#### **SB 6 (SO) by Senator Calatayud—**

**Relief of L.E. by the Department of Children and Families;** Providing for the relief of L.E. by the Department of Children and Families; providing an appropriation to compensate L.E. for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of the department; providing a limitation on compensation and the payment of attorney fees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

#### **SB 26 (SO) by Senator McClain and others—**

**Relief of the Estate of Mark LaGatta by the Department of Transportation;** Providing for the relief of the Estate of Mark LaGatta; providing an appropriation to compensate the estate for injuries and damages sustained by Mr. LaGatta as a result of the negligence of the Department of Transportation; providing a limitation on compensation and the payment of attorney fees, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Recommended favorably by the Special Master on Claim Bills; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

*Similar to **CS/CS/HB 6509(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

#### **CS/CS/SB 42 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Senator Sharief and others—**

**Specific Medical Diagnoses in Child Protective Investigations;** Providing an exception to the requirement that the Department of Children and Families immediately forward certain allegations to a law enforcement agency; requiring a child protective investigator to inform the subject of an investigation of a certain duty; requiring Child Protection Teams to consult with a licensed physician or advanced practice registered nurse with specified pediatric experience when evaluating certain reports; authorizing a parent or legal custodian of a child who is the subject of certain orders to request specified medical examinations of the child within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 47, 1st Eng.(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

---

#### **CS/SB 206 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder;** Requiring certain program participants at educator preparation institutes to complete the autism micro-credential; requiring each educator preparation institute to offer training on teaching students with certain disabilities; creating the Autism Educator Loan Forgiveness Program; providing requirements for teachers to receive an annual payment; revising core curricula for teacher preparation programs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 218 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Gaetz and others—**

**Land Use Regulations;** Defining the term “impacted local government”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 326 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Burgess—**

**Curators of Estates;** Revising the authorization for a court to appoint a curator of estates; revising bond requirements for a curator of estates; clarifying who may subject a curator of estates to removal and surcharge; authorizing the court to require more frequent reporting or additional documents under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Banking and Insurance reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 131(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/CS/SB 354 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator McClain—**

**Blue Ribbon Projects;** Requiring that a development project meet certain requirements to qualify as a blue ribbon project; providing maximum residential density and nonresidential intensity permitted within the development area of a blue ribbon project; requiring a blue ribbon project to have a blue ribbon plan; requiring a project to receive dollar-for-dollar credits from a local government under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 530 (SO) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Simon and others—**

**State Lotteries;** Revising the powers and duties of the Department of the Lottery; revising the information required to be provided to the department by persons who submit a bid, a proposal, or an offer to negotiate a contract for major procurement; authorizing the Division of Security’s sworn law enforcement officers to purchase and present lottery tickets to a lottery retailer to claim a prize under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain false claims relating to state lottery tickets, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/SB 556 (SO) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12, Senator Berman and others—**

**Requirements for a Standard High School Diploma;** Providing that students can substitute marching band experience for physical education and performing fine arts credit requirements for a standard high school diploma; providing that students with disabilities may participate in the Special Olympics to meet the physical education requirement for a standard high school diploma, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 453(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 688 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Rodriguez—**

**Naturopathic Medicine;** Creating the Board of Naturopathic Medicine within the Department of Health; prohibiting unlicensed persons from practicing naturopathic medicine or promoting, identifying, or describing themselves using specified titles or abbreviations; providing for licensure by examination of naturopathic doctors; providing for licensure by endorsement of naturopathic doctors; revising continuing education requirements for naturopathic doctors, etc. Effective Date: 12/31/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/CS/SB 758 (SO) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Judiciary and Senator Bradley—**

**Justice Administrative Commission;** Revising the membership of the Justice Administrative Commission, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**SB 830 (SO) by Senator Leek—**

**Public Records/County Administrators and City Managers;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying and location information of current county administrators, deputy county administrators, assistant county administrators, city managers, deputy city managers, and assistant city managers, including the names and personal identifying and location information of the spouses and children of current county administrators, deputy county administrators, assistant county administrators, city managers, deputy city managers, and assistant city managers; providing for future legislative review and repeal; providing for retroactive application; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

## **SB 878 (SO) by Senator Yarborough and others—**

**Clinical Laboratory Personnel;** Requiring that an applicant who qualifies for licensure under specified provisions provide proof of such qualification and pay the required fees to be eligible for licensure; requiring that applicants for licensure as a technologist or technician who meet specified criteria be deemed to have satisfied minimum qualifications for licensure to perform high or moderate complexity testing as a technologist or technician, as applicable, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Identical to **HB 1347(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

## **CS/SB 914 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Calatayud—**

**Dry Needling;** Defining the terms “dry needling” and “myofascial trigger point”; requiring the Board of Occupational Therapy to establish minimum standards of practice for the performance of dry needling by occupational therapists, including specified standards; requiring the board, if it deems it necessary for patient safety, to adopt additional supervision and training requirements for occupational therapists to perform dry needling on specified areas, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to **CS/HB 867(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

---

## **SB 964 (SO) by Senator Wright—**

**Financial Disclosures;** Requiring reporting individuals and procurement employees to file annual reports listing certain gifts with the Commission on Ethics instead of with the required financial disclosure statement; requiring such individuals and employees who have left office or employment within a specified timeframe to file the annual report with the commission instead of at the same location as their financial disclosure statement; requiring reporting individuals and procurement employees to disclose the name, address, and affiliation of a person providing specified honorarium expenses with the commission instead of with the required financial disclosure statement, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to **HB 6011(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

---

## **CS/SB 1002 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Gaetz—**

**Child Welfare;** Revising the definition of the term “harm” to provide that exposure of a child to a controlled substance may be established by evidence of acute or chronic use of a controlled substance by a parent to a specified extent; revising the definition of the term “neglect” to provide that neglect occurs when there is evidence of acute or chronic use of a controlled substance by a parent to a specified extent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

## **CS/CS/SB 1632 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Grall—**

**Ideologies Inconsistent with American Principles;** Prohibiting the application of certain law in adjudicatory proceedings; providing that the Department of State may administratively dissolve a corporation that has been designated as a terrorist organization in certain situations; defining the term “domestic terrorist organization”; providing that a person who receives military training from a domestic terrorist organization in certain situations commits a specified crime; providing a person who knowingly provides or attempts or conspires to provide material support or resources to a domestic terrorist organization commits a specified crime, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice*

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 1471(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

---

## **CS/CS/SB 1634 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Grall—**

**Public Records/Chief of Domestic Security;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for certain information relating to the designation of an organization as a domestic terrorist organization or a foreign terrorist organization by the Chief of Domestic Security; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1632 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice*

*Identical to **CS/CS/HB 1473(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1012 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice and Senator Yarborough—**

**Inmate Services;** Requiring that maintenance and repair deduction fees from contractor-operated correctional facilities be deposited in the Contractor-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund; requiring that funds from the Contractor-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund be used for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

---

**CS/SB 1016 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Bradley—**

**Medical Assistance Eligibility for Working Persons with Disabilities;** Creating the Working People with Disabilities program within the Agency for Health Care Administration; specifying income and asset requirements for eligibility in the program; requiring the Department of Children and Families to provide a written notice of specified information to eligible adults upon their initial enrollment in certain Medicaid waiver programs, and at least annually thereafter; requiring the agency to identify certain Medicaid recipients and share such information with the department for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 915(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1234 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Regulated Industries and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Building Permits and Inspections;** Providing for expiration of certain building permits issued by a county after a specified timeframe; providing that any certified residential manufactured building may not be denied a building permit for placement on specified lots or property associations; prohibiting a local government from adopting or enforcing certain zoning, land use, or development ordinances or regulations; requiring the Florida Building Commission to adopt by rule uniform statewide building permit applications for commercial and residential construction projects; requiring certain persons who perform work on a property to file a notice of permit exemption with the local enforcement agency within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 803, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1288 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Waterbody Designations/Andrew “Red” Harris Spoil Island;** Designating the Andrew “Red” Harris Spoil Island; directing the Department of Environmental Protection to erect specified suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 1219(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 1318 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program;** Removing language requiring certain program funds to revert to the state, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/SB 1332 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Martin—**

**Career Offender Registration;** Requiring a certain driver license or identification card marking for a career offender; requiring a career offender to report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in a certain month to obtain an updated or renewed driver license or identification card; providing that if a sanction is not imposed upon a career offender, such offender is deemed to have been released upon conviction; requiring certain career offenders to report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and obtain a driver license or identification card containing a required marking within a certain period of time; authorizing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to release certain images to the Department of Law Enforcement for purposes of public notification, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1296 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Martin—**

**Public Employees Relations Commission;** Authorizing subpoenas to be served by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by personal service; revising application requirements for employee organization registration and renewal of registration; providing that a petition to clarify the composition of a bargaining unit may be filed with the commission under certain circumstances; providing that implementation of appropriations from the Legislature which are specifically directed to be disbursed as salaries for employees of local governments are considered a financial urgency; authorizing certain public employers, public employees, and employee organizations, or combinations thereof, to file certain charges with the commission, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1434 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator Calatayud—**

**Infill Redevelopment;** Creating the “Infill Redevelopment Act”; requiring that a local government permit qualifying parcels to be developed with residential uses; prohibiting a local government from using the subdivision process to restrict development in a certain manner; requiring developers of such parcels to pay double the parks and recreation facilities impact fees for a certain purpose and provide certain written notice to property owners; prohibiting a local government from adopting or enforcing certain local laws, ordinances, or regulations, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 1574 (SO) by Senator Bracy Davis and others—**

**Newborn Screenings;** Citing this act as “Mattie’s Law”; requiring that newborns, beginning on a specified date, be screened for biliary atresia; requiring the Department of Health to consult with the Genetics and Newborn Screening Advisory Council before adopting certain rules; requiring hospitals that provide birthing services to screen for biliary atresia in a specified manner, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1602 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security and Senator Wright—**
