## **MODIFIED EXTENDED DAY PROVISIONS – Senate Offer #2**

The Senate accepts the House funding levels for the FEFP and the extended learning provisions. This will provide \$30 million (\$15 million in Reading and \$15 million in SAI) specifically for extended learning and impose specific requirements on certain schools. To address some House questions about the policy, the Senate offers proviso and conforming language modifications that would:

- 1. Modify the SAI extended day requirement to include the 100 lowest performing elementary schools in the state.
- 2. Clarify the priority use of \$15 million in reading funding for an extended day in the 100 lowest performing elementary schools and authorize a more flexible approach to providing extended learning to low performing students in other schools.
- 3. Authorize an "opt out" for high achieving students (level 5 scores only) in the 100 lowest performing elementary schools.
- 4. Exclude Exceptional Student Education (ESE) centers.
- 5. Further clarify that the extra hour of instruction is provided by a highly effective teacher
