## BILLS ON THE CALENDAR

### SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR FOR WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2026

#### **CS/CS/SB 1028 (SO) by the Committees on Fiscal Policy, Banking and Insurance and Senator Gruters—**

**Citizens Property Insurance Corporation;** Prohibiting the corporation from issuing or renewing coverage for commercial residential and commercial nonresidential risks under certain circumstances; requiring the corporation to establish a personal lines clearinghouse for specified purposes; authorizing the corporation to share risk exposure and policy information with the commercial lines clearinghouse administrator; specifying that applicants for new commercial lines residential coverage are not eligible for coverage from the corporation under certain circumstances; providing applicability; revising the rights and authorizations for certain independent insurance agents, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

#### **CS/CS/SB 198 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Banking and Insurance, Senator Rouson and others—**

**Virtual Currency Kiosks;** Revising the definition of the term “money services business”; revising the requirements for certain rules adopted by the Financial Services Commission; revising the actions by money services businesses, authorized vendors, or affiliated parties which constitute grounds for disciplinary action; prohibiting persons from engaging in certain business unless they are registered or exempt from registration; prohibiting a virtual currency kiosk business from operating in this state without registering or renewing its registration, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect January 1, 2027

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance; the Committee on Commerce and Tourism reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

#### **CS/SB 382 (SO) by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Truenow and others—**

**Electric Bicycles;** Providing requirements for the operation of electric bicycles; prohibiting the operation of an electric bicycle above a certain speed under certain circumstances; creating the Electric Bicycle Safety Task Force adjunct to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; requiring the Florida Highway Patrol and each police department and sheriff's office to maintain a certain list, beginning on a certain date, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

#### **CS/SB 482 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Leek—**

**Artificial Intelligence Bill of Rights;** Prohibiting a governmental entity from extending or renewing a contract with specified entities, beginning on a specified date; creating the “Artificial Intelligence Bill of Rights”; providing the rights of residents relating to the use of artificial intelligence; requiring companion chatbot platforms to prohibit a minor from becoming or being an account holder unless the minor's parent or guardian consents; requiring an educational entity to provide parents with specified notice before providing a student with access to an artificial intelligence instructional tool, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

**CS/SB 7030 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, and Commerce and Tourism (Leek)—**

**Public Records/Investigations by the Department of Legal Affairs;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for information held by the Department of Legal Affairs relating to notifications or investigations of certain companion chatbot violations; providing an exemption from public records requirements for information held by the department relating to notifications or investigations of certain bot-related consumer protection violations; requiring that certain information remain confidential and exempt upon the completion or cessation of an investigation; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 482 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

**CS/CS/SB 484 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Senator Avila and others—**

**Data Centers;** Prohibiting an agency from entering into a nondisclosure agreement or other contract that restricts the agency from disclosing certain information to the public; specifying that local governments maintain authority to exercise power and responsibility over comprehensive planning and land development regulations related to large load customers; requiring the Florida Public Service Commission to develop minimum tariff and service requirements for large load customers; prohibiting the governing board of a water management district or the Department of Environmental Protection from issuing a permit for the consumptive use of water to a large-scale data center under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 844 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services and Senator Jones—**

**Sickle Cell Disease Care Management and Treatment Continuing Education;** Revising requirements for a continuing education course on prescribing controlled substances which health care practitioners are required to complete, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1014 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Mayfield—**

**Provision of Municipal Utility Service to Owners Outside the Municipal Limits;** Prohibiting a municipal utility from declining to extend service to properties outside its corporate limits under certain circumstances; requiring a municipal utility to expand its service to an owner who makes such a request under certain circumstances, subject to the utility's service requirements; requiring the municipal utility to make a determination within a specified timeframe and provide such determination to the owner in writing; requiring the municipal utility to provide the owner with specified information and to connect properties in a timely manner; authorizing a municipal utility to establish minimum application filing requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

**SB 428 (SO) by Senator Yarborough and others—**

**Swimming Lesson Voucher Program;** Revising the age requirements for children receiving a voucher through the Swimming Lesson Voucher Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026
