of trafficking in xylazine, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect October 1, 2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/CS/SB 928 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Criminal Justice and Senator Martin—**

**Dangerous Crimes;** Citing this act as “Missy’s Law”; requiring a court to remand to custody immediately a person who pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, or is found guilty of, a dangerous crime; requiring such person to remain in custody pending sentencing without the possibility of release on bond, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 990 (SO) by Senator Leek—**

**Protected Cell Captive Insurance Companies;** Specifying that a protected cell captive insurance company may only insure certain risks; revising the unimpaired paid-in capital requirements for captive insurance companies; authorizing one or more sponsors to form a protected cell captive insurance company; requiring applicant protected cell captive insurance companies to file certain information with the Office of Insurance Regulation; authorizing protected cell captive insurance companies to establish and maintain certain protected cells, subject to certain approvals granted by the office, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 620 (SO) by Senator Mayfield—**

**Candidate Qualifying;** Requiring certain candidates to provide the filing officer a statement disclosing dual citizenship for nomination and election to federal, state, county, multicounty, district, or judicial office or to a district school board, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

**CS/SB 554 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Bernard—**

**Nonprofit Corporations;** Renaming the “Florida Not For Profit Corporation Act” as the “Florida Nonprofit Corporation Act”; revising the circumstances in which a domestic or foreign corporation may correct a document filed with the department; requiring all courts, public offices, and official bodies to receive all certificates issued by the department as prima facie evidence of certain facts; authorizing a corporation to register under a name that is not otherwise distinguishable on the records of the department under certain circumstances; prohibiting a corporation from paying any dividend and making distributions of any part of its net income or net earnings to its members, directors, or officers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to CS/CS/HB 797(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/CS/SB 560 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Garcia—**

**Child Welfare;** Providing that a new medical report relating to the provision of psychotropic medication to a child in the legal custody of the Department of Children and Families may be required only under certain circumstances; requiring the department and each community-based care lead agency to coordinate with certain organizations and meet at least quarterly for a specified purpose; requiring a physician to provide to a pharmacy a copy of certain documentation, rather than a signed attestation, with certain prescriptions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 684 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator McClain—**

**Electronic Signatures Associated with Total Loss Vehicles and Vessels;** Requiring insurance companies or their authorized agents to implement certain control processes and procedures for certain electronic signatures; deleting a requirement that electronic signatures on odometer disclosures submitted through insurance companies be executed in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to CS/HB 961(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

## **SB 778 (SO) by Senator Simon—**

**Forensic Services for Certain Defendants;** Revising the definition of the term “forensic client” or “client”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

## **CS/CS/SB 1134 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Yarborough—**

**Official Actions of Local Governments;** Prohibiting counties and municipalities, respectively, from funding or promoting or taking official action as it relates to diversity, equity, and inclusion; providing that certain ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, programs, and policies are void; providing that a county commissioner, a member of the governing body of a municipality, or any other county or municipal official acting in an official capacity who violates certain provisions commits misfeasance or malfeasance in office, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

## **CS/CS/CS/SB 1220 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Transportation and Senator Massullo—**

**Transportation;** Revising the membership composition of the Florida Transportation Research Institute; requiring the Department of Transportation to coordinate with the Department of Commerce, specified ports, and the Federal Government for a certain purpose; revising the visible signals given by an approaching emergency vehicle upon which a driver must yield the right-of-way; prohibiting a personal delivery device from operating as otherwise authorized unless the personal delivery device meets certain criteria and a human operator is capable of controlling and monitoring its navigation and operation; prohibiting a political subdivision from withholding issuance of a business tax receipt, development permit, or other land use approval to certain drone delivery services and from enacting or enforcing ordinances or resolutions that prohibit drone delivery service operation; requiring commercial service airports to develop a plan for obtaining and maintaining critical infrastructure resources, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

---

## **CS/CS/SB 1404 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Health Policy and Senator Burton—**

**Memory Care;** Requiring licenses for assisted living facilities that provide memory care services; requiring an assisted living facility that serves memory care residents or holds itself out as providing memory care services to obtain a memory care services license; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to adopt rules governing memory care services licenses by a specified date; authorizing a facility that served memory care residents without a memory care services license before a specified date to continue to do so if certain requirements are met, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

## **CS/CS/CS/SB 1690 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Calatayud—**

**Child Care and Early Learning Services;** Revising the information on child care required to be disseminated electronically to the community; deleting the requirement that family child care homes and large family child care homes, respectively, provide specified information to parents each year; requiring that certain child care facilities exempt from licensure requirements meet certain minimum requirements; prohibiting residential property insurance policies from providing coverage for liability for claims arising out of, or in connection with, the operations of large family child care homes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

---

## **CS/CS/SB 1138 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Massullo—**

**Qualified Contractors;** Requiring each county and municipality, respectively, of a specified size to create and implement a program for the purpose of making development preapplication consultation services available at an applicant's request; authorizing a county or municipality to use a qualified contractor or qualified contractor firm to fulfill specified preapplication services requirements; requiring a local government to establish a registry of a specified number of qualified contractors or qualified contractor firms to conduct certain preapplication services; requiring the governing body of certain local governments and counties to include certain developments in a program that expedites the process for issuing building permits for planned unit developments or phases of a community or subdivision, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 676 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Arrington and others—**

**Animal Welfare;** Creating the offense of causing or enticing a minor to commit, or in the presence of a minor committing, animal cruelty; requiring a court to order a minor who commits specified acts of animal cruelty to undergo a psychological evaluation and, if recommended, receive counseling or treatment for a specified time period; requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to post on its website specified information relating to each individual convicted of specified animal cruelty offenses; creating the offense of causing or enticing a minor to commit, or in the presence of a minor committing, fighting or baiting animals; increasing the maximum civil penalty for specified violations of ordinances relating to animal control or cruelty, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to CS/HB 559(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 800 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Regulated Industries and Senator Mayfield—**

**Engineering;** Providing penalties for persons who repeatedly engage in the unlicensed practice of engineering, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**SB 174 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Transportation Facility Designations/Charlie Kirk Memorial Avenue;** Providing an honorary designation of a certain transportation facility in a specified county; directing the Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Similar to CS/HB 33(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

**CS/CS/SB 314 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Banking and Insurance and Senator Burton—**
