CS/CS/CS/SB 354, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator McClain—

Blue Ribbon Projects; Requiring that a development project meet certain requirements to qualify as a blue ribbon project; providing maximum residential density and nonresidential intensity permitted within the development area of a blue ribbon project; requiring a blue ribbon project to have a blue ribbon plan; requiring a project to receive dollar-for-dollar credits from a local government under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Read the second time, amended, and read the third time on March 5, 2026.

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR FRIDAY, MARCH 13, 2026

CS/CS/SB 7038 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, and the Committee on Education Postsecondary (Calatayud)—

Education; Requiring each Florida College System institution and state university to waive tuition and fees for members of the Florida State Guard if certain conditions are met; requiring entities that offer fee-based services to individuals who are blind or visually impaired to disclose in writing whether the service may be obtained elsewhere at no cost; authorizing school district career centers to use alternative methods adopted by the board in lieu of common placement tests to assess students in basic communication and computation skills; providing that a fee waiver only applies to a full-time undergraduate student, beginning with a specified academic year, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Compare to CS/CS/HB 1279(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 7036 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Simon)—

Education; Providing that district school boards are not subject to the requirements for rules in chapter 120 when making and adopting rules with public input at a public meeting; authorizing a student to carry a United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved epinephrine delivery device, rather than an epinephrine auto-injector; revising requirements for attendance reporting by private prekindergarten providers; revising required instruction on the principles of agriculture; providing that completion of 2 years of marching band satisfies two specified credit requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

Compare to CS/CS/CS/HB 1071, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 208 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator McClain—

Land Use and Development Regulations; Requiring that the amount of certain application fees reasonably relate to certain costs; requiring that certain interlocal agreements between school boards and local governments address reasonable access to certain public easements and public rights-of-way; requiring that local government comprehensive plans and land development regulations include factors for assessing the compatibility of certain residential uses; authorizing the placement of certain residential manufactured buildings on any lot in a recreational vehicle park; requiring that an offsite constructed residential dwelling be permitted as of right in certain zoning districts, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1260 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator DiCeglie—

Services During a State of Emergency; Requiring the Department of Management Services to enter into and maintain state term contracts for building code inspection services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 7034 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (Rodriguez)—

Ratification of Rules of the Department of Environmental Protection; Ratifying a specified rule relating to the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee Rivers and Priority Springs minimum flows and recovery strategy for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule exceeding the specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase in regulatory costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

**SENATE BILLS ON
SECOND READING**

CS/CS/SB 92 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Gaetz—

Employee Protections; Providing that public officers, public employees, and local government attorneys commit a breach of the public trust when they initiate adverse personnel actions against employees of an agency or independent contractor under certain circumstances; prohibiting agencies and independent contractors from taking specified actions against employees or certain persons for disclosing certain information to the Commission on Ethics; requiring that information disclosed include specified violations or alleged violations; providing that specified provisions protect employees and persons who submit written complaints to the commission or provide information to an investigator during an investigation of a complaint or referral, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Committee on Ethics and Elections reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 194 (2R) by Senator Martin and others—

Charlie Kirk Day of Remembrance; Designating October 14 of each year as "Charlie Kirk Day of Remembrance"; authorizing the Governor to issue an annual proclamation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 216 (2R) by Senator McClain—

Verification of Reemployment Assistance Benefit Eligibility; Citing this act as the "Promoting Work, Deterring Fraud Act of 2026"; revising circumstances under which the Department of Commerce disqualifies claimants from reemployment assistance benefits; requiring the department to verify claimants' identities before paying benefits; providing duties of the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/CS/CS/SB 260 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Transportation and Senator Burgess—

Removal, Storage, and Cleanup of Electric Vehicles; Requiring counties to establish a daily administration storage fee for the proper storage of certain electric vehicles; providing a maximum amount for such fees; defining the terms "daily administration storage fee" and "proper storage"; requiring any wrecker service or towing-storage wrecker or operator to collect and submit specific data to the Division of State Fire Marshal relating to stored damaged or submerged electric vehicles by a specified date; providing that motor vehicle insurers are not required to pay certain costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 480 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government and Senator Harrell—

Information Technology; Providing for a type two transfer of the duties and functions of the Florida Digital Service from the Department of Management Services to the Division of Integrated Government Innovation and Technology; creating the Division of Integrated Government Innovation and Technology (DIGIT) within the Executive Office of the Governor; requiring DIGIT to operate as the state enterprise organization for information technology governance and as the lead entity responsible for understanding needs and environments, creating standards and strategy, supporting state agency technology efforts, and reporting on the state of information technology in this state, etc. Effective Date: 01/05/2027

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 500 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, Senator Avila and others—

Security for Statewide Constitutional Office Candidates; Requiring the Department of Law Enforcement to provide certain candidates with a protective security detail for a specified time period, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice

CS/CS/SB 606 (2R) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Health Policy, Senator Smith and others—

Drowning Prevention Education; Requiring the Department of Health to develop educational materials on drowning prevention safety measures and safe bathing practices for specified purposes; providing requirements for such materials; requiring hospitals, birth centers, and home birth providers to provide the educational materials to new parents and caregivers as part of their postpartum education and care, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 636 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government and Senator Leek—

Beach Management; Requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to review certain data when designating certain beaches as critically eroded and in need of restoration and nourishment; requiring that certain beaches, whose local government preserved funds for a certain purpose and which possess specified features, be designated as critically eroded; revising the list of areas that may receive designation as an area of critical state concern, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 796 (2R) by the Committees on Rules, Regulated Industries, Senator Bradley and others—

Veterinary Medicine; Citing this act as the "Veterinary Workforce Innovation Act"; increasing the amount of time for which prescriptions based solely on a veterinary telehealth evaluation may be issued for certain drugs; providing requirements for veterinary professional associates to receive certificates of registration from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; requiring the department to make a list of veterinary professional associate registrants publicly available on its website; authorizing the department to rescind the registration of a veterinary professional associate under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 892 (2R) by Senator Martin—

Habitual Felony Offenders, Habitual Violent Felony Offenders, Three-time Violent Felony Offenders, and Violent Career Criminals; Revising the definitions of the terms "habitual felony offender," "habitual violent felony offender," "three-time violent felony offender," and "violent career criminal"; revising the procedures that a court must follow in separate proceedings to determine whether a defendant is a habitual felony offender, a habitual violent felony offender, a three-time violent felony offender, or a violent career criminal, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 1054 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Martin—

Traffic Infractions Resulting in a Crash with Another Vehicle; Requiring the imposition of specified civil penalties and periods of driver license suspension on a person found at a mandatory hearing to have committed certain traffic infractions that resulted in a crash with another vehicle, in addition to any other penalties; requiring persons cited for specified infractions that result in a crash with another vehicle to appear at a certain mandatory hearing; requiring certain owners and operators of motor vehicles to establish and maintain the ability to respond in damages for liability on account of certain accidents, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 1066 (2R) by the Committee on Appropriations, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Brodeur—

Tributaries of the St. Johns River; Citing this act as the "Northeast Florida Rivers, Springs, and Community Investment Act"; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection, by a specified date, to hire a project lead to oversee the implementation of the act; requiring the department to develop, by a specified date, a project plan for the restoration of the Ocklawaha River; providing that the project plan is an environmental restoration or enhancement project subject to a general permit from the department and water management districts; providing for the creation of the Northeast Florida River and Springs Recreation and Economic Development Advisory Council by a specified date, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations

CS/SB 1118 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Avila—

Public Records/Data Centers; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information relating to the plans, intentions, or interest of a person to locate a data center; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 484 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 1338 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Burton—

Charitable Giving; Prohibiting a charitable organization that accepts a contribution pursuant to a written donor-imposed restriction from violating the terms of that restriction; requiring a charitable organization to notify a donor, or a donor's legal representative, if it cannot fulfill a term in the endowment agreement and offer the donor, or the donor's legal representative, an alternative solution that closely matches the initial term in such endowment agreement; prohibiting a state agency or a state official from imposing any annual filing or reporting requirements on certain organizations regulated or exempted from regulation under ch. 496, F.S., which are more burdensome than the requirements authorized by state law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1396 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Burton—

Litigation Financing Consumer Protection; Citing this act as the "Litigation Investment Safeguards and Transparency Act"; authorizing courts to consider the existence of a litigation financing agreement under certain circumstances; prohibiting specified acts by litigation financiers; requiring certain parties to a legal proceeding, or their counsels of record, which have entered into a litigation financing agreement with a foreign person, a foreign principal, or a sovereign wealth fund to file and serve a notice identifying specified information with the court, agency, or tribunal and all other parties to the legal proceeding within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

CS/HB 1283 (2R) by the Committee on Government Operations Subcommittee, Representatives Fabricio, Blanco and others—

Complaints Against Law Enforcement and Correctional Officers; Requires copy of complaint, signed by complainant under oath, to be provided to law enforcement officers & correctional officers who are under investigation before any interrogation begins; provides exception if complaint is accompanied by corroborating evidence; prohibits certain personnel actions from being taken against law enforcement officer or correctional officer unless such officer receives copy of complaint signed by complainant under oath unless certain exception applies; requires certain investigative files to be included in officer's personnel file; prohibits investigation that does not result in imposition of disciplinary action from affecting officer's ability to receive promotion, raise, or any other commendation; requires complaint against law enforcement officer or correctional officer to be in writing & signed under oath by person filing complaint unless certain exception applies; provides penalties for making false complaint. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

CS/CS/SB 1178 (2R1) by the Committees on Appropriations, Ethics and Elections, Senator Grall and others—

Foreign Influence; Citing this act as the "Foreign Interference Restriction and Enforcement Act"; prohibiting preplanned adoption agreements unless certain conditions are met; prohibiting specified persons from soliciting or accepting anything of value from a designated foreign terrorist organization, a foreign country of concern, or persons or entities representing such organizations or countries; authorizing any appropriate tax collector to revoke or refuse to renew business tax receipts of specified individuals, businesses, or entities; prohibiting a governmental entity from knowingly entering into certain contracts with foreign sources of concern; removing the Florida-China Institute from the list of linkage institutes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations
