#### **CS/CS/CS/SB 354, 1st Eng. (3R) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator McClain—**

**Blue Ribbon Projects;** Requiring that a development project meet certain requirements to qualify as a blue ribbon project; providing maximum residential density and nonresidential intensity permitted within the development area of a blue ribbon project; requiring a blue ribbon project to have a blue ribbon plan; requiring a project to receive dollar-for-dollar credits from a local government under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

#### **CS/SB 1366 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, Senator Brodeur and others—**

**Claims Against the Government;** Increasing the statutory limits on the liability of the state and its agencies and subdivisions for tort claims; revising exceptions relating to instituting actions on tort claims against the state or one of its agencies or subdivisions; revising the period after which the failure of certain entities to make a final disposition of a claim shall be deemed a final denial of the claim for certain purposes; revising the statute of limitations for tort claims against the state or one of its agencies or subdivisions and exceptions thereto, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

**Health Care Coverage;** Establishing the Joint Legislative Committee on Medicaid Oversight for specified purposes; revising encounter data reporting requirements for prepaid Medicaid plans; requiring managed care plans to report to the agency and the Office of Insurance Regulation the existence of and specified details relating to certain affiliations by a specified date and annually thereafter; revising requirements for contracts between a pharmacy benefit manager and a participating pharmacy; revising and specifying additional practices pharmacy benefit managers are prohibited from engaging in, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2026

**Criteria for Determining Criminal Gang Membership;** Revising the definition of the term "criminal gang member"; defining the term "gang-related language", etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/SB 896 (SO) by the Committees on Appropriations, Criminal Justice and Senator Gaetz—**

**School Safety;** Requiring sheriffs to assist public postsecondary educational institutions in implementing guardian programs under certain provisions; authorizing public postsecondary educational institutions to participate in the school guardian program; creating the offense of discharging a weapon or firearm within 1,000 feet of a school, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

**CS/SB 934 (SO) by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Rodriguez—**

**Areas of Critical State Concern;** Providing an exemption from specified payment and performance bond requirements for specified entities under specified conditions; extending the time period specific Florida Forever appropriations must be spent on land acquisition in the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 1192 (SO) by the Committee on Appropriations, Senator Polsky and others—**

**Customer Service Callback Queues;** Establishing a pilot program to require the Department of Commerce to use a callback queue for returning certain calls; requiring that calls be returned in a specified manner; requiring the department to report specified information to the Legislature by a certain date, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations*

*Similar to HB 1031(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1266 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Commerce and Tourism and Senator Calatayud—**

**Cybersecurity Internships;** Requiring the Department of Commerce to create the Cybersecurity Experiential Learning Program in a specified fiscal year, subject to legislative appropriation; requiring the department use a certain percentage of appropriated funds in a specified fiscal year to enter into an agreement with Cyber Florida at the University of South Florida to collaborate in designing the program for implementation and plan for expansion of the program; requiring Cyber Florida to report specified information to the department; providing the department with authorized uses of unspent funds, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1294 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Bradley—**

**Biosolids Management;** Prohibiting the land application of bulk Class AA biosolids fertilizer and compost products from exceeding the appropriate agronomic rate; requiring the owner or operator of certain land application sites to maintain application records for a specified timeframe and make such records available to the Department of Environmental Protection upon request; requiring the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, on a specified basis and beginning on a specified date, to publish and make publicly available recommended agronomic rates for the reuse of bulk Class AA biosolids fertilizer and compost products; prohibiting Class AA biosolids fertilizer products and certain Class AA biosolids compost products from being marketed or distributed for agricultural land application unless specified requirements are met, etc. Effective Date: 11/01/2026

**CS/CS/SB 1362 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development, the Committee on Transportation and Senator Harrell—**

**Vertiports;** Revising the definition of the term “airport infrastructure”; authorizing the Department of Transportation to fund up to specified percentages of public vertiport project costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/CS/SB 7036 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education, and the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 (Simon)—**

**Education;** Providing that district school boards are not subject to the requirements for rules in chapter 120 when making and adopting rules with public input at a public meeting; authorizing a student to carry a United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved epinephrine delivery device, rather than an epinephrine auto-injector; revising requirements for attendance reporting by private prekindergarten providers; revising required instruction on the principles of agriculture; providing that completion of 2 years of marching band satisfies two specified credit requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Pre-K - 12 Education; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 1376 (SO) by the Committee on Education Postsecondary, Senator Burgess and others—**

**Grants for Genetic Counseling Education;** Creating the Genetic Counseling Education Enhancement Grant Program within the State University System; requiring the Board of Governors, subject to legislative appropriation, to award grant funds to state universities for specified purposes; requiring the program to reward excellence among genetic counseling programs based on specified criteria; prohibiting such funds from being used for specified purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/CS/SB 1474 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Gaetz—**

**Biosolids Management;** Prohibiting the Department of Environmental Protection from issuing or renewing a permit for certain biosolids land application sites if there is a permitted wastewater treatment facility that accepts septage for higher levels of treatment and which meets specified requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2027

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 1285(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 1570 (SO) by Senator Gaetz and others—**

**Statewide Project for Missing Persons with Special Needs;** Amending a provision relating to the missing persons with special needs statewide project; providing that the project is created through the centers for autism and related disabilities; requiring that participants for the project be selected based on certain criteria, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Postsecondary; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Higher Education; and reported favorably by the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

*Identical to HB 1405(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 1742 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Martin—**

**Indecent Exposure of Sexual Organs While Observing a Child;** Repealing a provision relating to unnatural and lascivious acts; prohibiting a person from, for a specified purpose, intentionally exposing his or her sexual organs in a lewd or lascivious manner or intentionally performing specified sexual acts while observing a child under 16 years of age; providing criminal penalties; specifying what does not constitute a defense to committing such offense, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**CS/HB 245 (SO) by the Committee on Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Representative Baker and others—**

**Child Pornography Terminology;** Replaces the term "child pornography" with the term "child sexual abuse material." Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/HB 1175 (SO) by the Committee on Health Professions & Programs Subcommittee and Representative Redondo—**

**Safety Design Standards for Office Surgery Suites;** Requires Florida Building Commission & State Fire Marshal to establish safety design standards for certain office surgical suites by specified date; defines "office surgery suite." Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 696 (SO) by the Committee on Rules and Senator Martin—**

**Registration of Trademarks;** Requiring the Department of State to use the international schedule of classes of goods and services for trademarks; deleting provisions relating to the classification of goods and services for trademark purposes; providing online application requirements; requiring the department to establish and maintain a secure Internet website that allows submission of an online trademark registration application and renewal application, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Commerce and Tourism; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Transportation, Tourism, and Economic Development; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

---

**SB 1708 (SO) by Senator Gaetz—**

**Veterinary Licensure;** Deleting the requirement for an applicant for licensure by endorsement to have held a valid active license to practice veterinary medicine in another state, the District of Columbia, or a territory of the United States for a specified amount of time; requiring applicants to hold a valid, active license in good standing to practice veterinary medicine in another state, the District of Columbia, or a territory of the United States, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and reported favorably by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to HB 1509(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/CS/SB 902 (SO) by the Committee on Rules, the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the Committee on Health Policy and Senator Garcia—**

**Department of Health;** Revising requirements for department approval of qualified physicians and medical directors of medical marijuana treatment centers; prohibiting medical marijuana treatment center cultivating, processing, or dispensing facilities from being located within a specified distance of parks, child care facilities, or facilities providing early learning services; creating the Neurofibromatosis Disease Grant Program within the department; revising duties of the department in administering the Early Steps Program; authorizing a registered nurse to delegate the administration of certain controlled substances to a home health aide for medically fragile children under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

**CS/CS/SB 1260 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator DiCeglie—**

**Services During a State of Emergency;** Requiring the Department of Management Services to enter into and maintain state term contracts for building code inspection services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

---

**SB 7034 (SO) by the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources (Rodriguez)—**

**Ratification of Rules of the Department of Environmental Protection;** Ratifying a specified rule relating to the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee Rivers and Priority Springs minimum flows and recovery strategy for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule exceeding the specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase in regulatory costs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

**CS/SB 68 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services and Senator Harrell—**

**Health Care Patient Protection;** Requiring hospitals with emergency departments to develop and implement policies and procedures and conduct training; authorizing a hospital with an emergency department to conduct the National Pediatric Readiness Project's Open Assessment under certain circumstances; requiring the Agency for Health Care Administration to adopt certain rules for comprehensive emergency management plans, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Policy; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; and the Committee on Fiscal Policy reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/HB 355(HC) in the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/CS/SB 208 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Judiciary and Senator McClain—**

**Land Use and Development Regulations;** Requiring that the amount of certain application fees reasonably relate to certain costs; requiring that certain interlocal agreements between school boards and local governments address reasonable access to certain public easements and public rights-of-way; requiring that local government comprehensive plans and land development regulations include factors for assessing the compatibility of certain residential uses; authorizing the placement of certain residential manufactured buildings on any lot in a recreational vehicle park; requiring that an offsite constructed residential dwelling be permitted as of right in certain zoning districts, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2027

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Rules*

*Similar to CS/CS/CS/HB 399, 1st Eng.(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 350 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Grall—**

**Public Records/Crime Victims;** Expanding a public records exemption for crime victims to include the name and personal identification number of a victim and any other information that could be used to locate, intimidate, harass, or abuse the victim; providing that such exemption includes the portions of records generated by any agency that regularly generates or receives information from or concerning victims of crime; providing for a public records exemption for the identity of a victim's family member, lawful representative, or next of kin and any other information that could be used to locate, intimidate, harass, or abuse these individuals; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; and the Committee on Rules reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Identical to CS/HB 1113(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 532 (SO) by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Simon and others—**

**Clerks of the Court;** Authorizing the cumulative excess of funds to be used in the development of the total combined budgets of the clerks of the court; requiring that a court use certain sale procedures in a foreclosure action; providing that only a clerk of court may conduct a foreclosure sale, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary; reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Compare to CS/HB 925(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/SB 576 (SO) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Harrell—**

**Local Government Cybersecurity;** Creating the Local Government Cybersecurity Protection Program within the Florida Digital Service; requiring the grant program to be administered by the Florida Digital Service; requiring the Florida Digital Service to enter into certain data-sharing agreements with local governments for a specified purpose; requiring the Florida Digital Service to contract for information technology commodities and services and award such commodities and services to local governments, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2026

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability; the Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government reports the committee substitute favorably; and the Committee on Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably*

*Similar to CS/CS/HB 1085(HC) in the Committee on Rules*

---

**CS/CS/SB 698 (SO) by the Committees on Rules, Environment and Natural Resources and Senator Martin—**

**Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System Permits;** Prohibiting a municipality or political subdivision of the state from requiring owners and builders of certain residences to receive construction permits from the Department of Environmental Protection as a condition of issuing building or plumbing permits; requiring such owners and builders to provide certain proof to the municipality or political subdivision; requiring an applicant for a permit for the construction of an onsite sewage treatment and disposal system or a property owner to assume specified liabilities under certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: Except as expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law
