CS/CS/CS/SB 354, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator McClain—

Blue Ribbon Projects; Requiring that a development project meet certain requirements to qualify as a blue ribbon project; providing maximum residential density and nonresidential intensity permitted within the development area of a blue ribbon project; requiring a blue ribbon project to have a blue ribbon plan; requiring a project to receive dollar-for-dollar credits from a local government under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Read the second time, amended, and read the third time on March 5, 2026.

CS/SB 68 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services and Senator Harrell—

Health Care Patient Protection; Requiring hospitals with emergency departments to develop and implement policies and procedures and conduct training; authorizing a hospital with an emergency department to conduct the National Pediatric Readiness Project's Open Assessment under certain circumstances; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to adopt certain rules for comprehensive emergency management plans, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/HB 355(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/SB 208 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator McClain—

Land Use and Development Regulations; Requiring that the amount of certain application fees reasonably relate to certain costs; requiring that certain interlocal agreements between school boards and local governments address reasonable access to certain public easements and public rights-of-way; requiring that local government comprehensive plans and land development regulations include factors for assessing the compatibility of certain residential uses; authorizing the placement of certain residential manufactured buildings on any lot in a recreational vehicle park; requiring that an offsite constructed residential dwelling be permitted as of right in certain zoning districts, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to CS/CS/CS/HB 399, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 350 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Grall—

Public Records/Crime Victims; Expanding a public records exemption for crime victims to include the name and personal identification number of a victim and any other information that could be used to locate, intimidate, harass, or abuse the victim; providing that such exemption includes the portions of records generated by any agency that regularly generates or receives information from or concerning victims of crime; providing for a public records exemption for the identity of a victim's family member, lawful representative, or next of kin and any other information that could be used to locate, intimidate, harass, or abuse these individuals; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Identical to CS/HB 1113(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 532 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Simon and others—

Clerks of the Court; Authorizing the cumulative excess of funds to be used in the development of the total combined budgets of the clerks of the court; requiring that a court use certain sale procedures in a foreclosure action; providing that only a clerk of court may conduct a foreclosure sale, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

Compare to **CS/HB 925(HC)** in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 576 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Harrell—

Local Government Cybersecurity; Creating the Local Government Cybersecurity Protection Program within the Florida Digital Service; requiring the grant program to be administered by the Florida Digital Service; requiring the Florida Digital Service to enter into certain data-sharing agreements with local governments for a specified purpose; requiring the Florida Digital Service to contract for information technology commodities and services and award such commodities and services to local governments, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to **CS/CS/HB 1085(HC)** in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 696 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Martin—

Registration of Trademarks; Requiring the Department of State to use the international schedule of classes of goods and services for trademarks; deleting provisions relating to the classification of goods and services for trademark purposes; providing online application requirements; requiring the department to establish and maintain a secure Internet website that allows submission of an online trademark registration application and renewal application, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to **CS/CS/HB 679(HC)** in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 698 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Martin—

Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System Permits; Prohibiting a municipality or political subdivision of the state from requiring owners and builders of certain residences to receive construction permits from the Department of Environmental Protection as a condition of issuing building or plumbing permits; requiring such owners and builders to provide certain proof to the municipality or political subdivision; requiring an applicant for a permit for the construction of an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system or a property owner to assume specified liabilities under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to **CS/CS/CS/HB 589(HC)** in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1334 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Ethics and Elections and Senator Grall—

Elections; Defining the term "document acceptable as evidence of United States citizenship"; revising the information the uniform statewide voter registration application is designed to elicit from an applicant to include a certain acknowledgment; requiring that an agreement between the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and the Department of State match information regarding the legal status as a United States citizen of applicants applying to vote; requiring supervisors to verify the current eligibility of certain applicants within a specified timeframe by reviewing specified information provided by governmental entities to make a determination under specified conditions; prohibiting a person from qualifying for nomination as a candidate of a political party if the person has not been a registered member of such party for a specified timeframe; requiring that all voting be done by official ballot using certain pens, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development

CS/SB 1630 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Grall—

Aging and Disability Services; Deleting expired requirements for Medicaid recipients to receive an offer for enrollment for long-term care services; requiring the CARES program to review or perform the initial assessment of an enrollee's level of care; providing procurement requirements for area agencies on aging; requiring that high-risk vulnerable adults be given priority consideration for receiving community-care-for-the-elderly services; revising professional and public guardians' continuing education requirements to include Alzheimer's disease and related dementias, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

Compare to CS/HB 1121(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1724 (SO) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Martin—

Utility Services; Requiring that a new agreement, or an extension, renewal, or material amendment of an existing agreement, to provide certain utility services at retail be in writing; requiring that certain public meetings be held as a condition precedent to the effectiveness of a new or extended agreement under which a municipality will provide specified utility services in other municipalities or unincorporated areas; revising provisions relating to permissible rates, fees, and charges imposed by municipal water and sewer utilities on consumers located outside the municipal boundaries; requiring municipalities that provide specified utility services to report certain information by a specified date, and annually thereafter, to the Florida Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

Similar to CS/CS/HB 1451(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 7038 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, and the Committee on Education Postsecondary (Calatayud)—

Education; Requiring each Florida College System institution and state university to waive tuition and fees for members of the Florida State Guard if certain conditions are met; requiring entities that offer fee-based services to individuals who are blind or visually impaired to disclose in writing whether the service may be obtained elsewhere at no cost; authorizing school district career centers to use alternative methods adopted by the board in lieu of common placement tests to assess students in basic communication and computation skills; providing that a fee waiver only applies to a full-time undergraduate student, beginning with a specified academic year, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Compare to CS/CS/HB 1279(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 7046 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Finance and Tax (Avila)—

Taxation; Prohibiting counties, municipalities, and special districts, respectively, from levying certain special assessments against more than a specified square footage amount per recreational vehicle parking space or campsite; prohibiting a taxpayer from being assessed certain penalties or interest under certain circumstances; revising a specified finding that a taxing authority must make in order to elect not to exempt certain property from certain ad valorem taxation; providing that the provision of electricity to a consumer at an electric vehicle charging station shall be considered the retail sale of electricity, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

HB 167 (SO) by Representatives McClure and Gentry—

Former Phosphate Mining Lands; Provides conditions for cause of action against certain former phosphate mine sites; authorizes landowners to record certain notice of former phosphate mines; specifies requirements for such notice; requires DOH to conduct gamma radiation surveys of former phosphate land parcels upon petition; requires that specified documentation of radiation levels be submitted in certain civil actions related to phosphate mining. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 896 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice and Senator Gaetz—

School Safety; Requiring sheriffs to assist public postsecondary educational institutions in implementing guardian programs under certain provisions; authorizing public postsecondary educational institutions to participate in the school guardian program; creating the offense of discharging a weapon or firearm within 1,000 feet of a school, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

Similar to CS/CS/HB 757, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 7036 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Simon)—

Education; Providing that district school boards are not subject to the requirements for rules in chapter 120 when making and adopting rules with public input at a public meeting; authorizing a student to carry a United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved epinephrine delivery device, rather than an epinephrine auto-injector; revising requirements for attendance reporting by private prekindergarten providers; revising required instruction on the principles of agriculture; providing that completion of 2 years of marching band satisfies two specified credit requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Compare to CS/CS/CS/HB 1071, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/CS/SB 902 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Garcia—

Department of Health; Revising requirements for department approval of qualified physicians and medical directors of medical marijuana treatment centers; prohibiting medical marijuana treatment center cultivating, processing, or dispensing facilities from being located within a specified distance of parks, child care facilities, or facilities providing early learning services; creating the Neurofibromatosis Disease Grant Program within the department; revising duties of the department in administering the Early Steps Program; authorizing a registered nurse to delegate the administration of certain controlled substances to a home health aide for medically fragile children under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Similar to CS/HB 733, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1260 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator DiCeglie—

Services During a State of Emergency; Requiring the Department of Management Services to enter into and maintain state term contracts for building code inspection services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 7034 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (Rodriguez)—

Ratification of Rules of the Department of Environmental Protection; Ratifying a specified rule relating to the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee Rivers and Priority Springs minimum flows and recovery strategy for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule exceeding the specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase in regulatory costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

LOCAL BILLS CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11, 2026

HB 4001 (LB) by Representative Tant—

Jefferson County; Limits compensation to health care provider that provides medical services for inmate housed in Jefferson County detention center if provider does not have contract with county to provide such services; limits compensation to entity that provides emergency medical transportation services for inmate housed in Jefferson County detention center if entity does not have contract with county to provide such services. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 4003 (LB) by the Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Benarroch—

City of Marco Island, Collier County; Requires special election be held to fill any vacancy on city council upon resolution adopted by council; provides exception for vacancies occurring within 1 year before general election; revises circumstances under which Governor is required to fill vacancies; provides for Governor to call special election in certain circumstances; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of qualified electors residing in the City of Marco Island voting in a referendum held on November 3, 2026

CS/HB 4005 (LB) by the Committee on Government Operations Subcommittee and Representative Botana—

City of Naples Airport Authority, Collier County; Removes provisions relating to City of Naples Airport Authority's members' duties & responsibilities; removes provisions that prohibit officers & employees of city from being authority members; removes provisions that prohibit authority members from receiving compensation; provides for authority memberships by election rather than by appointment; provides requirements for elections; provides authority membership terms & qualifications; provides interim services & vacancy fillings. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4007 (LB) by Representative Snyder—

Martin County; Requires Martin County Board of County Commissioners to create by ordinance process for distribution of funds from County Health Care Fund to all licensed hospitals in county; provides criteria to be qualified as indigent residents of county, for purpose of receiving county payments for hospital care; removes provisions relating to County Health Care Review Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4011 (LB) by Representatives Trabulsy and Overdorf—

St. Lucie County Mosquito Control District, St. Lucie County; Revises district boundaries; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors within the areas proposed to be added to the St. Lucie County Mosquito Control District as described in section 1 of this act voting in a referendum

CS/HB 4013 (LB) by the Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs Subcommittee, Representative Botana and others—

Lee County; Revises boundaries of Iona-McGregor Fire Protection & Rescue Service District; removes chapter laws relating to Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District; provides for merger of districts; provides for transition of governing body; transfers assets & liabilities of Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District to Iona-McGregor Fire Protection & Rescue Service District; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors of the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District and the Iona-McGregor Fire Protection and Rescue Service District voting in a referendum to be held on November 3, 2026

CS/HB 4017 (LB) by the Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs Subcommittee and Representative Black—

Nassau County; Removes chapter laws relating to Nassau County Recreation & Water Conservation & Control Act; abolishes Nassau County Recreation & Water Conservation & Control District No. 1; transfers all assets & liabilities of district to Board of County Commissioners of Nassau County. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4019 (LB) by Representative Cobb—

Compensation for Health Care Services for Inmates in Lake County; Limits compensation to health care provider & to hospital designated as trauma center that provide medical services for inmate housed in Lake County detention center if provider & hospital do not have contract with county to provide such services; limits compensation to entity that provides emergency medical transportation services for inmate housed in Lake County detention center if entity does not have contract with county to provide such services. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4025 (LB) by Representative Snyder—

Martin and Palm Beach Counties; Provides for transfer of specified real property, together with improvements thereon, from Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement Trust Fund to Village Council of Village of Tequesta; provides requirements for use, ownership, & sale or disposition of real property; provides for conveyance of real property by specific date. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law or on June 1, 2026, whichever occurs earlier

HB 4027 (LB) by Representative Owen—

Hillsborough County Public Schools, Hillsborough County; Provides for elected superintendent of schools; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law, except that section 2 shall take effect only upon approval by a majority vote of those qualified electors of Hillsborough County voting in a referendum to be held in conjunction with the 2026 general election

HB 4029 (LB) by Representative Owen and others—

Hillsborough County Charter; Revises number of commissioners on Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners; revises territory of each county district; revises district reapportionment requirements; revises vote count requirements for enactment of ordinances & resolutions, for county internal auditor appointments & removals, for county administrator appointments & removals, for county attorney appointments & removals, & for charter amendments; revises process for appointing charter review board members & for proposing amendments to charter; provides requirements for transitions to single-member district & to 11-member board of commissioners; requires referendum. Effective Date: Upon its approval by a majority vote of the qualified electors of Hillsborough County voting in a referendum conducted in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections currently in force

CS/HB 4033 (LB) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee and Representative Gerwig—

Palm Beach County; Revises definitions of terms "family day care home" & "large family child care home" to specify maximum number of children allowed to receive care in such homes in county. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

CS/HB 4035 (LB) by the Committee on State Affairs Committee and Representative Edmonds—

Palm Beach County; Revises requirements for examinations administered by Palm Beach County Construction Industry Licensing Board for certificates of competency; revises Board's applicant review process. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4037 (LB) by Representative Maggard—

Pasco County Mosquito Control District, Pasco County; Revises term limits for members of governing body of district; requires Pasco County Board of County Commissioners to designate geographical districts by specified numerals; provides requirements for specified subdistrict. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

HB 4039 (LB) by Representative Daley and others—

Solid Waste Disposal Facility in Broward County; Defines "Monarch Hill Landfill"; requires feasibility study & public hearing before any expansion of Monarch Hill Landfill; provides requirements for study & public hearing. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

HB 4041 (LB) by Representative Brackett—
