

HB 7091 — OGSR/Insurance Claim Data Exchange Information/DOR

Current law requires the Department of Revenue (DOR or “the department”) to develop and operate an insurance claim data exchange system in which an insurer may voluntarily provide the department with the name, address, and, if known, date of birth and social security number or other taxpayer identification number for each noncustodial parent who has a claim with the insurer and who owes past-due child support.¹

Current law also provides that specified information regarding a noncustodial parent who owes past-due child support, collected by the department pursuant to the insurance claim data exchange system, is confidential and exempt from the public-records requirements of s. 119.07(1), F.S., and s. 24(a), art. I of the State Constitution.²

This bill extends the repeal date of the exemption from October 2, 2010, to October 2, 2012, thereby reenacting the exemption. This extension provides the department with additional time to determine the success of a similar federal program.

If approved by the Governor, these provisions take effect October 1, 2010.
