Services obtained must comply with all applicable federal and state security and privacy requirements and must be located in the United States. The Department of Management Services must collaborate with its customer agencies to identify any applicable federal regulations that must be addressed and federal approvals that must be received prior to transitioning to third-party services. Upon completion of a competitive solicitation, the Department of Management Services shall submit with its FY 2021-2022 legislative budget request the proposed plan to transition data center service(s). The proposed plan shall include: (1) a detailed operational work plan that includes a schedule and timeline for transitioning each service; (2) a copy of the unexecuted agreement; (3) documentation that indicates any applicable federal approval has been obtained; and (4) Schedules XII and XIIA of the legislative budget request instructions issued pursuant to section 216.023, Florida Statutes.
