SB 584 (SO) by Senator Avila and others—

Commercial Driving Schools; Authorizing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to enter into interagency agreements with tax collectors for a specified purpose; specifying that such an interagency agreement is a delegation of authority of the department to the tax collector; providing that such an interagency agreement may include, but need not be limited to, certain grants of authority, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 590 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Bradley—

Statute of Limitations Period for Violations Involving Required Reports Concerning Children; Providing that the period of limitation for offenses related to specified required reports concerning children does not begin to run until a law enforcement agency is made aware of the violation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 7024 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Mayfield)—

OGSR/Cybersecurity, Information Technology, and Operational Technology Information; Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the cybersecurity, information technology, and operational technology information held by an agency; providing an exemption from public meetings requirements for any portion of a meeting that would reveal such information; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SB 7026 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Mayfield)—

OGSR/Trade Secret Held by an Agency; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for a trade secret held by an agency, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 7020 (SO) by the Committee on Agriculture (Truenow)—

OGSR/Aquaculture Records Held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public record requirements for certain aquaculture records held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

SENATE BILLS ON SECOND READING

CS/SB 50 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Gaetz—

Veterans Affairs; Revising the admissions process for veterans treatment court programs; authorizing the multidisciplinary team to determine eligibility for veterans treatment court programs; authorizing sentencing courts to divert defendants to veterans treatment court programs under certain circumstances; requiring that a defendant's satisfactory completion of the program be a condition of the defendant's probation or community control, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 54 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Sharief and others—

Use of Substances Affecting Cognitive Function; Requiring medical examiners to take specified actions when performing an autopsy on a decedent who is a violent offender; requiring that autopsy reports for such individuals include certain findings and information; authorizing the release of certain patient records to law enforcement agencies without patient authorization under certain circumstances; requiring school safety specialists to provide school district staff with certain training on the adverse effects of specified substances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 62 (2R) by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Arrington and others—

Candidate Qualification; Specifying that a person seeking to qualify for office as a candidate must be a registered member of a political party, or registered without any party affiliation, for 365 consecutive days preceding the beginning of qualifying for an election; authorizing qualified candidates or certain political parties to challenge compliance with specified provisions by filing suit in a specified circuit court; prohibiting a person from being qualified as a candidate for nomination or election and appearing on the ballot under specified circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 176 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education and Senator Polsky—

Public Postsecondary Education Safety Policies and Procedures; Requiring state universities and Florida College System institutions to adopt and implement specified policies and procedures relating to safety; providing requirements for such policies and procedures; requiring state universities and Florida College System institutions to annually review and update the policies and procedures, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 178 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Jones—

Athletics in Public K-12 Schools; Requiring the Florida High School Athletic Association to adopt bylaws authorizing a head coach to support the welfare of a student by using personal funds to provide certain effects to the student; requiring the head coach to report such use of personal funds to the association; providing that such use of personal funds is presumed not to be an impermissible benefit, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 216 (2R) by Senator McClain—

Verification of Reemployment Assistance Benefit Eligibility; Citing this act as the "Promoting Work, Deterring Fraud Act of 2026"; revising circumstances under which the Department of Commerce disqualifies claimants from reemployment assistance benefits; requiring the department to verify claimants' identities before paying benefits; providing duties of the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 382 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Truenow and others—

Electric Bicycles; Providing requirements for the operation of electric bicycles; prohibiting the operation of an electric bicycle above a certain speed under certain circumstances; creating the Electric Bicycle Safety Task Force adjunct to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; requiring the Florida Highway Patrol and each police department and sheriff's office to maintain a certain list, beginning on a certain date, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 420 (2R) by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, Senator Burgess and others—

Patriotic Displays at Public Schools; Requiring, subject to legislative appropriation, each district school board to adopt rules to require the display of portraits of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln at each public school in the district; requiring the Department of Education to select the portraits and make them available to each school district, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 488 (2R) by Senator Massullo—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Requiring licensure in lieu of registration of motor carriers operating certain qualified motor vehicles; revising due dates for motor fuel use tax returns submitted by licensed motor carriers; authorizing the department to inspect records necessary to verify the tax returns of motor carriers, motor fuel retail dealers, and motor fuel wholesale distributors; revising the apparent amount of property damage which requires the driver of a vehicle involved in a crash to notify law enforcement of the crash, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 490 (2R) by Senator Massullo—

Public Records/E-mail Addresses Collected by the Department of Highway Safety for Providing Renewal Notices; Expanding an exemption from public records requirements for e-mail addresses collected by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for providing renewal notices to include e-mail addresses collected for use as a method of notification generally and not only for the purpose of providing renewal notices; expanding the exemption to include e-mail addresses collected for use as a method of notification related to vessel registrations; providing retroactive applicability; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 488 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

CS/SB 502 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Wright—

Concurrent Legislative Jurisdiction over United States Military Installations; Accepting concurrent legislative jurisdiction with the United States over delinquency matters on United States military installations if such matters meet certain criteria; establishing circuit court jurisdiction over such matters, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/SB 564 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Yarborough—

Student Volunteers at Polling Locations; Providing that specified high school students who volunteer to assist poll workers are not subject to provisions prohibiting certain agencies and state and local officials from soliciting, accepting, or otherwise using private funds or certain personal services for election-related expenses, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 624 (2R) by Senator Yarborough and others—

Batterers' Intervention Program Activities; Authorizing batterers' intervention programs to offer supplemental faith-based activities, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

SB 892 (2R) by Senator Martin—

Habitual Felony Offenders, Habitual Violent Felony Offenders, Three-time Violent Felony Offenders, and Violent Career Criminals; Revising the definitions of the terms "habitual felony offender," "habitual violent felony offender," "three-time violent felony offender," and "violent career criminal"; revising the procedures that a court must follow in separate proceedings to determine whether a defendant is a habitual felony offender, a habitual violent felony offender, a three-time violent felony offender, or a violent career criminal, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy

SB 936 (2R) by Senator McClain—

Temporary Door Locking Devices; Defining the term "temporary door locking device"; authorizing temporary door locking devices to be installed at any height; requiring the Florida Building Commission to incorporate certain standards for temporary door locking devices into the Florida Building Code; requiring the use of temporary door locking devices be integrated into building safety plans, safety drills, and training programs for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1396 (2R) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Burton—

Litigation Financing Consumer Protection; Citing this act as the "Litigation Investment Safeguards and Transparency Act"; authorizing courts to consider the existence of a litigation financing agreement under certain circumstances; prohibiting specified acts by litigation financiers; requiring certain parties to a legal proceeding, or their counsels of record, which have entered into a litigation financing agreement with a foreign person, a foreign principal, or a sovereign wealth fund to file and serve a notice identifying specified information with the court, agency, or tribunal and all other parties to the legal proceeding within a specified timeframe, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules

SB 7022 (2R) by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Simon)—

Public Records/Examination and Assessment Instruments; Deleting a duplicative exemption from public records requirements for certain examination and assessment instruments; requiring the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors to adopt rules and regulations, respectively, governing the retention and disposal process for specified records; deleting a provision requiring the State Board of Education and the Board of Governors to adopt certain rules and regulations, respectively, governing access to records; extending the scheduled repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

HB 167 (2R) by Representatives McClure and Gentry—

Former Phosphate Mining Lands; Provides conditions for cause of action against certain former phosphate mine sites; authorizes landowners to record certain notice of former phosphate mines; specifies requirements for such notice; requires DOH to conduct gamma radiation surveys of former phosphate land parcels upon petition; requires that specified documentation of radiation levels be submitted in certain civil actions related to phosphate mining. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 32 (2R1) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Sharief and others—
