### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2026

#### **SB 7020 (SO) by the Committee on Agriculture (Truenow)—**

**OGSR/Aquaculture Records Held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public record requirements for certain aquaculture records held by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; removing the scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Identical to **HB 7011(HC)** in the Committee on Rules*

#### **SB 7026 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Mayfield)—**

**OGSR/Trade Secret Held by an Agency;** Amending a provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for a trade secret held by an agency, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

#### **SB 7024 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability (Mayfield)—**

**OGSR/Cybersecurity, Information Technology, and Operational Technology Information;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for the cybersecurity, information technology, and operational technology information held by an agency; providing an exemption from public meetings requirements for any portion of a meeting that would reveal such information; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

#### **CS/SB 590 (SO) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Bradley—**

**Statute of Limitations Period for Violations Involving Required Reports Concerning Children;** Providing that the period of limitation for offenses related to specified required reports concerning children does not begin to run until a law enforcement agency is made aware of the violation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

#### **SB 584 (SO) by Senator Avila and others—**

**Commercial Driving Schools;** Authorizing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to enter into interagency agreements with tax collectors for a specified purpose; specifying that such an interagency agreement is a delegation of authority of the department to the tax collector; providing that such an interagency agreement may include, but need not be limited to, certain grants of authority, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

#### **CS/SB 340 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy, Senator Harrell and others—**

**Human Trafficking Education for Nurse Licensure;** Revising requirements for initial licensure as a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse, beginning on a specified date, to include completion of a certain course on human trafficking, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 32 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Sharief and others—**

**Injunctions for Protection;** Defining the terms “serious violence by a known person” and “serious bodily injury”; creating a cause of action for an injunction for protection in cases of serious violence by a known person; prohibiting the clerk of the court from assessing a fee for the filing of such injunction for protection; requiring the clerk of the court to electronically transmit copies of specified documents within a certain timeframe after a court issues such injunction for protection; requiring law enforcement officers to accept a certified copy of such injunction for protection from the petitioner and immediately serve it upon a respondent, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 210 (SO) by Senator Sharief and others—**

**Public Records/Petitions for Injunctions for Protection Against Serious Violence by a Known Person;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for petitions, and the contents thereof, for injunctions for protection against serious violence by a known person; providing an exemption from public records requirements for information that can be used to identify a petitioner or respondent in such a petition for an injunction; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 32 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/CS/SB 302 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, Senator Garcia and others—**

**Nature-based Coastal Resiliency;** Authorizing certain dredging and filling of submerged lands and placement of certain shorelines and seawalls within the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve; authorizing the erection of certain structures within aquatic preserves; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection, by a specified date, to develop guidelines and standards for nature-based methods to address coastal resiliency and to adopt rules, subject to legislative ratification, for a statewide permitting process for such coastal resiliency, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 192 (SO) by Senator Martin and others—**

**Patient Funds Held in Trust by Chiropractic Physicians;** Deleting the limitation on the amount of patient funds a chiropractic physician may hold in trust for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 246 (SO) by the Committee on Fiscal Policy, Senator Gruters and others—**

**Specialty License Plates;** Increasing the annual use fee for the Florida Wildflower license plate and providing a discount for owners purchasing the plate for more than a specified number of vehicles; deleting a restriction on who may be issued the Fraternal Order of Police license plate; directing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to develop specified specialty license plates, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

---

**CS/SB 1682 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government and Senator Trumbull—**

**Local Administration of Vessel Restrictions;** Authorizing counties and municipalities to adopt ordinances to administer, in coordination with the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, certain provisions relating to vessels at risk of becoming derelict, the enforcement of long-term anchoring permit requirements, and derelict and migrant vessels, respectively; authorizing counties and municipalities to designate code enforcement officers for specified purposes; providing that certain determinations made by the code enforcement officers are for administrative purposes only and are not criminal findings, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 1622 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez—**

**Penalties for Late-filed Disclosures or Statements of Financial Interests;** Prohibiting the assessment of a fine for a reporting person's first late filing of a disclosure or statement of financial interests if certain conditions are met, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections; reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 1480 (SO) by the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Burton—**

**Temporary Certificates for Practice in Areas of Critical Need;** Revising the conditions under which the Board of Medicine, the Board of Osteopathic Medicine, and the Board of Nursing, respectively, are authorized to issue temporary certificates for practice in areas of critical need; authorizing certificateholders to continue primary care services after such areas lose their critical need designation under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

## **SB 1216 (SO) by Senator Rodriguez and others—**

**Public School Personnel Compensation;** Providing that cost-of-living adjustments are for employees with direct student contact; deleting a limitation on such adjustments; deleting certain limitations for salary adjustments under the performance salary schedule, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Appropriations*

---

## **CS/CS/CS/SB 290 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Fiscal Policy, Agriculture and Senator Truenow—**

**Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services;** Prohibiting counties from enacting or enforcing any law that restricts or prohibits the use of gasoline-powered farm equipment or gasoline-powered landscape equipment or that distinguishes such equipment from any other equipment under certain circumstances; prohibiting an application for a development on an ecologically significant parcel in a low-density municipality from being administratively approved without an attestation provided by the developer; establishing the Florida Food Animal Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program; revising the Florida Forest Service's powers, authority, and duties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026
